**AT&T UPDATE:** We found AT&T onsite today measuring and making plans for the infrastructure replacement. They will be in touch with more details soon!

**DUKE/ASPLUNDH:** The tree overhanging the walkpath and powerlines near the playground will be removed tomorrow morning!

YORK COUNTY WATER UPADATE: York County has sent off a water sample for testing. Once the results are back, they can repeal the boil water advisory for the Cove Road area. Others with discolored water...I am told there has been a large amount of surface water that makes it way into the water center. The discoloration is normal after a heavy rain event and is not dangerous.

**FROM CAAC:** THANK YOU RIVER HILLS! 121.25 pounds donated by our residents yesterday already on the shelves to serve our community in need...



**FROM THE LIONS CLUB:** WOW...River Hills is amazing! We have witnessed the kindness, compassion and generosity of the greatest neighborhood ever....a parade of supplies being delivered all day. Thank you to everyone that has dropped off items so far. The Lions Club will also take cash/check donations and purchase needed items for you if that is easier for you.

- Pet Food (for Cats & Dogs)
- Hand Sanitizer
- Sanitizer Wipes
- Feminine Hygiene Products
- Heavy Duty Work Gloves
- Socks All Sizes (Unopened)

Operation Airlift cannot accept: used clothing, bottled water (due to weight), most household chemicals (including bleach), fuel, flammable items, and hazardous items.

**FROM MAINTENANCE:** Maintenance has been tackling the neighborhood one street at a time. If your sticks, branches and leaves have been removed, please do not put another pile out immediately. It may be 3-4 weeks before your street is serviced again. Until ALL streets have been tidied up, we will not start back over. **Today we started with Old Fox Trail, got down Heritage, Marina Road, Quayside Court, Shipmaster and started Sunrise Point**.

We have a third party working on all the large trees for us and hope to have the playground operational by this weekend...maybe tomorrow!

**LEGALLY SPEAKING:** In South Carolina, if a tree falls on you, it is your responsibility to clean up (unless you have alerted your neighbor in writing that you are concerned about that specific tree). The property line is where the responsibility changes...some trees are shared once they've fallen.

**DO YOU HAVE A TREE YOU WOULD LIKE TO REMOVE?** ALL upright trees must be reviewed, approved and logged in our tree removal log. Rick and I review trees daily...just call the office to get a work order generated. If it's a no-brainer, you'll have a permit the next day in most cases.
