- ask for help from France to fight the British
- gain support & resources

How did France help the Americans win the war? What support did they give? Why were they an important ally?

- gave America soldiers, ships, ammunition, money, supplies, guns
- Marquis de Lafayette - helped lead troops in Battle of Yorktown
- extra confidence
- better training

Why was the Battle of Saratoga a "turning point" in the war?

- American victory
- convinced France that America was worth backing in the war - became an ally
- France provided resources / becomes ally

How did Abigail Adams, Mercy Otis Warren, and Phillis Wheatley support the Revolution?

- wrote letters, poems, plays
- wrote in support of war / America's side

How did Mary Ludwig Hayes and Martha Washington help?

- both cared for soldiers
- "Molly Pitcher" - provide water
- provided support for soldiers in battle
