

Speech-Language Pathologist

Job Description

The Speech-Language Pathologist (SLP) provides comprehensive services to learners aged birth to 21 with communication needs impacting their education and social interactions. Responsibilities include completing Child Find tasks to determine eligibility for Special Education, assessing learner communication skills, developing and implementing evidence-based intervention plans addressing language, articulation, fluency, and voice disorders, and ensuring compliance with state and federal guidelines.

Education & Experience

Must meet all Iowa Department of Education and Board of Educational Examiners requirements for licensure and endorsements, including:

- A master's degree in Speech-Language Pathology from an accredited program.
- **Iowa Bureau of Educational Examiners (BoEE) B-21 Speech-Language Pathologist License: Must hold one of the following:**
 - Statement of Professional Recognition (SPR) - 237; or
 - Professional Service License - 237;
- **Iowa Department of Public Health (IDPH) License; State of Iowa Requirement:**
 - Required if you hold a Statement of Professional Recognition (SPR)
 - If you hold a Professional Service License, the BoEE does not require an IDPH license, however, Central Rivers AEA requires all SLPs to maintain a current IDPH license as an agency requirement.
- **Certificate of Clinical Competence is recommended but not required.**

- Experience as a speech-language pathologist in an educational setting is preferred but not required.
