 - -new textbooks for HSK 7-9 still haven't been released

DuChinese for reading practice

-free version is good, I pay for Pro (\$19 CAD/mth)

HSKreading.com for reading and listening practice

-listen and write down what I hear

iTalki for conversation partners (NOT language exchange partners)

- -cheap/affordable
- -length of class
- -package deals (5 or 10 classes)
- -scheduling

HelloTalk / Tandem

- -good for language fluency, not accuracy
- -need to be careful what you share
- -all skills can be practiced (speaking, listening, reading, writing)

MDBG dictionary (it's what Pleco is based on)

-great for learning how Chinese characters are deconstructed

Chinese grammar wiki (AllSet Learning)

- -Great for explanations up to HSK 4
- -Links to https://www.chinese-forums.com

Chinesepod (a lot of people recommend, I've never used)

AnkiWeb / AnkiDroid (both free, iPhone version costs \$\$\$)
