Think less “getting a burger from a fast food drive-thru” and more “personal expert chef crafting up something from scratch just for your tastes (or rather, your target audience's specific tastes).” This is also why the video animation price varies from project to project, studio to studio.

Here's a quick breakdown of where your money goes:

- Production: illustration, animation ([2D/3D](#)), voiceover recording
- Post-production: sound design, revisions, rendering, file delivery

They're more affordable while still looking pretty good for most basic use cases.

Pros:

- Affordable
- Fast turnaround

Cons:

- Cookie-cutter style
- Less customization
- Little room for revision

Great for: MVPs, internal videos, or testing ideas on a shoestring budget.

Premium 2D: Starting at \$3,000 per minute and up

Here you're working with experienced studios that offer custom design, smooth animation, professional voiceovers, and project management.

You're not just paying for animation. You're buying a team that can help you tell your brand's story creatively and strategically.

At this level, you'll see the complexity and level of detail of the animation really go up. Here, you're talking about high-quality 2D animation, more detailed artwork like [mixed media styles](#), and [full character design](#), which involve a lot more work and look amazing. Therefore, it's not surprising that this bumps up the video animation cost.

Motion Graphics: When Design Meets Data

Motion graphics fall under the 2D umbrella but lean more toward typography, iconography, and abstract design. Think [infographic videos](#), [app demos](#), or UI breakdowns.

Prices range from \$2,000 to \$5,000 per minute, depending on animation complexity and branding requirements.

The less you rely on characters, and the more on dynamic visuals and transitions to create your video, the more likely you're in motion graphics territory.

3D Animation: The Premium League

Now let's talk 3D.

[3D animation](#) is a whole different beast. The moment you add a third axis, things get exponentially more complicated — and expensive.

If you're confused about the differences between 2D and 3D, don't fret! Check out the [difference between 2d & 3d animation](#).

According to RocketBrush and other sources:

- Entry-level 3D (simplified models): starts at \$5,000 per minute and up
- Mid-tier product demos or stylized art: starts at \$10,000 per minute and up
- High-end CGI (cinematic): \$20,000–\$50,000+ per minute

Why the spike?

Because you're not just drawing anymore. You're modeling, texturing, rigging, lighting, animating, rendering, and post-producing. It's like building a small video game or Hollywood film for every project.

Also, rendering 3D scenes takes serious computing power and time. We're talking hours of processing for just a few seconds of video.

Is 2D animation cheaper than 3D?

The short answer is yes, 3d animation costs more than 2D.

3D is far more complex and work-intensive, but generally worth it for its lifelike styles, fluid animation, and flexibility. A subject once rendered in 3D can be flipped around or shown from any angle easily, but not in 2D without prior planning.

It's important to understand that both have their unique advantages and disadvantages, they often serve different purposes and niches.

Is animation more expensive than live action?

Asking “is animation cheaper than live action” is like asking whether a color printer is more practical than a black-and-white printer. It really depends on what you need. Printing out flyers? Color is obviously better. Need a printer for documents in your office? You don’t really need a color printer for that.

So it boils down to what kind of video you really need for your message and your audience.

You get a lot more flexibility and creativity with animation than with live action, and you don’t need to hire a film crew and actors and design a film set. With animation, you can depict complex and abstract ideas using graphics, metaphors, text and colors to explain things easily, because as they say, a picture is worth a thousand words. So imagine what moving pictures can do!

Why does animation cost so much?

Animation isn’t expensive because of software. It’s expensive because of the people and process behind it.

A single animated video typically involves multiple production stages:

- **Pre-production:** scripting, concept development, storyboarding, visual direction
- **Production:** illustration, character design, animation, voiceover recording
- **Post-production:** sound design, editing, revisions, rendering, delivery
