



## ***Fort Scott Community College Transfer Track to Newman University***

All Newman University baccalaureate degrees require:

- Completion of the Newman Studies Program (NSP)
- Minimum of 124 credit hours
- 40 upper division hours
- 30 resident credit hours (of the last 30 credit hours, 24 credit hours must be resident credit)
- At least 62 credit hours from a 4-year college or university
- Completion of chosen major requirements

*An **Associate of Arts** or **Associate of Science** degree from Fort Scott Community College will meet the Skills and General Education components of the Newman Studies Program, with the exception of the two Quest for Meaning courses (listed below); courses that meet this requirement will be evaluated separately.*

### **General Education**

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**Only one course from a Newman discipline may be used to satisfy NSP General Education requirements.** A course that is cross-listed counts toward both disciplines for this purpose. No more than 2 General Education courses may count toward major requirements. Courses transferred from 2-year colleges will not count for upper division credit at Newman.
