2	Administrator's Report	- Starting to get busy at Highland! Current focus is on the post-thanksgiving Food Drive to replenish our local agency. The school is being challenged to create a "Very Hungry Caterpillar" which will end up in Sean's office.	Sean Finn Principal
		-Intramurals beginning, they will be playing Fukahara (Japanese skills based volleyball game)	
		-Winter "performance" is unlikely at this time. Perhaps spring?	
		-Screen time- Sean has been walking through classes during nutrition breaks and rarely seeing screen time as an issue anymore. Most classes are back to socializing during lunch time. (Screens during eating time became a practice during Covid which continued)	
		-Technology and personal devices; Highland has the same rules as the rest of the WRDSB system. Cell phones are not to be at school. If a student brings one it must be TURNED OFF in their backpack until they get outside at the end of the day.	
		-Dress code; lots of changes from when we were all kids. As long as clothes are safe and not hateful they are allowed. Shoes in the gym are an example of needing to meet different criteria for safety. For example, Crocs are fine inside in class, but kids need a running shoe with a non marking sole for gym class.	
		-Sean spoke with the city about the recycling truck being among the kids during morning drop off time. He learned that city vehicles are exempt from the no	

stopping signage but the city understands our concern and will try to alter the schedule. Possibility of sending out communication to families to remind about how to be safe around that particular vehicle. Started a conversation around road safety at the surrounding intersections and roads. No crossing guards. Walking school bus? Looking for more solutions. Agreement was this is a city/municipal issue and not one that Sean has any control over. Possible subcommittee to be created to address this issue with the city, Teri and Paula have experience in this area. -New Business: is the current split of "Sean is responsible for Teaching and Learning, Council does the extras" working? Rumors of some classes not having enough materials. Sean has a new way for staff to request materials, encouraging teachers to reach out to him. Funding model seems to still be working. 3.-Teachers' Report Jessica Allen & Jason Gordon -Teachers have talked about how council Teacher Rep can best support them this year. Worries (shared) about job action stopping their ability to do field trips, but they could then have groups come IN to the school if tied into curriculum. -Teachers proposing that possibly board games would be a nice addition for classrooms to be used in a variety of ways? -Would the council like to support a gift for the volleyball intramurals? Consensus was no -New Business: Question about music: how is music being supported this year and how can we help? We have a class set of ukuleles but no one who knows how to teach them right now; Aimee Cripps is learning guitar right now. Is there anything

		else council can do to support her in this effort? Or any parents who might have musical knowledge and a desire to support?

		- First meeting happened! Questions came up from that meeting about a Walking School Bus and that Transportation Services offers some support with this venture.	
		 ProGrant should be put in asap, and can also be done retroactively on activities done this school year. 	
		- Cell phone policy at Highland? (See Admin Report) St Andrews and GCI are implementing school wide cell phone bans to keep personal screens out of classrooms. Highland it isn't a major issue because of the age of the students, but we have the same policy of "no phones"

		- Vote : Dufflebag Theatre or equivalent for K-2 (\$1212.49) CARRIED	
		-Vote: Movie Night, logistical concerns LOST	

		-Vote: Spring Open House with a Multicultural Theme (\$3000) CARRIED	
		-Vote: Speaker for Violence and Harassment (\$900) CARRIED (to discuss after WRAPSC meeting suggestions)	
		-Vote: Use reserved funds to cover the remaining balance for Jungle Sport (\$1900) CARRIED	
		-Vote: Festival Francais for Gr 4-6 (\$900, Sean to cover anything over this amount) CARRIED	
		-Conversation about how to support the school with donation of items. There will be a maker space opening up in the library and the school could ask families for donations of items. Parents can not be asked to donate classroom supplies (like glue sticks), it should be covered by the school and Sean has enough money generated by pizza to cover these needs.	
		-Proposal to put together a 3 year cycle of longer range plans for fundraising and school supports so we don't over or under service some areas. To take back to the Fundraising Committee	
		- There is a desire to get community together; can we find a way to do it so it focuses on community without a lot of prep work? A neighbourhood forest walk? A snowman building competition (with Council donating a prize)? A "movie meet up" to see a kid film in theatres together?	
		- This year our reserves will cover our expenses. Pattern of two years shows around 13-15k being used yearly, so we can work toward that fundraising amount through grants and fundraising. To take back to the Fundraising Committee
