Cars listed on Getaround are usually a bit cheaper than those on Turo, but many of them aren't as new or well-maintained as those on Turo.

In addition, you have to pick up your Getaround rental car from the car owner's location rather than at an airport or other convenient location.

You also have to pay for gas and any tolls you incur during your rental period. The company offers 24-hour roadside assistance and covers up to \$1 million in damages and accidents.

There is [a \\$20.00/month data subscription fee](#) for the Connect installed in the car. For a more conclusive price list, check out their website.

2. [eGo CarShare](#)

eGo CarShare is one of the best Turo alternatives for travelers. It's a peer-to-peer car rental platform that allows car owners to earn extra cash by listing their cars.

In addition, the platform enables renters to find vehicles near them, request trips, and rent a car while paying less. Furthermore, besides allowing you to rent out your vehicle, the website lists all the available electric cars that other users can rent out.

To rent out a car, all you have to do is sign up for a plan and book an available vehicle online or via their mobile app. The prices are all-inclusive, so there's no need to worry about hidden fees or paying for gas on top of the rental fee.

This platform is quite similar to Turo in many ways. For instance, you can use eGo CarShare's app to search and rent a car, as well as find cars in your area.

For instance, Hui offers unlimited liability protection, while Turo only provides up to \$1 million in coverage.

4. [Gig Car Share](#)

Like Turo, Gig Car Share is a peer-to-peer car rental service that allows you to rent vehicles by the hour or day. Unlike Turo, however, Gig Car Share only has vehicles available in California, Oregon, and part of Washington (Seattle).

The company is currently expanding to other states in the United States.

With Gig Car Share, you can reserve any vehicle from your computer or mobile device and lock and unlock your vehicle using your phone.

They also have a 24/7 customer support team that can assist with any questions or issues you might have during your trip.

Gig Car Share has a wide variety of cars to choose from, and they are extremely affordable as well.

8. [Vroom](#)

Vroom is an online marketplace for used cars similar to Turo in many ways.

You can choose from thousands of cars, including luxury models with amenities such as leather seats, sunroofs, and premium sound systems.
