Using Dynamic Online Sampling to attain a representative sample, Change Research polled 640 likely 2026 voters in Wisconsin's 6th Congressional District. Post-stratification was performed on age, gender, race/ethnicity, education, region, and 2024 presidential vote. Next, you will read some information about the candidates for US House of Representatives.

Glenn Grothman is the incumbent six-term Republican congressman, a former state senator and state assemblyman who has served in elected office since 1993, and a lawyer who earned his business degree and law degree from the University of Wisconsin–Madison. Supporters say Grothman is a proven fiscal conservative with over 30 years of seniority who has delivered for the district on border security, tax cuts for working families, and eliminating wasteful government spending. Critics say Grothman looked constituents in the eye at a town hall and promised he would not cut Medicaid, then turned around and voted for a Republican budget bill that slashes Medicaid and SNAP benefits for working families while delivering tax breaks to billionaires and taking over \$1 million in corporate PAC money.

Mike Thurow is an independent, a union fire captain, a father of four, a Mequon native, and is endorsed by Dan Osborn's Working Class Heroes Fund. Supporters say Thurow is a working-class first responder — not a career politician — who will protect Social Security and Medicaid, enact term limits, ban congressional stock trading, and stand with family farmers and local manufacturers against Wall Street and Washington. Critics say Thurow has never held elected office, is really a Democrat running under the independent label to avoid the party's toxic brand in a heavily Republican district, and supports a wishlist of big-government spending proposals with no plan to pay for them.
