4. Updates from Ten Towns, Ten Actions Leaders & Attendees

Ann - Chester: Co-farming in Bedford with Kayla, focused on lead poisoning mitigation; Merrimack River clean up Nashua - Manchester (Rocky); wrote article for NH Bulletin, close to securing \$125,000 for the clean up efforts - HS Students, volunteer groups, businesses involved; plastic bags showing up in collections; attended Board of Alderman meeting to advocate for PFAS reduction at the water treatment plant

Susan - Durham: Unclear about a bill submission on plastic bag ban; unsure about R sponsor; Peggy & Susan spoke with the Hannaford Sustainability Coordinator (Samantha Pease); has experience with ending SUP at another store, and offered to connect us with others; bans going well in VT & ME; 1,400 signatures online, close to 5,000 total; talks scheduled in NH; maybe propose a PFAS bill instead? Joined BJs and they are promoting 'less toxicity with glass containers'

Cindy - Cornish: Plastic Free July event successful; Mesh Bag Mamas moving along, Lebanon co-op has eliminated SUP in bulk section

Patsy - Nelson: Harrisville foam collection on August 15; Mary has a great coalition to help her, including with transportation

Carol - Center Harbor: Library collaboration on Plastic Free July, and has expanded to offer a Button Up workshop (September); planning to gather a group of people to spread out the work; working with the schools in the Lakes Region area; exploring plastic free legislation to communicate with reps/senators

Jack - Claremont: working with Bag Ban group; petition up on FB & website of NH Wildlife Coalition and other groups; on Claremont CC & NH Assoc. CC

Kayla - Surfrider - Bedford: Researching for plastic bag ban group, beach clean ups, passionate about plastic pollution; env. science student online at SNHU; working at UNH in eco-hydrology dept.; TED Talk

<u>Fossil Fuel Investments</u> Webinar

- o 99% of Americans are forced to invest in fossil fuels in their retirement plans.
- o Almost 20% of investments in fossil fuels come from retirement savings.
- If you took 12 companies including Adobe, Amazon, Apple, Google, Intuit, Meta, Microsoft, Netflix, Oracle, etc: the employees have lost \$5.1 billion due to their companies investing in fossil fuels.
- If you took \$10,000 and invested in fossil fuels 10 years ago, guess how much money you'd have today? \$10,004.
- If you took the \$10,000 and invested in the S&P 500 minus the fossil fuels, you'd have \$34,851!
- Google has invested \$1.7 billion in fossil fuels through their retirement savings. If they hadn't done that it would be like taking 700,000 cars off the road.
- An explanation of why fossil fuel companies are desperate to turn to plastics.


