Principal's State of the School: Jessica Swain discussed FAST PM 2 Data and updated the SAC on this year's School Improvement Plan Goals.

- 87 students who are served through the Exceptional Student Education Program
- SLD program, ASD, speech and Language. Out of those students, 17 are served in our ASD
- Long term sub in K-2 ASD unit, advertising position but current person is slated to stay through the end of the school year
- 62 students who qualify for gifted services, that's 11 %
- 54 English language learners, 35 are current and 19 on monitoring
- School Improvement Plan goals
 1. We are on track to once again meeting our goals. Our first goal has to do with collaborative planning and standard, aligned instruction. We have one mandatory meeting a week, our teams get together grade level teams, and they plan instruction. They share resources, they talk about students and how they can better support them. So through that initiative, we expect to achieve 83 % proficiency in ELA, that's 3 % higher than the previous year, 87 % proficiency in math and 86 % proficiency in science.
 2. Our next initiative has to do with the walk to intervention model and our math intervention model with reading. It's a walk to intervention model for math. They received their intervention in the classroom. So last year, we implemented the walk to reading intervention model. We didn't have a math intervention model. What we did was just more.
 3. 71 % for ELA, 78 % for math, our bottom partial students, these are our students that receive educational support during the school day. We would like 64 % of them to make a learning gain in ELA. That's 3 % higher than last year's achievement.
 4. Our next goal has to do with attendance. Last year, we met our attendance goal by reducing the number of students that were absent. But when we looked at the data over the summer, it just wasn't enough. We wanted to continue.
 5. PM two, in comparison to PM One, which is that first column, lots of growth of double digit growth in every single area
