Grades K-2 performed an engineering STEM lab making a paper cup out of one sheet of paper which then had to hold $\frac{1}{2}$ cup water. The record time was 1 minute 10 seconds.

Grades 3 / 4 completed an engineering lab related to The Three Little Pigs, ask them about it.

Grades 5 / 6 and 7 / 8 were able to observe the workings of a STREAM table: In this activity, students investigated river formations in different landscape scenarios. Students were able to compare and contrast how the formation of the river differs if the topography of the land is changed from an agricultural plain to a terrain with rocky hills and valleys. We also discussed human impacts to riparian systems.

This week we read Cymbeline, which was Shakespeare's last play written in 1609. This is a story that could be compared and contrasted with King Lear in how King Lear ends in tragedy and Cymbeline ends well once everyone figures out who has been doing what. You may also want to research and look for the connections between Cymbeline and Snow White, which each class noticed while we listened to the story in class. My hope in sharing the entire story once in class allows the students an initial exposure that will help them identify the characters and plot when you then read it at home so your discussions can focus more on the depth of topics instead of who's who and what's happening. I am needing to read the story multiple times with my kiddos to reach a deeper level of discussion as we look for the conversation Shakespeare is having and what theme he is trying to share with his audience.
