Warden's Notes

The Trinity Vestry and the Search for a Priest Interview Committee met on Monday, evening September 23rd to take a mental inventory of what Trinity Episcopal Church means to us as parishioners and what the church means to the greater Marshall Community. Fr. David led us in this exercise as we re-evaluated our mission and purpose for existing and worshipping. Below are the questions posed to us and responses received. Do any of the following comments resonate with you? If so please share your thoughts with a member of the Vestry: Karla Love, Cherie Riser, Wendy Myers, Anne Bohl, Julie Kaminski, and Patty West. Our Interview committee is Ivan Egnatuk, Randy Riser, and Wendy Myers. Our next session on mission work is Monday, October 21st.

I. Call to order at 7:10pm and opening prayer: Karla

II. Present: Karla, Patti, Wendy, Julie, Cherie, Anne Absent: None

III. Review of previous month's minutes: (vote to accept and publish) Cherie made a motion to approve the minutes as written, seconded by Patti. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. Consent Agenda (accepting these ministry reports): Wendy made a motion to approve the minutes as written, seconded by Patti. Motion passed unanimously.

Fellowship - Family night food is funded by the Dora Perrett fund. We should receive a check for \$400.

Board of Missions - Next Share Center Dinner is August 30. Plans are underway for Mrs Claus's Purse Saturday, November 9th.

Worship Committee - Met on Sun, August 11. Discussed opportunities for rearranging the chancel for safety, convenience, and visibility reasons.

Pastoral Care - Fr. David is visiting Comfort Care one a month to bring communion and healing prayer.

Christian Ed - Fr. David will continue to provide a short children's sermon before the prelude.

Trinity Historian -

Adult Bible Study - We are halfway through the book "The Greatest Invitation" by Rev. David Ottsen.

Staff - Paula plans to return the third week in August and work about 8 hrs. a week from home.

V. Buildings and Grounds - Met on August 8. See the minutes of the meeting.

VI. Financial Report: - Financial statements

- Review July Financial Reports
- Voted last month to raise the cap on invoices over \$1000 will require Vestry approval. Formerly it was \$500. Need to find it in the Green Book to update.
- Vote to approve the Annual Internal Audit to be submitted by Sept 1 to the Diocese.
 - Karla made a motion to accept the audit, seconded by Anne, motion passed unanimously.
 - Need to recruit one or two new members for this audit committee next year.

VII. Old Business:

- Our prayers...do we have answers?
 1. *We pray for the wisdom and guidance to call a priest-in-charge to shepherd Trinity and St. James parishes.*
 2. *We pray for all families/individuals who are seeking the word of God to find Trinity's doors open and welcoming.*
 3. *We pray that all Trinitarians find a fulfilling church ministry to serve God and our extended community.*
 4. *We pray that we will be able to reach out to parishioners who are isolated, lonely, sick, or who need spiritual support where they live.*
- Whittemore Foundation Digital Community Grant submitted and application deadline was extended.
- Summerfest at Brace Lake was a beautiful event. Wendy contracted with Party Time, Inc. for tables, chairs, and a tent. Have four directional signs from last year, but need to order two more. We provided lemonade, iced tea, bottled water and fried chicken. Wendy suggested we create a file for Summerfest 2024.
- Each of the vestry members will attend one of the workshops online:
 - Creation Care 101 - Karla - attended on June 12 and found it very spiritual but not informative.
 - Transitions Overview - Cherie noted some opportunities for our search.
 - Finance 101 - Patty
 - Vestry 101 - Wendy
 - Planning your Formation Yr - Julie attended - lots of free resources
 - Building Blocks of Church Communication - Anne attended and forwarded the slides to Karla. Will process the information and notes taken to others in the parish.
- Fr. Ottsen's suggestions for Trinity for discussion:

Contacted Oaklawn to see if we could do a Healing Service in their Chapel. The Hospital Administration gave us this response: *"After discussion with our senior leadership team, although we greatly appreciate the gesture and see the goodwill behind it, to be inclusive of all religions and denominations that our staff and patients may practice, we*

must reserve the chapel for personal use only. Again, we truly appreciate your offer and kindness."

Opted to not provide a 7:30 am service on Home Tour Sunday for volunteers, but do put an ad in the paper inviting folks to Trinity for our 9:30 Service.

Fr. David will provide a blessing for the New School Year, for all students, staff, and teachers on Sunday, August 18 during the service.

Fr. David would like to meet with the Vestry on Mondays, Sept 23 and Oct 21 to have us discuss our mission and vision. We should invite the Search for a Priest Interview Committee and some of our ministry leaders. Timing: 5 pm dinner, 5:15 Mission discussion, and 7 pm Vestry meeting. Deborah Otsen would help with the process - payment to her?

Fr. David would like to do a Healing Conference at Trinity in 2025 and he would like to train a Healing Team for our parishioners.

Fr. David will be here for Sun, Dec 22 staying till Wednesday, Dec 25. See celebrant dates as provided by Deacon Wendy.

The goodwill offering taken at Summerfest will continue through August and be given to the Albion Community Garden.

Plans for a "Visitor Sunday" on October 27, 2024. How to promote? What activities?

 - Gift bags in book holders in pews
 - Costumes
 - Ciders and donuts

 - Ask Tasha to see if she can help lead
- Tabling these ideas for the next meeting: Facebook Protocol, Website/Communication, record Brooks Grantier giving a historical church tour, Get a quote from Bluefish

VIII. New Business:

- Dates for 2025 for the Ottsens:
 - Arriving Saturday, January 11 and leaving Tuesday, January 21 (10 days with 2 Sunday Services)
 - Arriving Saturday, February 8 and leaving Tuesday, February 18 (10 days with 2 Sunday Services)
 - Arriving Saturday, March 1 and leaving Sunday, March 9 (8 days with 2 Sunday Services)
 - No dates in April - due to trip to China
 - Arriving Saturday, May 10 and leaving Sunday, May 18 (8 days and 2 Sunday Services)

This takes us up to June 1, when Fr. David began serving on a Letter of Agreement with Trinity.

This is subject to change if needed.

- Discussion on creating two additional inlet pews, removing all but a few dividers - provide a brief paragraph for the newsletter, followed by an announcement to the congregation at a later date shortly before the changes are to take place.
 - Provides more space for weddings, funerals, DAVE
 - (Does this solve any problems?)
 - Benefit - brings the congregation closer together, rather than being so far back away from the altar.

BEAUTIFUL! Any assistance would be great.

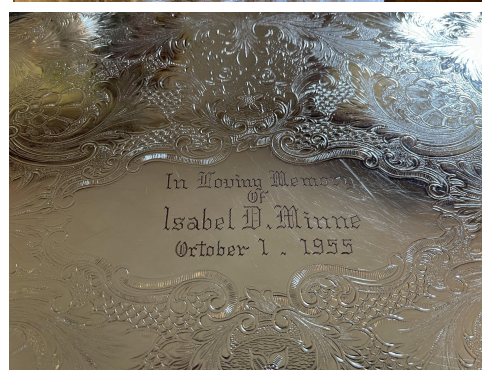
Edit: a few comments came in since published on FB:

John Twist: Isabel Minne was Craig Brooks' wife, my
aunt. Craig (Bud) was head of the vestry for years.
But, her maiden name was Helen Isabel Minne, no
middle name "D". There is a building on the north side
of main street with that family name – Isabel's father, I
believe.

Jim Needham: I remember Mrs Brooks, wife of Craig
Bud Brooks. The tea set was used often. I remember
the Udell sisters being in charge. It was also used by
Abby Albright to teach the 8th grade girls about high
tea.

Mary Lincoln: So so beautiful! What to do with
them.....is there a tarnish proof way to display them?
I think monetary value is that gained by melting them
down and that both sounds awful and probably yields
little anyway. Isabel Brooks was a dear friend of our
family. Potential for "the story behind the silver"? I
don't think as kids we knew anything about the gift.

Am guessing she died after 1967, year I graduated
from college as last of the three of us to become only
visitors to Trinity
