Angola – Although it is extremely rich in diamonds and oil, Angola remains one of the world's poorest countries, ranked at 160 out of 177 on the <u>United Nation's Human Development Index</u>. Angolan citizens live on less than \$2 per day while at least 45 percent of children are severely <u>malnourished</u>. The government's record on <u>corruption</u> and <u>transparency</u> is horrible. According to IMF reports, between 1997 and 2001, \$8.45 billion of public money was unaccounted for (an average of 23% of GDP), and the Angolan government still has no transparent system for managing oil and diamond <u>revenues</u>. The Angolan government has cracked down on the informal mining sector by forcibly getting rid of diamond miners. This has led to widespread human rights abuses by formal and informal security forces.
