

APRIL 2024 NEWSLETTER

Our next meeting is on Saturday 4th May at St Mary's Hinckley LE10 1DW.

Our next meeting will be on Saturday May 4th at St Mary's Church Hinckley, by kind invitation of Peter Harris. This is very much a hands-on event. The Church will be open from 1.30pm for about an hour if you want to have a play on the 3 manual pipe organ rebuilt by Rodger Fifield in 2003.

At 2.30pm, Peter will give a brief explanation of how Hauptwerk works, and then you are welcome to give it a try! Peter has a 4 manual and pedal setup with the Hereford Cathedral sound set.

The church has a car park for about 20 cars, so parking shouldn't be a problem, and the address is:

St Mary's Church Church Walk Hinckley LE10 1DW

To gain access to the church, enter via the double gates and cross the car park, keeping the church on your right. Pass the double north doors and you will see a light brown single door into the Coffee Bar. light refreshments will be available.

On Wednesday 1st May 2024 at 1.00pm, Peter Harris will be giving his annual organ recital at St Mary's Church, using the Hauptwerk set up as above.

Looking ahead:-...

On June 1st, we have an invitation from Mike Spencer and Keith Chambers to visit Newbold and Ryton. More details will be sent out soon, but mark the date in your diary. We'll meet at Newbold at 10.30, lunch has been arranged at Ryton (I will need numbers) and then we can see and play the newly restored organ.

There is a date for Alveston now – **July 20th**, probably in the afternoon. Richard DS will run a workshop on 'Trios' – repertoire, registering, etc. You'll also be able to play the rebuilt Nicholson. Please keep the date.

GIFT AID

You may recall that in my last newsletter I sent out a request for a new Gift Aid Certificate. Ian is anxious to have a good basis for claims to HMRC, and our old paperwork is largely photocopies, rather than original documents. I've attached to this email the form he needs. Please date it January 1st 2024 so that he can include your 2024 subscription in his next claim. Either

- · Complete electronically and send back to Ian over the airwaves (easy, if you know how!)
- OR: print the attachment off, fill it out and post back to Ian
- · OR: call me or Ian and ask us to provide you with a form

Remember, provided you are paying UK tax, you can 'gift aid' to many organisations at **NO COST TO YOU**, and we can get a supplementary payment from the Government. If you'd like further explanation and reassurance, do give either of us a call.
