- 1. **colonization:** to establish a settlement (or settlements) away from one's home country.
- 2. **conquest**: to invade and take control of a place or people by using military force.
- 3. **conquistador**: a Spanish conqueror of America beginning in the 16th century.
- 4. **encomienda:** right the Spanish government granted to its colonists to demand labor or payment from the Native Americans.
- exploitation:to use, especially for profit; to use selfishly for one's own ends
- 6. **viceroy**:a person appointed by the Spanish monarchy to govern conquered New World Territory
- 7. **mercantilism**: practice of creating and maintaining wealth by carefully controlling trade, as in countries using colonies for financial resources
- 8. **joint-stock company**: a company funded by a group of investors to fund overseas expeditions
- 9. **chattel slavery**: a system where people (in this case Africans) were treated as actual property who could be bought, sold, traded or inherited
- 10. **Triangular Trade**: A pattern of colonial trade in which goods from Europe, slaves from West Africa and raw goods from the New World were exchanged.
- 11. **Middle Passage**: middle leg of the triangular trade route that brought Africans to the Americas to serve as slaves.
- 12. cash crops: an agricultural product that is grown and sold for profit
