SCENE ONE: The setting is a tavern in seventeenth Century England. All that is really

necessary is a wooden table and four chairs (it's a very small tavern!). Jim Hawkins, a boy of 12, and his father James, are serving the patrons, as Captain Billy Bones holds court. Bones shows the effects of too many rums and too

many years at sea.

SONG #1: TELL US ANOTHER STORY

PATRONS

TELL US ANOTHER STORY, CAPTAIN BILLY BONES.

TELL US ANOTHER STORY OF YOUR GREAT ADVENTURES.

TELL US ABOUT THE LOCKER NAMED FOR DAVEY JONES,

AND THE MEN YOU'VE SAILED WITH TO VERY CORNER OF THE WORLD.

BILLY

AYE, I'LL TELL YE NOW
'BOUT THE FASCINATIN' FACES THAT I HAVE LEFT BEHIND.
SOME ARE LIVIN', SOME ARE DEAD.
THEM THAT DIED NEVER DIED IN BAD,
BUT THEY'RE ALL LIVIN' IN MY MIND.

FIRST PATRON

Billy, ye've been stayin' here so long, do ye remember what a ship looks like?

BILLY

With strength denying his obvious age.

Hold yer tongue or lose it, son. You see an old man and laugh. But my arms are still strong, and my knife is still sharp. Forty years of sailin' will do that. Take heed.

JAMES

Gently.

He meant no harm, Capt'n Billy. Give us your tale.

BILLY

As ye wish, James Hawkins. I am yer grateful guest, after all. Though soon, I'll be leavin'.

SECOND PATRON

Ye've been sayin' that fer weeks, Billy. Ye know it wouldn't be the same here without ya.

THIRD PATRON

Beginning the chant, encouraging the children in the audience to join in.

Billy Bones, Billy Bones.

ALL

Billy Bones, Billy Bones ...

Etcetera, until he surrenders.

BILLY

Alright.

He stops them and waits for quiet.

I'll tell ya 'bout Old Flint. I was his first mate, and I've never sailed with a tougher one than that. How tough? Spaniards withered at the mere mention of his name. But he was getting' on. And he knew he couldn't take all the gold he'd ... "earned", shall we say? ... with 'im. So he decided to bury it. If he couldn't have it, no one could. We came upon an island. It seemed to rise up out of the ocean like a ghostly beauty. Old Flint loaded the gold ...

FIRST PATRON

How much was there?

BILLY

A King's Ransom! 700,000 pounds.

Men react vocally (not in harmony!)

We dropped anchor, and he took it ashore with three men. Four hours later, Old Flint returned ... alone.

Vocal reaction.

JIM

What happened to the men?

JAMES	
Scolding.	
Jim!	
BILLY	
We never found out. The anchor was drawn in, the sails were raised, and we were gone. From that day on, we always referred to it as Treasure island.	
JIM	
Did you ever go back?	
BILLY	
How could we? Old Flint charted the course. You could sail those seas forever and never chance upon it without proper directions.	
SECOND PATRON	
What about Flint? Did he ever go back?	
BILLY	
Old Flint was killed less than a month later. By Long John Silver.	
JIM	
By who?	
BILLY	
Long John Silver. The man who haunts my dreams. The man who Old Flint cursed with his dying breath. Silver'd heard about the gold Old Flint left on Treasure Island, and he wanted the map.	
JIM	
There's a map?	
BILLY	
Aye. But Flint died before he'd say where 'twas.	

JAMES

And what of Long John Silver?

BILLY

I've never seen charm and anger like that in one man. He uses the charm to draw you in, then unleashes the anger, and whit!

He sweeps his arm like a sword

It's over.

SONG #1a:

TELL US ... (reprise).

BEWARE OF THE MAN WITH A GROWL IN HIS VOICE,

AND THE GLINT IN HIS EYE AND THE EVER SO BOISTEROUS LAUGH.

HE'LL CUT YOU IN HALF, AND LEAVE YOU TO ROT,

AND NOT GIVE IT A THOUGHT.

BEWARE OF THE MAN SIMPLY OOZING WITH CHARM,

ALL TOO EAGER TO PLEASE, ALL TOO ABLE TO HARM

WHO HE MUST

WITH ONE PRACTICED THRUST,

WHEN YOU LEAST EXPECT,

HE'LL CARVE AND DISSECT

ANYONE YOUNG OR OLD OVER ONE PIECE OF GOLD.

THAT'S LONG JOHN SILVER.

HE'S MADE PROUD MEN CRY AND BEG.

LONG JOHN SILVER.

A MONSTER OF A MAN WITH A WOODEN LEG.

Music continues.

THIRD PATRON

Old Flint was killed by a one-legged man? He must have been getting' on.

They all laugh. Billy rises to go.

BILLY

Laugh if ye will, but remember my words. If you come face to face with this man, whatever you do, don't do anything to make him lose his temper. You'll pay for it with your life. And now, I'm off t' bed.

He starts to stagger off. FIRST PATRON Captain Billy, come back! SECOND PATRON Tell us some more. THIRD PATRON. Billy Bones, Billy Bones. ALL Joining in. Billy Bones, Billy Bones. Billy exits. Men sing as they settle their accounts with Hames and leave. TELL US ANOTHER STORY, CAPTAIN BILLY BONES. TELL US ANOTHER STORY OF YOUR GREAT ADVENTURES. TELL US ABOUT THE LOCKER NAMED FOR DAVEY JONES, AND THE MEN YOU'VE SAILED WITH TO EVERY CORNER OF THE WORLD. WE WANNA HEAR MORE OF EVERY VOYAGE AND EVERY FIGHT. WE WANNA HEAR MORE. WE'LL BE BACK TOMORROW NIGHT. They exit. Jim and his Father clear the tables. JIM

Father? Have you ever heard tell of this Treasure Island?

JAMES

I see our Captain Billy Bones has touched your imagination.

JIM

It must be on the other side of the world.

JAMES

Perhaps not quite that far away!

JIM

You're right. That would be China! But it has to be at least across the ocean.

JAMES

I suspect, and a big and dangerous ocean it is!

JIM

That's not what you told me before.

JAMES

Indeed?

JIM

You told me all sorts of stories about ... before you met mother.

JAMES

I did, did I? Don't believe everything you hear, son – not eve from your own father.

JIM

Oh, but father – I want to believe.

SONG #2: I WANT TO BELIEVE

I WANT TO BELIEVE IN FAR OFF PLACES I HAVE NEVER BEEN, SECRET CAVES OR OPEN SPACES WITH DANGERS UNFORESEEN. I WANT TO BELIEVE IN BRAVE AND DARING

HEROES WHO RISK THEIR LIVES TO FIND THE HOLY GRAIL.

I WANT TO BELIEVE IN MASSIVE MOUNTAINS STRETCHING THROUGH THE MIST, FORESTS FULL OF MAGIC FOUNTAINS THE MERMAIDS MIGHT HAVE KISSED.

I WANT TO BELIEVE IN STRANGE EXOTIC STORIES,

WHERE ONLY THOSE WITH JOIE DE'VIVRE PREVAIL.

JAMES

Now you're speaking French? Very worldly.

JIM

THERE'S A FABULOUS WORLD OUT THERE, AND I INTEND TO KNOW IT.
THERE'S ADVENTURE ENOUGH TO SPARE FOR A PIRATE OR A POET.
I'LL FLY LIKE A FALCON, I'LL SHRIEK AT THE SUN,
I'LL DIVE IN THE OCEAN WITH SKILL AND STRENGTH BEYOND COMPARISON.

I WANT TO BELIEVE IN BURIED TREASURE, PIRATE KINGS INTERRED,
DESPERATE DREAMS AND DESPERATE MEASURES, DIVINE OR JUST ABSURD.
I WANT TO BELIEVE IN WIZARDS AND IN CHARMS.
I WANT TO HEAR TRUMPETS CALLING MEN TO ARMS.

THERE'S A FABULOUS WORLD OUT THERE, AND I INTEND TO KNOW IT. THERE'S ADVENTURE ENOUGH TO SPARE FOR A PIRATE OR A POET. I'LL DREAM WITH THE DREAMERS, I'LL BE NUMBER ONE, AND JUST LIKE MY FATHER, I'LL LIVE A LIFE BEYOND COMPARISON!

JAMES

You do have an imagination, my boy. Your father's life wasn't quite that exceptional, I fear.

JIM

I choose to disagree.

JAMES

Come on. Choose some dishes, and finish clearing up here while I go outside to douse the lanterns. Billy Bones has once again kept us all up way past our bedtimes with his stories. Remember, I have a long ride ahead of me tomorrow.

JIM

Because of the letter from Aunt Patricia?

JAMES

She needs me.

JIM

When will you be back?

JAMES

It all depends. Hopefully only a day or two, until things settle down a bit. The letter sounded a bit desperate. Uncle Ed will be over to run things here, so you pay him heed.

JIM

Yes, sir.

James exits. Jim continues cleaning up. Noise offstage.

Father? Captain Billy? Who's there?

Pew enters, tapping his cane.

PEW

Will someone tell a blind man where, or in what part of the country he is?

JIM

You are at the Admiral Benbow Inn in Blackhill cave, sir.

PEW

Will you give me your hand, my kind young friend, and show me to a table.

Jim obliges.

JIM

I'm terribly sorry, sir. We just closed for the night. But I can certainly ...

Pew grabs him, roughly.

Hey! What are you doing? Stop that. Let me go! Let me go!

PEW

Stop struggling, you brat. It's not you I'm after. I want Billy Bones.

JIM

Just look around. You can see he's not here.

PEW

I have eyes that see only black and grey. No images.

JIM

You're blind?

PEW

I want Billy Bones.

JIM

He's not here. He's gone. He left a while ago.

PEW

I've been outside. Only four men left. None of them were Billy Bones.

JIM

But you said you were blind. How do you know.

PEW

Placing Jim in a chair, and not letting go.

I know.

SONG #3: WE WERE MATES

WE WERE MATES LONG AGO,
AND WHEN YOU HAVE BEEN MATES
I ASSURE YOU, YOU KNOW EACH OTHER.
THOUGH I MAY BE BLIND, I KNOW BILLY BONES
BY THE WAY THAT HE WALKS,
AND THE SMELL OF HIS BREATH,
AND THE SOUND OF HIS LAUGH.

WE WERE MATES AT A TIME WHEN IT SEEMED THERE WOULD ALWAYS BE TOMORROW TO MAKE UP FOR TODAY.
WE WERE MATES AT A TIME WHEN WE KNEW THERE WOULD NEVER BE A FIGHT FROM WHICH WE WOULDN'T SAIL AWAY.

WE WERE MATES ON A SHIP OTHER KNEW AND FEARED, A SHIP OTHERS RAN FROM, THE MOMENT WE APPEARED.

WE WERE MATES AT A TIME WHEN WE FELT THERE WAS NOTHING THAT COULD STOP US. WE CONQUERED WHAT WE SAW. WE WERE MATES AT A TIME WHEN ACROSS ALL THE SEVEN SEAS, WE CALLED THE SHOTS, WE MADE THE LAW.

WE WERE MATES ON A SHIP WITH A PIRATE FLAG. Aye! A SHIP FULL OF PLUNDER, AND SO WE LEARNED TO BRAG.

"DON'T YOU MESS WITH US OUR DAGGERS ARE SHARP AND OUR SWORDS ARE LONG,
BETTER GIVE US ROOM,
WE'RE AS MEAN AS THE DEVIL AND BY GOD WE'RE STRONG.

WHEN YOU FEEL THAT WAY, IT'S HARD TO LOSE, AND WE LOST ONE DAY.

WE WERE MATES AT A TIME WHEN THE SHIPS OF THE KING ALL GOT TOGETHER AND FINALLY TRACKED US DOWN.
IN A COVE WHERE WE MOORED FOR AN EVENING,
THEY SET UPON THE SHIP WITH A LOT OF CREW IN TOWN.
THOUGH THE BATTLE WAS FIERCE, WE WERE OVERCOME.
THE FEW THAT ESCAPED,
ESCAPED WITH THE FEAR THAT MAKES YOU NUMB.

AND ONE OF THEM THE CAPTIN, DIED SOON AFTER IN A FIGHT WITH A MAN WITH A WOODEN LEG. BUT BEFORE HE DIED, HE GAVE HIS FIRST MATE A MAP SHOWING WHERE HE HAD BURIED THE CRATE THAT HELD THE TREASURE FROM TEN YEARS' PLUNDER SOMEWHERE. IT'S JUST A FEW FEET UNDER, AND ONLY ONE MAN KNOWS WHERE - THAT FIRST MATE WHO DIDN'T WANT TO SHARE!

WE WERE MATES, BILLY BONES AND I,
AND I GUESS, NOW YOU KNOW THE REASON WHY
I'VE COME TO PAY A VISIT, AND HIS HAND I WANT TO CLUTCH,
CUZ OLD MATES SHOULD REALLY STAY IN TOUCH!

JIM	
You mean Billy Bones has the map?!	
PEW	
Why don't you ask him, boy?	
JIM	
I will for sure, when he comes back.	
PEW	
You lie with confidence! I like that. Alright, we'll play your little game. When Billy Bones returns from his mysterious journey, I want you to give him a message.	
JIM	
Yes, sir. I will, sir.	
PEW	
Tell him he has six hours.	
JIM	
Six hours?	
PEW	
In six hours, I will return. And I will not return alone.	
JIM	
That's all?	
PEW	
Tell him the message is from Pew. P – E – W. He'll know why I've come. He'll know what I want. And he'll know the consequences if I don't get it. Six hours! Tell him.	

Pew emits a low, dry, cackle, then turns to shuffle offstage., painfully slowly, singing.

DON'T YOU MESS WITH US.
OUR DAGGERS ARE SHARP, AND OUR SWORDS ARE LONG.

BETTER GIVE US ROOM. WE'RE MEAN AS THE DEVIL AND BY GOD, WE'RE STRONG. WE WERE MATES, BILLY BONES AND I ...

Pew disappears. Jim locks the door. He calls up the stairs.

JIM Capt'n Billy. He brings the light up slightly, and calls more urgently. Capt'n Billy, wake up! Billy emerges, barely awake, definitely not sober. **BILLY** What is it boy? What do you want? JIM You're in great danger. **BILLY** What are you talking about? Speak up. JIM A man was just here. He gave ma a message for you. **BILLY** What was this man's name. JIM Pew. **BILLY** As if struck by lightning. Pew??!! Here?

JIM

He said you have six hours, and then he will return, and he won't return alone. He said you'll know what he's after.

BILLY

The door. Did you check outside the door?

JIM

Sir?

BILLY

Is there a mark on the door to the Inn? Quickly. Go look.

He sits down in shock.

Pew! My God! They've found me.

He gets up and starts pacing. Jim returns. He sits again, to prepare himself.

Well, boy?

JIM

I don't understand, sir. There's a round black circle on the door. What does it mean?

BILLY

Full of fear.

It means I have no place left to hide.

SONG #4: THE BLACK SPOT

THE BLACK SPOT, UP UPON THE DOOR,
THE BLACK SPOT SERVES AS A SUMMONS.
I KNOW THEY'RE COMING FOR ME, NOWHERE TO RUN.
I KNOW THEY'RE COMING FOR ME, CUZ THEY'VE LEFT
THE BLACK SPOT. WHEN DID IT APPEAR?
THE BLACK SPOT. WHO PUT IT UP THERE?
I KNOW MY DAYS ARE NUMBERED. WHERE CAN I TURN
WHERE THEY WILL NOT BE WAITING?

WAITING FOR THE KILL, BUT NOT UNTIL

THEY'VE FOUND WHAT THEY'RE LOOKING FOR.
THEY'LL HAVE TO LET ME LIVE
IF I FALL INTO THEIR TRAP,
SO I MUST HIDE IT UNDER THE GROUND,
UNDER THE FLOOR.
FOR ONCE THEY FIND THE MAP ...

Laboured breathing.

I'M GOOD AS DEAD.

He clutches his chest, finding it hard to breathe.

I MUST HIDE IT.

He slumps to the floor.

DON'T TELL THEM.

Barely audible.

JIM.

JIM

Capt'n Billy.

Billy dies.

Billy Bones? Can you hear me? Can you speak? Can you breathe?

Mom returns

MOM

Jim? Jim, are you alright? I thought I heard ...

JIM

Mom! It's Billy Bones.

MOM

Rushing to Billy, kneeling down, and lifting his head.

What happened?

JIM

In a torrent.

An old blind man came by looking for Billy, saying he was a friend of his. The man gave me a note to give to Billy, and told me to tell him back with other men in six hours. When I gave the note to Billy, he asked me to check the outside of our door. There's a black circle there. When I told him, he got more and more upset, until he finally dropped to the floor.

MOM

After a moment.

Jim. Billy is dead. I may be a simple country woman, but I'm pretty sure it won't be Billy's friends that are coming back. We can't stay here. It's too dangerous. We must leave.

She gets up. She has a moment of pragmatism.

Billy owes us three months room and board. Before we leave, I'll check that old sea chest he keeps under his bed. You search him and see if you can find a key.

She goes upstairs.

JIM

Searching Billy's pockets. He finds the key.

PLEASE FORGIVE ME SIR, BUT IT WOULD APPEAR
THIS WILL DO YOU NO GOOD ANYMORE.
DOES IT OPEN UP THAT BOX YOU'VE NEVER LET ME SEE?

Mom returns, dragging Billy Bones' sea chest.

MOM

Jim, hurry. Open it up.

JIM

YES, IT SEEMS TO FIT. YES, IT OPENS IT.

He looks inside.

Gold! And a map! A map.

He looks up at his Mom.

Capt'n Billy said, "Once they find the map, I'm as good as dead." This must be ... the map to Treasure Island.

They are momentarily frozen. Mom looks at the money it her hand.

MOM

Come on, son. We dare not stay another minute longer. If we can find a way to make it to Doctor Livesey's house, we might be safe there.

JIM

Of course. He'll know what to do with this map.

He looks at Billy, while his Mom throws some things in a bag.

Don't worry Billy. They'll never catch us. We know every hiding place along the way. And Billy, I will go back to your Treasure Island. Somehow, I will. I promise.

I'LL FIND IT. YOU'VE GIVEN ME THE WAY.
I'LL FIND IT, HOWEVER FAR I HAVE TO TRAVEL.
I KNOW IT'S WAITING FOR ME, ACROSS THE SEA.
I KNOW IT'S WAITING FOR ME –
MY TREASURE ISLAND, MY ADVENTURE.

Jim and his Mom hurry to the door, check outside, and disappear into the night. Blackout. End of scene.

SCENE TWO: A vignette, in an office setting. The lights rise on Captain Smollett at a

desk. There is a knock on the door.

CAPTAIN

Enter.

Jim enters with Dr. Livesey.

DOCTOR

Captain Smollett, this is the young man I wanted you to meet – Jim Hawlins.

Jim and Smollett shake hands.

JIM

Sir.

HAWKINS

Hawkins. I understand you have quite a story to tell.

DOCTOR

I know Jim well. I brought him into this world. He'd be telling the truth.

CAPTAIN

Have you brought the map?

Jim looks at the Doctor, who nods. Jim gives the map to Smollett.

JIM

Captain Billy Bones ...

A slight imbellishment.

gave it to me. Just before he died.

CAPTAIN.

Taking a moment. Shaking his head.

But I can't find a ship and a crew and the money for a trip like this. It's preposterous.

DOCTOR

I have organized the resources. I will back the venture.

CAPTAIN

Smiling hugely, immediately reversing himself.

Then I think it's a great idea!

They all laugh, just in case the audience doesn't!

DOCTOR

I believe the story has merit. At least it's worth a try. An adventure!

CAPTAIN

Your stellar reputation for caution just flew out the window!

	DOCTOR
Godspeed.	
	CAPTAIN
Very well.	
	DOCTOR
Splendid.	
	JIM
Thank you.	
	CAPTAIN
Return	ing the map to Jim.
But you must hide this map carefully, and keep it a secret, even from me. Also, we'll need at least four men we can totally trust, and put them in cabins closest to us, with the powder and guns stored nearby.	
	DOCTOR
I will make that my responsibility. And as for the crew	
	CAPTAIN
I'll put the word out. I have to come up with a cover story as to why we are sailing.	
	DOCTOR
Understood.	
	CAPTAIN
But we'll have our choice of good, experienced sailors.	
	DOCTOR
We'll count on your expertise in that area.	
	CAPTAIN
Good! Because you may not like what you see. I won't	be hiring them for their looks!

They all stand.

Let's get started.

They leave the room as lights fade to black.

SCENE THREE:

The setting is nondescript. It could be any gathering place. Black Dog, Jon Anderson, Long John Silver, and Israel Hands, distribute themselves amongst the audience. When the lights rise, Captain Smollett is found standin centre stage addressing everyone.. Off to one side are Jim and

Dr. Livesey.

CAPTAIN

Could I have your attention please. Thank you all for coming today. We do appreciate your interest. As you know, we are looking for a crew for the HISPANIOLA. She sails one week from today. It will be a long journey, so anyone who wishes to apply should keep that in mind. I should also inform you that all but four of the crew have already been hired, so our job is almost done. Now let me introduce Dr. Livesey, who has found the financing for this trip. And his young ward, Jim Hawkins, whose father has graciously allowed him to join us. If they look too mean for you, leave now. They'll be sailing with us!

BLACK DOG

What's the purpose of the trip?

CAPTAIN

With a look to Jim and the Doctor.

We've been asked to chart a set of islands that aren't yet on any of the maps.

ANDERSON

Anything particular you're looking for in your remaining crew members?

CAPTAIN

Yes, I'm sorry. I should have mentioned that first.

He consults his notes.

Ah, here we are.

He looks up.

Sailors.

BLACK DOG

That's asking a lot.

CAPTAIN

Indeed it is.

SONG #5:

I NEED MEN

I NEED MEN WHO ARE FIT. I NEED MEN WHO'VE BEEN THERE. I NEED MEN WHO WON'T WILT. I NEED MEN WHO WON'T SCARE. I NEED MEN WHO CAN CLIMB UP THE RIGGING WITH SPEED. I NEED MEN WHO WON'T FALL, I NEED MEN WHO WON'T BLEED. I NEED MEN WHO CAN SIT IN THE CROW'S NEST ALL NIGHT, IN THE WILDEST OF WEATHER, AND SIGHT ANY SIGHT. I NEED MEN WHO WON'T SLIDE OFF THE DECK WITH A WAVE. I NEED MEN WHO ARE QUICK. I NEED MEN WHO ARE BRAVE.

I NEED SAILORS, SAILORS ONLY AT HOME ON A BOAT. SAILORS, SAILORS, IF I'M T' KEEP 'ER AFLOAT.

I NEED MEN WHO CAN THINK.
I NEED MEN WHO REACT.
I NEED MEN WHO DON'T SINK
SECONDS AFTER WE'VE TACKED.
I NEED MEN WHO HAVE HOPE.
I NEED MEN WHO ARE STRONG.
I NEED MEN GOOD WITH ROPE.
I NEED MEN WHO BELONG.
I NEED MEN WHO CAN WIN.
I NEED MEN WHO CAN LAST.
I NEED MEN WHO'VE BEEN SEEN

AT THE TOP OF A MAST.

I NEED MEN FULL OF FIRE.

I NEED MEN FULL OF GRIT.

CUZ WHOEVER I HIRE

HAS NO CHANCE TO QUITE.

I NEED SAILORS, SAILORS ONLY AT HOME ON THE SEA.. SAILORS, SAILORS, MEN JUST A LITTLE LIKE ME.

He joins the group, and once onstage, we see his peg leg.

CAPTAIN

Audience members may need coaching when their turn comes. Following are the answers of the cast members.

Jon Anderson, sir. I've sailed for many a year, and I have experience as a boatswain. Plus, I already have the whistle.

BUT YOU'RE MY FANTASY.

Blackout. End of Scene.

SCENE FOUR

The scene opens on the Island, indicated by whatever foliage is in the budget! The two sides are engaged in a gun battle, with Long John, Anderson, Black Dog, and Hands in a lower position under the Skull and Crossbones Flag, while Jim, the Doctor, and Captain Smollett are in a more elevated position under the British flag. After an active exchange, the guns fall silent on both sides.

DOCTOR

Can you see anything?

SMOLLETT

Nothing. How's the ammunition holding out, Jim.

JIM

It's fine for the moment, sir, but it won't last forever. I could try to sneak back to the ship to get more.

SMOLLETT

Not a chance. They'd spot you the moment you hit the water.

JIM

Even at night?

DOCTOR

Definitely not. It's too dangerous.

SMOLLETT

Look! It's Silver. With a white flag.

Long John emerges from his group.

LONG JOHN

Captain? Captain Smollett? Can you hear me?

SMOLLETT

I hear you, you scoundrel.

LONG JOHN

Captain, let's be sensible. This is really not getting us anywhere. We don't want to harm you. We like you, really we do!

SMOLLETT

Well, you have a strange way of showing it.

LONG JOHN

Now me and the boys was talking. If you hand us over the map, we'll not be botherin' you anymore.

SMOLLETT

I see. And do you suggest that we swim back to England?

LONG JOHN

Well, now, we could negotiate your safe passage. To a more occupied locale, shall we say?

SMOLLETT

Silver, you're a murderer, a thief, and a liar to boot.

LONG JOHN

To his pirates.

I think the peace talks are breaking down.

Back to the Captain.

I'd have to call this our last offer, Captain. You think it over. We'll give you a little peace and quiet to discuss it.

He returns to the pirates.

Break out the rum, boys. We're going to take a breather.

Large vocal reaction as lights fade on pirates.

SMOLLETT

Alright, Jim. Hand over the map.

DOCTOR

Captain, you're not serious? Give them the map and it's over.

SMOLLETT

We may have to face facts. Now that Hunter's been killed, we're down to five of us. We can't hold up here forever.

DOCTOR

What if we escaped into the woods?

SMOLLETT

They'd find us eventually. The Island isn't large enough to hide for long. And they still have control of the ship.

DOCTOR

I wish I knew exactly how many they left onboard. If we gave them the map as a diversion, we might be able to gain the ship back while they're searching for the treasure.

SMOLLETT

Possible. That might be our only hope. But getting out to the ship?

JIM

Captain, let me try. I'm not much help here, but if I could find a way out there, ay least we'd know what we're up aginst.

DOCTOR

I can't allow it. I promised you Father ...

SMOLLETT

Wait a minute. I think the boy has a point. He's no safer here, waiting for them to overpower us.

DOCTOR

I suppose that's true. But they'll be guarding the boats. How will you reach the ship?

JIM

I'll figure something out.

DOCTOR

You're a brave lad. And a clever one. Alright then. It's worth a try. Good luck, Jim.

JIM

Thank you, sir.

SMOLLETT

They seem to be busy having a party. Away you go. And for God's sake, be careful.

JIM

I will.

Lights fade as Jim leaves while Captain Smollett and Doctor Livesey resume their watch, guns ready. The lights rise on Jim in the woods.

At the end of the song, Jim is absorbed in hi thoughts, and doesn't notice the strange apparition flitting though the trees, watching him. The flittering apparition is Ben, who finally approaches Jim, trying to figure out how best to get his attention without scaring him too much. He finally decide.

LONG JOHN The map first. **DOCTOR** Sir, I am a man of honour. You are not. I will keep my word. You will not. The boy goes first. Four beats.

Slowly. Let's enjoy this moment.

They pull out a blanket. The another. Then another.

Where's the gold?

A couple of blankets more.

BLACK DOG

Empty.

LONG JOHN

Empty??!! Nooo!!! After them, boys, after them! They won't get away with this! After them. And show no mercy!

Pirates all rush out. Hear yeelin, sounds of battle offstage, recedes into distance. Ben, Jim, Dr. Livesey and Smollett enter from other side as cabin disappears. They are seen in the woods. Pirates near.

SMOLLETT

They're closing in. You run ahead. I'll try to delay them.

BEN

No, no, no, no, no, no, no, no.

58 JIM What is it, Ben? BEN Them scare! **DOCTOR** How do we do that? BEN Going into the audience. Woods, these mine. Friends all. Make sounds scary. Help me. Scary sounds. Everyone! Hopefully they do. If not, blackout, end of show. If they do, Ben does his jumping thing. **SMOLLETT** It's worth a try. Come on. They all go into the audience. Pirates appear. There they are. Shhh. SONG #12: HEY MEN, HO MEN BEN HEY MEN, HO MEN, SAILORS, CAN YOU HEAR ME? CAPTAIN FLINT AT YOUR SERVICE, CAN I BE OF SOME ASSISTANCE? **ANDERSON** IT'S COMING FROM OVER HERE. **BLACK DOG** NO, IT'S COMING FROM OVER THERE! LONG JOHN IT'S JUST THE WIND, DON'T YOU PAY IT ANY HEED.

HEY MEN, HO MEN, NOW YOU'RE DRAWING NEAR ME. CAPTAIN FLINT. DON'T BE NERVOUS.
I'VE BEEN WATCHING FROM A DISTANCE.

HANDS

THAT ISN'T THE WIND I HEAR.

ANDERSON

AYE, IT'S THE SOUND OF A GHOST, I SWEAR.

LONG JOHN

YOU'RE ALL AFRAID WHEN THERE ISN'T ANY NEED, LETTING YOUR IMAGINATION RUN AMOK.

KEEP YOUR MIND ON WHAT WE'RE AFTER.
ONCE WE FIND IT, SONG AND LAUGHTER
WILL BE THE ONLY SOUNDS THAT YOU HEAR!

High, chilling laugh.

Thanks Ben. We couldn't have done it without you.		
BEN		

Home go?

JIM

Home go.

Ben laughs, jumps up and down, claps, and runs off. Jim looks around.
