



HOW TO BECOME AN ELECTION JUDGE

You must contact your local political party representatives if you are interested in serving as an election judge. Colorado's major political parties submit lists of recommended election judges to the Elections Division before each election, as provided by Colorado law.

Election judges are compensated for training and hours worked. Election judges must meet the eligibility requirements established by Colorado law, including being a registered Colorado elector.

Serving as an election judge is not limited to Election Day. Depending on the election, a variety of positions and assignment types may be available, including Voter Service and Polling Centers (VSPCs), ballot processing, ballot retrieval, and other election-related duties. Not all election judges work every day of the election period. Assignments and schedules vary by position and operational needs.

Training and work schedules vary by election. Depending on the position, election judge assignments may include weekday, evening, and weekend hours. Most assignments begin before Election Day and may continue for several days afterward. Supervisors and select positions may also work during post-election activities.
