# U.S. CAMPUS POLICY GRADEBOOK

Centering health, safety, and education in campus policies



## Introduction

Students for Sensible Drug Policy advocates for campus policies which center student health, safety, and education rather than punitive enforcement of laws and campus regulations which deny students access to education and needlessly expose young to the dangers of the carceral system, law enforcement practices such as the use of confidential informants, and overdose.

Every weekend across the U.S., 21 million college students make choices about how they are going to party. Will it be a sober night, or will they choose to consume alcohol or another drug of unknown origin, potency, or composition regardless of rules or prohibitions against doing so? Based on government data about drug use, we can conservatively estimate that, each month, 12 million students choose to consume alcohol, 4 million choose to use marijuana, and another 4 million will choose another drug.

Colleges and universities are obligated to protect the lives of students *in loco parentis* and must acknowledge the plain fact that students will use -- and sometimes misuse -- drugs and alcohol despite decades of efforts to eliminate such behaviors. Drug policies based in harm reduction ensure the millions of students who will inevitably choose to use alcohol or other drugs have a better chance of safely making it to graduation.

Throughout the nation, colleges have been embracing practices that focus on safeguarding, rather than punishing, students who abuse alcohol or illicit drugs, often at the suggestion of students themselves. Such institutions stress that their intent is not to be permissive, and that their rules against underage drinking and illicit-drug possession remain in effect. Nevertheless, faced with the persistent risk of alcohol-related student deaths, a national upsurge in opioid overdoses, and nationwide spates of medical emergencies among consumers of "club drugs," the colleges have been showing a willingness to suspend enforcement of their rules if necessary to keep students from being harmed. - Schmidt, Peter (2016, September 13). ## U.S. Campus Policy Grading Criteria

### Medical Amnesty Policies (35 points)

A full medical amnesty policy is defined as an explicitly stated and publicized policy which protects victims, callers, and bystanders in alcohol and drug related emergencies from legal or school sanctions. Medical amnesty policies save lives by removing the fear of calling for help during alcohol or other drug related emergencies, greatly increasing the likelihood that such an event is survivable and, in the case of ongoing substance misuse, a student will participate in counseling and thereby reduce the risk of additional events.

#### *FERPA and parental notification*

Under the [Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act](#) (FERPA), schools are permitted to contact a student's parents or guardians without the student's consent when he or she has violated laws or institutional policies regarding the use of alcohol or drugs. As such, even if "parental notification" is not a listed sanction for a particular school, such notification is still possible. We acknowledge parents or guardians can provide an important support for students struggling with alcohol or other drugs. However, parental notification assumes parents are equipped to handle a complex health problem, the student-parent relationship is characterized by healthy communication, and the relationship with the parent or guardian is not a contributing factor to drug misuse. Additionally, such laws violate the privacy of legal adults, undermine the relationship of trust between students and their school, and discourage students from seeking help from campus health resources.

### Drug Education and Information (20 points)

The most effective drug education is evidence-based, founded in the principles of harm reduction, readily available via multiple delivery channels, and delivered by peers. SSDP's Just Say Know peer-to-peer drug education meets these criteria and is available on campuses nationwide.

### Naloxone access on campus (10 points)

The opioid overdose reversal drug Naloxone should be available from the student health center and carried by resident advisors and campus safety officers.

### Sanctions for use or possession of alcohol and other drugs (15 points)

Academic, legal, or financial sanctions for use or possession of drugs do not reduce drug use, and particularly do not reduce problematic drug use. Instead, they isolate and stigmatize drug users and impede their ability to succeed. Ideal policies are built on supportive, stabilizing strategies such as evidence-based counseling and do not, in the absence of other dangerous behavior, contain the types of

sanctions historically relied upon by institutions such as eviction, suspension or expulsion, forced treatment, or mandatory fines which could lead to such sanctions.

### Resident advisor discretion (10 points)

Resident advisors should be trained to recognize the signs of problematic drug use and responsible for providing support in such cases but should be permitted discretion in all others. They should not be permitted to engage in violations of privacy such as bag searches.

### Additional criteria

- 5 points: The student government is able to pass resolutions changing or requesting changes to campus policy
- 4 points: The campus offers a complimentary safe rides program
- 1 point: The campus does not have an absolute smoking ban

### A note on federal funding, compliance with law, and drug policies

It is commonly believed that colleges and universities must maintain and enforce punitive drug and alcohol policies to maintain funding. In order to receive federal funding and comply with the Higher Education Act, schools are required to state their policies regarding drugs and alcohol. Many colleges also list the possible legal penalties for alcohol and drug violations. As these statements are required to receive funding, the statements are not interpreted to be relevant to the relative stringency of campus drug and alcohol policies.

## American University: F

American University is a private institution in Washington, DC with an enrollment of 13,061 and was most recently graded in August 2016.

The protocol does not protect repeated, flagrant, or serious violations of the Code of Student Conduct or other university policies (including physical or sexual assault, violence, hazing, harassment, theft, or vandalism or instances where multiple individuals need medical attention), nor does it preclude or prevent action by police or other legal authorities. Only an individual student (including an individual member of a student organization) may receive amnesty under this policy. The Medical Amnesty Policy does not provide amnesty for student organizations."

## Boston College: D-

Boston College was most recently graded in August 2016.

### Summary of alcohol and other drug policies

#### "4.3 SUBSTANCE USE AND ABUSE POLICIES

Boston College abides by all local, state, and federal laws with regard to alcohol and drug use. The University prioritizes the health, safety, and wellbeing of every member of the community and requires that individuals who choose to use alcohol and drugs do so in a responsible manner. All members of our community have the right to an academic and residential environment free from the abusive effects of alcohol and drug use...

#### 4.3.2 Drug Policy

The University prohibits the possession, use, consumption, manufacturing, sale or distribution of drugs, as well as the possession, use, manufacturing or sale of drug paraphernalia. Additionally, the possession of drugs with intent to deliver, sell or manufacture is prohibited..."

The health and safety of Boston College students is of paramount concern. As a result, all students are expected and encouraged to seek immediate assistance for themselves or others in situations where help is needed due to intoxication or drug ingestion.

Students should actively seek assistance for themselves or others, as a result of impairment due to alcohol and/or drug use. Boston College will support and encourage this help-seeking behavior by treating the situation as a health and safety matter, rather than a conduct matter, when students contact emergency responders or university officials (e.g., Resident Assistant, Boston College Police). Additionally, anyone who seeks help or calls for help on behalf of another student will not be subject to action through the conduct system.

Students who seek and receive medical attention in such situations will be required to complete certain educational and/or counseling interventions and will also be subject to all fees related to their medical care. Failure to complete these referrals would be treated as a conduct matter.

Students who demonstrate consistent and repeated patterns of seeking help for alcohol and drug related medical emergencies may require further medical review and/or treatment up to mandated medical leaves of absence.

Regardless of help-seeking behavior, students will be held accountable for misconduct accompanying or incidental to the use and/or abuse of alcohol or other substances. For example, disorderly behavior, violence, property damage, or distribution or intent to distribute will be treated as conduct violations and will be responded to accordingly."

Third Violation > Referral to the Office of the Dean of Students for consideration of suspension or alternative sanctioning SUSPENSION > Documentation of the completion of an alcohol assessment/treatment program is required for consideration of readmission > University Conduct Probation upon return to the University > Monthly meetings with Associate or Assistant Dean of Students upon return

The purpose of this policy is to describe University standards of conduct concerning alcohol and drugs, communicate the health risks and other legal and disciplinary consequences of failing to adhere to University standards of conduct, and provide information as to available assistance and resources."

"The goal of "Safety First" is to ensure that students receive prompt medical attention for any health or safety emergency, and to ensure there are no impediments to reporting incidents of alcohol or other drug intoxication, harassment, violence or assault (including physical or sexual). A Safety First policy benefits our campus by encouraging students to make responsible decisions in seeking medical attention in serious or life-threatening situations that result from alcohol and/or other drug abuse and in any situation where medical treatment is reasonably believed to be appropriate. If a student is so intoxicated or drugged that the student is incoherent and/or unable to be awakened, letting the student "sleep it off" is not a reasonable alternative to getting the student the necessary medical help. Failing to seek assistance for a fellow student who appears to be dangerously impaired due to drug or alcohol abuse may result in sanctions."

### Summary of alcohol and other drug policies

2. The College prohibits the unlawful possession, use, and/or distribution of alcohol and illicit drugs by students and employees on College property or as part of any College activities. (see also Smoking Policy)
3. The college will confiscate any unlawful or unauthorized items. This includes, but is not limited to paraphernalia, bongos, pipes, drugs, kegs, beer bongos, etc. Once confiscated, the items will not be returned. Persons under 21 years of age are prohibited from drinking alcoholic beverages. Persons 21 years of age or older may drink alcoholic beverages only in their private residential rooms or at registered events. Alcohol is not permitted in any public area without prior registration. Public areas include but are not limited to: Sayles-Hill, Severance Great Hall, dining halls, residence hall and house lounges/living rooms study rooms and corridors, all academic buildings and athletic areas, and all outdoor areas owned and operated by the College, including outdoor recreational areas.
4. Possession of open containers of alcohol is prohibited at all times at all campus locations, except at registered event locations or in private residential rooms.
8. All alcohol which is unauthorized will be confiscated along with all other related items (taps, kegs, cups, etc.). Note: This may result in loss of any purchaser's deposit(s). The student host or residents of the event will be held responsible and will face disciplinary action.
14. High-risk alcohol-related activities, such as progressives, drinking theme parties, drinking games, beer bongos, and similar behaviors are prohibited.
16. Social Host Liability: Anyone over 21 who knowingly serves alcohol to someone under 21 may be held civilly liable for any damages subsequently caused by the person under 21.

# Chicago-Kent College of Law at the Illinois Institute of Technology: D

Chicago-Kent College of Law at the Illinois Institute of Technology is a private institution and was most recently graded in March 2021

## Memorandum on Chicago-Kent's Drug Policies

Students For Sensible Drug Policy ("SSDP") is an international association of student organizations that is concerned about the negative impact of drugs on communities but also firmly committed to ending the war on drugs. This memo applies a campus drug policy gradebook provided by SSDP to evaluate Chicago-Kent's policies.

### Summary of Chicago-Kent's Drug Policy

Chicago-Kent's drug policy is premised on abstinence of substances other than alcohol.<sup>1</sup> The Illinois Institute of Technology has "a comprehensive drug free awareness program to inform employees and students about the dangers of drug and alcohol use" and provides free counseling to all students.<sup>2</sup> Looking at the information the Student Health Center publishes regarding the drug free awareness program, there is an abundance of resources concerning drug addiction and treatment, but not much concerning harm reduction or drug safety.<sup>3</sup>

The Chicago-Kent Code of Conduct grants broad discretion to the Law School Discipline Tribunal to punish students for drug related activities.<sup>4</sup> The Code of Conduct grants the Tribunal the power to expel, suspend, or impose *any* sanction it deems appropriate.<sup>5</sup> Notations on transcripts are mandatory unless the Tribunal unanimously votes otherwise.<sup>6</sup> Regardless of the occurrence of such a vote, violations are reported to appropriate licensing authorities.<sup>7</sup> There is no written mandatory reporting to law enforcement, but there are anonymous publication requirements.<sup>8</sup> If the prosecutor determines that the prosecution of a violation would not be in the best interests of the law school, the Prosecutor has the discretion not to proceed with the case.<sup>9</sup>

A drug related violation must meet two conditions. First, it must either "(a) affect or threaten to affect another IIT student or a member of the faculty, staff or administration of IIT; or (b) occur on IIT premises or at a function sponsored by IIT or by an IIT student organization"<sup>10</sup> Second, the drug related violation must include "[s]elling, distributing, manufacturing, using, or possessing illegal drugs . . . [OR] [v]iolating federal, state, or municipal laws on university premises (or in university residence halls) in a way that adversely affects the functioning of the university."<sup>11</sup>

There is no medical amnesty policy in the Code of Conduct. The Code may be amended upon the affirmative vote by a majority of the faculty members after the proposed amendment has been circulated for student comments.<sup>12</sup>

Campus safety is training their personnel to administer naloxone in cases of opiate or opioid overdose. Some of the "watch commanders" have already been trained. They are training the rest of their first responders, at least on the main campus, over the next few months. A representative from campus safety said that they will be training the officers that work at other campuses, such as the law school, after they train the first responders at the primary campus. They did not offer a hard date on when that will be happening.

The Student Health Center does not carry naloxone or make it available to students.

### Analysis

SSDP has a 100-point gradebook,<sup>13</sup> but I believe that only 70 points apply because Chicago-Kent is a law school without a campus where a majority of students reside. Chicago-Kent receives 10 points.

Since Chicago-Kent has no medical amnesty policy, it loses out on around one third of the points in the SSDP gradebook. Medical amnesty policies remove barriers for students who need to seek medical attention for impaired friends or for themselves in alcohol or drug related emergencies. Under medical amnesty policies, students are protected from punitive actions if they seek medical attention, which can reduce harm by eliminating hesitation due to fear of penalties. While it might seem unlikely that a student would overdose on the law school campus, it is not inconceivable, and the Code of Conduct already contemplates the possibility of drug use on campus. The broad language "affect" another student also leaves one wondering what would happen if a law student who lived on the main campus called campus safety to administer naloxone to another student. Or even a student who called 911 in their own apartment after partying with another student. The prosecutor could prosecute either student if it came to their attention and they were using, sharing, or in possession of drugs.

It is true that the code seems intended to deter people from endangering one another, but it is plausible that professional and academic consequences that might flow from a violation could cause hesitation in a student who needed help. In an overdose situation, seconds and minutes matter. It is also doubtful that punishing people results in less or less dangerous drug use.

SSDP recommends a medical amnesty policy that applies to alcohol and drugs, shields the victim, the caller, and any bystanders from penalties, and has no frequency restrictions. They recommend the school have a policy of not notifying parents or law enforcement about the incident. Although medical amnesty is arguably less of an issue at a law school where most students do not live at residences in which calling for help would mean notifying campus authorities of the situation, I still think it could be an important conversation to have as a student body. Getting a policy on the books could raise awareness by reducing fears about calling for help and encouraging people to carry naloxone if they or anyone they know uses opiates, even occasionally.

Another place where there is room for improvement is naloxone access. Particularly at the student health center, it would be great to see them keep that in stock and make sure students who use opiates that come through their doors walk out with naloxone. A representative from the Student health Center stated that they do not have a pharmacy and for that reason would not carry a drug like naloxone, but naloxone can be purchased without a prescription and can be disseminated by absolutely anybody. Administering naloxone is as simple as using a nasal spray (it is in fact offered a nasal spray). Additionally, it would be good to stay in touch with campus safety to ensure that they follow through with their plans to train law school campus safety officers.

SSDP recommends a peer-to-peer drug education program. IIT has accurate and evidence-based information available on their websites and presumably through the third-party counseling center they have hired to provide care to Kent students. But SSDP suggests that students are the best people to disseminate information about drugs because students are most likely turning to one another about such topics in the first place. Additionally, SSDP does not take an abstinence-only approach to its drug education, unlike IIT, and as such can address issues of harm reduction that are not considered in abstinence-only programs.

## Conclusion

There is work to be done at Chicago-Kent to make it a safer and more aware place when it comes to drugs and drug safety. This memo was intended to appraise you of some of the issues I identified. Comments or feedback are appreciated. I am still processing the information and trying to think about what aspects of it are worth working to improve upon and which items should be prioritized if any. There are eight chapters in Illinois, all of them formed in the past five years. If there is sincere interest from my colleagues, I would be invested in starting one at Chicago-Kent to achieve some of the aims laid out in this memo. If people have other ideas for what they would want to see from an SSDP at Chicago-Kent, that would of course be welcome.

#### Drug Policy and Sanctions

For the purpose of these regulations, drugs are defined as including marijuana, hashish, amphetamines, LSD compounds, mescaline, psilocybin, DMT, narcotics, opiates, and other hallucinogens including Spice, K2, and synthetic marijuana, except when taken under a physician's prescription in accordance with law.

University regulations, in conformity with Federal and State statutes governing drug use, provide the following:

-Manufacturing or providing drugs to others is prohibited. The penalty for violation of this regulation shall range from disciplinary suspension to dismissal from the university.

-Possession or consumption of drugs is also prohibited. Possession of drug paraphernalia is prohibited. The penalty for violation of this regulation ordinarily shall range from deferred disciplinary suspension to dismissal."

Further, "Columbia affiliates (students and employees) who violate the University's policies concerning illicit drugs will face discipline through their schools or administrative units, up to and including expulsion or termination of employment, and may also include the requirement of completing an appropriate rehabilitation program" and "where appropriate or necessary, the University will cooperate fully with law enforcement agencies and may refer students and employees for prosecution."

The University will adhere to strict policies of confidentiality for all participants in drug/ alcohol abuse rehabilitation programs as described in University and Federal regulations covering confidentiality of student health records. Maryland and District of Columbia laws prohibit the possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages by persons under the age of 21. The possession, use, or distribution of illegal drugs as defined by federal, state, and local statutes is prohibited. Students are expected to obey the law. Individuals who violate the law, in addition to being subject to criminal penalties, may be subject to University disciplinary measures. The University will not excuse acts of misconduct committed by students whose judgment is impaired due to alcohol or drug abuse."

"To encourage students to immediately seek necessary medical attention or assistance for themselves or others in need, the University will not impose disciplinary action for a violation of student alcohol or drug policies against individual students or Recognized Student Groups/Organizations when they report to or seek assistance from the University or law enforcement for a medical emergency or condition, or against the student who is subject of such medical emergency or condition, if: (1) the University determines that the violation occurred during or near the time of the alleged medical emergency or condition; (2) the student or Recognized Student Group/Organization is determined to have made the report or sought assistance in good faith; and (3) the University determines that the violation was not an act that was reasonably likely to place the health or safety of another individual at risk. However, repeated or serious medical emergencies arising from or in connection with Parties may result in disciplinary action against students and/or Recognized Student Groups/Organizations under applicable procedures.

This amnesty does not preclude disciplinary action for other violations of applicable policies including but not limited to the University Sexual Misconduct Policy and Procedures, and applicable student codes of conduct. Further, it does not preclude action by local, state and federal authorities.

In order for amnesty to apply, a student must agree to timely completion of any recommended alcohol and other drug educational requirements, assessment, treatment (depending on the level of concern for student health and safety), and/or other corrective measures. Similarly, Recognized Student Groups/Organizations must agree to implement any measures for responsible hosting of Parties in a timely manner, and to complete any recommended educational and training requirements and/or other corrective measures.

Typically, the student and/or Recognized Student Group/Organization will first attend a mandatory meeting with a staff member of the Homewood Office of Student Life. This meeting is not considered a part of the disciplinary process, but rather an opportunity to discuss corrective measures around the student's and/or Recognized Student Group's/Organization's decisions related to alcohol or other drugs. Repeated or serious incidents will result in additional corrective measures from the Homewood Office of Student Life. A failure to complete any corrective measures may result in disciplinary action against students and/or Recognized Student Groups/Organizations, up to and including revocation of recognition as a University recognized student group or organization.

A failure to seek assistance for a member of our community in medical need may have serious and lasting consequences for that individual. Disciplinary sanctions will be severe for any student and/or student group/organization who interfere with an individual's attempt or ability to take responsible action."

"A medical withdrawal leave is granted to a student whose physical or mental/psychological health prevents successful study and must be taken for at least one semester, but no longer than five years, following the semester of approved leave, but no longer than five years, from the date of departure. To be granted a medical leave of absence, a student must first consult the Director of Counseling Services to discuss the request. Students on a medical leave must be actively engaged in a course of treatment that leads to recovery. Proof of treatment will be required prior to approval for the student to return to the College. An approved medical leave does not relieve the student of his/her financial responsibilities to LIM College. Students receiving financial aid are strongly advised to meet with Student Financial Services staff to discuss the financial implications of taking a medical withdrawal.

All requests for withdrawal require thorough and credible documentation, which includes:

A written request for a medical withdrawal, from the student, which outlines the medical condition, the ways the condition has interfered with the student's ability to be successful and the steps taken or intended, for addressing the condition.

A current letter, on letterhead paper, from a licensed M.D., D.O., Clinical Psychologist, Mental Health Counselor or Social Worker that includes:

- a detailed diagnosis of the medical condition, including the diagnosis code.
- a statement indicating it is medically necessary that the student withdraws from classes.
- the specific date on which the student became medically unable to participate in school.
- the anticipated duration of the medical condition (when the student will be able to return to his/her regular course of study).
- If approved, the Director of Counseling Services determines the effective date based on the documentation provided by the healthcare provider, as well as the last date of class attendance.

Once a medical withdrawal/leave is approved by the Director of Counseling Services, the student must complete and sign the LIM College Withdrawal Form. This form can be obtained from the Office of the Registrar. The completed form must be submitted directly to the Registrar. A medical withdrawal is not effective until the form is submitted and processed by the Registrar.

## Maryland Institute College of Art (MICA): B-

Maryland Institute College of Art (MICA) is a private institution in Baltimore, MD with an enrollment of 2128 students and was most recently graded in March 2020.

### Summary of alcohol and other drug policies

#### Alcohol Policy

Maryland Institute College of Art is committed to enforcing College policies that prohibit persons under the age of 21 from possessing, serving, or consuming alcohol. In addition, MICA discourages those 21 years and over from abusing alcohol. The unauthorized possession or use of alcoholic beverages on College-owned or -controlled property, including student residences, is expressly forbidden. As adults, students bear ultimate personal responsibility for knowing and adhering to state and federal law.

Students living in campus housing who are 21 years or older may drink alcohol in the privacy of their apartments; however, they may not buy or serve alcohol to students or others under the legal drinking age. If an apartment is shared by those both under and over 21, it must be clear to any College official that alcohol is being consumed only by those 21 years of age and older. If an apartment is occupied only by those under 21, then alcohol is not permitted under any circumstance.

Open containers of alcohol are not permitted in any of the public or common spaces on campus, including courtyards, stairwells, or parking lots. Multi-quart containers such as kegs are not allowed in any campus-owned or -controlled space.

Students who violate this policy will be subject to the following sanctions, among others, depending upon College officials' assessment of the severity of the violation(s):

- Alcohol education
- Assessment for alcohol abuse problem
- Required alcohol abuse treatment program
- Housing probation (if student resides in College housing)
- Dismissal from College housing (if student resides in College housing)
- Suspension from the College
- Dismissal from the College
- Referral to law enforcement agencies

Also, if alcohol is found in the possession of underage students, staff will require that the alcohol be disposed of in the presence of the staff member. Students who are in the presence of alcohol, under certain circumstances, may also be determined to be in violation of the alcohol policy.

#### Drug Policy

The use, possession, or sale (or possession with intent to sell) of illegal or illicit drugs or narcotics is expressly prohibited by federal state, and local laws and regulations, as well as College policy. Possession or use of illicit drugs by students are grounds for severe sanctions, including expulsion, and may result in referral to authorities for prosecution. The possession of drug paraphernalia (including hookahs, bongs, needles not for prescribed use, and other such items) is also a violation of both state law and College policy.

Cannabidiol (CBD) oils and other derivatives are prohibited for student use regardless of intended use or origin, i.e. hemp vs. marijuana. Students who violate this policy will be subject to any of the following sanctions, among others, depending upon College officials' assessment of the severity of the violations:

- Assessment for substance abuse problem (cost to be borne by student)
- Required substance abuse treatment program (cost to be borne by student)
- Mandatory drug testing program (cost to be borne by student)
- Housing probation (if student lives in College housing)
- Dismissal from College housing (if student lives in College housing)
- College probation
- Loss of financial aid
- Suspension from the College
- Dismissal from the the College
- Referral to law enforcement agencies

"Pace University has a strong commitment to a healthy and safe environment for all members of the University community. Any use of alcohol and drugs that is illegal or violates this Policy will not be tolerated. It is the policy of the University that the unlawful use, possession, sale, distribution, or manufacture of controlled substances and alcohol on University property or at University sponsored programs and activities are prohibited. Even though its possession or consumption may otherwise be lawful, alcohol, except in limited circumstances, is not permitted on University property or at University sponsored programs and activities.

There are two exceptions to the prohibition against the possession and consumption of alcohol on University property and at University sponsored programs and activities. One exception to this Policy is for the moderate possession and consumption of alcohol at University sponsored programs and activities by individuals legally permitted to possess and consume alcohol, provided prior written approval from the appropriate University representative has been granted. The second exception permits students, except for those who reside in Maria's Tower, who are at least 21 years of age to possess and consume a moderate amount of beer or wine (not hard liquor) in their residential housing room.

This Policy applies to each member of the University community -- students, faculty, and staff -- as well as to contractors, vendors, licensees, invitees and visitors. This Policy is in compliance with the Drug-Free Workplace Act and the Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act, and it is distributed to every student and faculty and staff member."

"All students and employees should know that Rutgers University prohibits unlawful possession, use or distribution of illicit drugs and alcohol on its property or as part of any activities.

Any student found responsible for committing, attempting to commit, or assisting others in committing a violation shall be subject to disciplinary sanctions.

Students may be held accountable for their behavior through both the criminal justice system and the University conduct process. University conduct proceedings may be carried out prior to, simultaneously with, or following civil or criminal proceedings at the discretion of the Director of Student Conduct for Rutgers University-New Brunswick and the Chancellor's Designee for RBHS, Rutgers University-Camden or Rutgers University-Newark. Disciplinary action, decisions, and/or sanctions shall not be subject to change because criminal charges were dismissed, reduced, or resolved in favor of the student. University community members are not precluded from filing a civil or criminal charge against a student before, while, or after the University pursues disciplinary action."

#### Alcohol:

"When students choose to accept admission to Rutgers University, they accept the rights and responsibilities of membership in the University's academic and social community. Our policies seek to provide an environment that reduces or eliminates the adverse consequences of alcohol and other drug misuse and abuse.

The University recognizes that addiction is a treatable illness and encourages anyone who may have a substance use disorder to seek treatment. This policy is not designed to be punitive for students seeking treatment. Comprehensive health education and mental health services for students (including alcohol and other drug treatment) are provided on all University campuses.

A NOTE ABOUT MEDICAL AMNESTY: Students who seek emergency medical attention for themselves or others for a condition related to consumption of alcohol or other drugs, will not be charged with related violations of the Rutgers University Code of Student Conduct."

the DAAPP and other resources on campus emphasize an abstinence based approach to drug use. There are no direct resources on campus for community based programs, but the Student Health Center offers referrals and mental health counseling.

In regard to Student Government's ability to make direct policy change, there is a clause that states, "Students shall have the right to participate in the formation of policy affecting them in accordance with established procedures for Shared Governance." The Associated Student Government President at Miramar College, a college in the San Diego Community College District which San Diego City College is included in, said in response to my inquiry, "To answer your question simply: yes, student government does have the capability to influence, even change, college policies. The only caveat is that a student government cannot create policy that conflicts with either college or district policy, state education code, or local, state, or federal law. However, any of these can be changed through proposed policy changes or legislation, which a student government can pursue through various means."

Violators may face suspension or expulsion from the university. In addition, the university will cooperate with governmental authorities in criminal and civil actions. The university does not accept alcohol or substance abuse as an excuse, reason, or rationale for any act of abuse, harassment, intimidation, violence, or vandalism...

Possession or consumption of distilled liquor on university property is prohibited at all times. Possession, consumption, or sale of beer or wine by those 21 years of age or older is permitted at designated campus locations and events only with prior approval of the vice president for student affairs...

On campus property, and in surrounding neighborhoods, the sale, distribution, knowing possession, and use of dangerous drugs or narcotics are prohibited. You are also forbidden by State and Federal laws to sell, distribute, possess, or use those drugs. SDSU does not permit the possession or use of marijuana even with a medical recommendation...

Students who possess, use, or distribute substances such as, but not limited to, marijuana, cocaine, methamphetamines, or other hallucinogens and narcotics, or who violate statutes regarding alcoholic beverages, are subject to arrest, imprisonment, or a fine according to State law. The University Police Department is empowered to enforce all State and Federal laws, including public drunkenness, driving under the influence, and possession of alcohol by a minor.

The university's commitment to exercising disciplinary powers in cases of illegal alcohol and drug use complements its full measure of support for students who seek help for themselves or their acquaintances. These two approaches, combined with an active prevention education program, provide a strong basis for maintaining university expectations for a safe, healthy, and productive campus community. We hope that you will take advantage of the programs and services available to you, and that you will join with us in creating a viable learning community."

3. Students in violation of these regulations may: Student behavior that is not consistent with the Student Conduct Code is addressed through an educational process that is designed to promote safety and good citizenship and, when necessary, impose appropriate consequences. The following behavior is subject to disciplinary sanctions"
4. "Any person found in a public place to be under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs and unable to care for his/her own safety or interfering with a public way can be charged with disorderly conduct, a misdemeanor offense. The University Police Department will enforce these laws."

### School policy grade details

#### Good Samaritan policy (2.5 of 40 points)

Students and other members of the community who observe a medical or other emergency are obligated to call for help by dialing 911. If the persons acting as Good Samaritans by placing such a call are found to be in violation of a University policy, the fact that they placed the call will be considered a mitigating circumstance in determining potential sanctions. A student who receives medical assistance may be required to meet with a substance abuse specialist in DuWell for education, assessment, and possible referral for treatment. The student may also be required to complete an educational assignment. Parents of such students under the legal drinking age may also be notified. A group that facilitates the acquisition of alcohol may also be required to notify its advisor, provide an educational program for members, and/or change its processes for hosting events.

In the event that a student fails to meet with the specialist, chooses not to participate in the outlined expectations, or exhibits a pattern of abusive behavior with alcohol, the student may be subject to formal disciplinary action.

A panel of the Undergraduate Conduct Board will be informed of a student who has received "amnesty" under this provision of the Alcohol Policy should the student be subsequently found responsible for a violation of policy related to substance use for purposes of effective sanctioning.

### Summary of alcohol and other drug policies

1. No one may serve alcoholic beverages on Tulane University property or within University facilities without proper written permission. The appropriate administrator (university president, vice presidents, deans, directors, or department heads) may grant permission to those persons, groups of persons or organizations within their areas of responsibility.
2. No one may consume alcoholic beverages in uncontrolled areas such as streets and sidewalks.
3. Service of alcoholic beverages shall be limited to those over the age of 21, and pursuant to University 22 • Alcohol and Other Drugs Policies and Procedures 2012–2013 procedure, University trained personnel will monitor access to alcoholic beverage service areas by those under age 21.
4. Alcohol manufacturers, distributors or drinking establishments may not advertise in or on university property, including but not limited to residence halls, recreation centers, kiosks or academic buildings. Similarly, university organizations shall not promote alcoholic beverage manufacturers, distributors or drinking establishments other than to announce a university event location.
5. Faculty and staff are also subject to the alcohol and other drug policies contained in their respective handbooks and should familiarize themselves with those policies

Tulane students are served by a Substance Abuse Clinic located in the Student Health Center (uptown), Building 92, Room 338, telephone 865-5255, extension 235. Tulane also has in place an Employee Assistance Program (EAP), located at the Tulane Medical Center (downtown), telephone 587-7485. Both programs provide prevention, intervention, and counseling support to members of the Tulane community.

The University will impose sanctions for violations of local, state and federal laws as well as for violations of regulations contained in student and employee codes and handbooks. Violators may be punished by expulsion, termination of employment, and referral for prosecution. University sanctions will depend upon the past record of the violator and the severity of the violation. Failure to complete a designated rehabilitation program may be cause to terminate an employee or exclude a student from the University."

Any UA student who seeks and obtains medical assistance on their own behalf may use the Medical Emergency Assistance Policy only once during their matriculation as a student. The availability of the application of this policy for a second incident is at the discretion of the Dean of Students or their designee.

A student seeking or obtaining medical emergency assistance on their own behalf in compliance with this policy will only be eligible for an exemption under this policy when violations of the Code of Student Conduct are related to the use, consumption, or possession of alcohol and/or illicit drugs. However, The University of Alabama reserves the right to refer other types of violations of the Code of Student Conduct, including, but not limited to, disorderly conduct, improper identification (Fake ID), damage to property, distribution of alcohol, distribution of illicit drugs, harassment, hazing, assault, sexual violence, and causing or threatening physical harm, to the Office of Student Conduct.

If the student seeking or obtaining medical assistance has been determined to be eligible for an exemption under this policy by a representative from the Dean of Students, the student will be required to meet with the Dean of Students or their designee to develop a student success plan/agreement outlining appropriate behavioral and education components that maximize the student's personal and academic success. The specific plan/agreement may include, but is not limited to, behavioral and education elements such as: a Student Success Agreement, enrollment in the MPACT program, Counseling, Assessment, Educational Programming (i.e., AlcoholEDU for Sanctions, Alcohol Education Workshop, and Community Involvement) and a parental notification letter for students under the age of 21.

Upon the successful completion of a designated program, the Dean of Students or their designee grants the student a medical emergency assistance exemption. Should the student fail to comply with or successfully complete the University designated program/agreement set forth by the Dean of Students or their designee, then the student may be referred to the Office of Student Conduct for further action.

Students who (a) seek medical emergency assistance on behalf of another student experiencing a medical emergency related to use, consumption, or possession of alcohol and/or illicit drugs and (b) do not participate in providing or distributing the alcohol and/or illicit drugs that triggered the medical emergency may not be referred to the Office of Student Conduct for violations of the Code of Student Conduct relating to use, consumption, or possession of alcohol and/or illicit drugs. However, any UA students who seek and obtain emergency medical assistance on the behalf of another student are eligible to benefit from this policy more than once.

A student seeking or obtaining medical emergency assistance on behalf of another student in compliance with this policy will only be eligible for an exemption when violations of the Code of Student Conduct during the incident in question are related to the use, consumption, or possession of alcohol and/or illicit drugs. However, the University of Alabama reserves the right to refer other types of violations of the Code of Student Conduct, including, but not limited to, disorderly conduct, improper identification (Fake ID), damage to property, distribution of alcohol, distribution of illicit drugs, harassment, hazing, assault, sexual violence, and causing or threatening physical harm, to the Office of Student Conduct.

If the student seeking or obtaining medical assistance on behalf of another student has been determined to be eligible for an exemption under this policy by a representative from the Dean of Students or their designee, the student may be required to meet with the Dean of Students or their designee to develop a student success plan/agreement depending upon their involvement in the incident."

In addition, employees and students shall not use illegal substances or abuse legal substances in a manner that impairs work performance, scholarly activities, or student life.

Employees found to be in violation of this Policy, including student employees if the circumstances warrant, may be subject to corrective action, up to and including dismissal, under applicable University policies and labor contracts, or may be required, at the discretion of the University, to participate satisfactorily in an Employee Support Program.

Students found to be in violation of this Policy may be subject to corrective action, up to and including dismissal, as set forth in the University of California Policies Applying to Campus Activities, Organizations, and Students (Part A) and in campus regulations, or may be required, at the discretion of the University, to participate satisfactorily in a treatment program.

Participation in any educational program as a result of a meeting with the student's Dean or his/her designee will not be noted on the student's conduct record. However, when a student is involved in an additional alcohol or controlled substance medical-related emergency within two calendar years after receiving protection under this Protocol, the subsequent incident will be treated as a second offense and will not be eligible for protection. C. Records of all reports addressed by this Protocol will be maintained by the Office of Student Conduct. D. Students from the School of Medicine and Skaggs School of Pharmacy are eligible for protection under this Protocol. However, they may also be subject to discipline by the respective school for violating school-specific professional conduct policies relating to the use of alcohol and/or controlled substances. E. Nothing in this Protocol will prevent an individual who is obligated by local, state or federal law from reporting, charging or taking other action related to the possible criminal prosecution of any student or non-affiliate.

(Note: Students are responsible for all aspects of the code of conduct both on and off campus.)"

Drug policy:

"Illegal use, possession, manufacturing or distribution (or participation in the sale of) of marijuana, heroin, narcotics, or other controlled substances and/or any use or possession of general products as intoxicants or "means to get high" is strictly prohibited. Additionally, driving while impaired by such drugs, improper use, possession or distribution of prescription drugs, and paraphernalia commonly used to consume drugs is not permitted. Paraphernalia includes but is not limited to pipes, bong, hookahs, and homemade smoking devices.

Note: The University no longer provides students with the opportunity to take a drug test when accused of drug use. However, any person can request a drug test prescription from a medical doctor for submission as evidence. One should consider the time lapse between the incident and the test when submitting medical records."

"The University encourages students to seek medical attention for themselves and others when needed and recognizes that the potential for disciplinary action may be a barrier to seeking medical assistance for issues involving the use of alcohol or drugs. It is for this reason that CS&C offers medical amnesty through participation in a diversion program (known as the Blueprint Program.)

Students who gain access to medical attention due to peer intervention will qualify for medical amnesty. Additionally, the caller will not be documented for simple alcohol/drug violations that become known to authorities as a result of the call for assistance. In cases where the student calls for themselves, they will be documented and remain qualified for the amnesty program. Provided the student requiring medical attention agrees to participate in the Blueprint Program, medical amnesty will shield the incident from disciplinary action. Additionally, in these circumstances, students who are on, or have been on, university disciplinary probation for alcohol- or drug-related issues will be protected from the consequences of suspension or expulsion within reason.

It should be noted that a history of alcohol- or drug-related medical transports remains of concern to the University. Any student who becomes a danger to themselves with regard to the use and abuse of these substances may require ongoing medical attention and could disqualify themselves from amnesty for habitual medical transport. Lastly, medical amnesty was created with the safety and security of the student community in mind. Any case where the drug in use or the behaviors surrounding the incident cause heightened safety concerns may be referred by the Director of CS&C to the Dean of Student's Office in addition to the processes indicated in student standards of behavior and code of conduct."

"The University of Illinois at Chicago is committed to maintaining a drug- and alcohol-free environment for its students and employees in compliance with applicable federal, state, and local laws. No one under the age of 21 may possess, sell, or consume alcoholic beverages on any property under UIC's control, including campus housing. Persons of legal drinking age—21 years or older—may possess or consume alcoholic beverages only in areas or at functions specifically designated or approved for such use.

The unlawful or unauthorized possession, use, distribution, dispensation, sale, or manufacture of controlled substances or alcohol is prohibited on University property or as part of any University activity. Students or employees who violate this policy may be disciplined in accordance with University policies, statutes, rules, and regulations up to and including dismissal and referral for criminal prosecution. The University may contact the parents of students under the age of 21 for violations of the student disciplinary policy" (UIC Alcohol and Other Drugs Policy and Resource Guide, 4).

Any individual who accompanies or procures medical assistance for another individual as a result of drug overdose or use of a prescription drug that is a controlled substance.

The University maintains the discretion to refer the individual for appropriate educational intervention(s)."

Although the use or possession of medical marijuana is not permitted on-campus, students on the medical marijuana registry may make a request for other reasonable accommodations with the Disability Services Center.

Have an open container of alcohol in your possession in any unlicensed public place  
Have an open container of alcohol in your possession while driving or riding in a motor vehicle Operate a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol or other drugs  
Knowingly obtaining, possessing, using, or distributing a controlled substance

Any student or guest found to be in violation of local, state, and/or federal law, or who violates the University's guidelines contained herein, will be subject to the UMS Student Conduct Code Process and/or referral to the appropriate authorities for legal action. Student-athletes are also subject to the USM Student-Athlete Code of Conduct.

In order for the bystander and student needing assistance to receive medical amnesty from the University, the bystander seeking assistance must:

- Call 911, Public Safety, Police, Emergency Services, or otherwise contact an other Authorized University Representative based on a reasonable belief that someone, including themselves, is in need of immediate medical assistance;
- Reasonably believe that they were the first person to make the 911 call or a call to Public Safety, Police, Emergency Services, or otherwise contact an other Authorized University Representative and reported that a person needed immediate medical assistance;
- Provide their own name to the 911 operator, Public Safety, Police Emergency Officer, University Staff or other Authorized University Representative;
- Remain with the person needing medical assistance until emergency health care providers have arrived and taken care of the person in need of medical assistance; and
- Comply with post event educational/counseling objectives issued by the Office of Wellness Promotion and/or the Office of Student Conduct.

Students should keep in mind that medical amnesty is not intended to shield or protect students from other violations of the Student Code of Conduct related to the incident, or protect students who repeatedly violate the Student Code of Conduct. Additionally, the University strongly encourages students to report incidents of sexual misconduct. A witness to or individual who experiences sexual misconduct, acting in good faith, who discloses any incident of sexual misconduct to University officials or law enforcement will not be sanctioned under the University's Code of Conduct for violations of alcohol and/or drug use policies occurring at or near the time of incident(s) of sexual misconduct.
