Graduation is a launching pad, not a one-way street to college. There are amazing career paths waiting to be explored, and college isn't the only route to success!

Ready to dive in? Here are some exciting options to consider:

- Skilled Trades: Become a builder, electrician, plumber, or welder! These in-demand fields offer competitive salaries, opportunities for advancement, and the satisfaction of working with your hands.
- Vocational Careers: Pursue a technical program in fields like healthcare, information technology, or cosmetology. Gain valuable skills and enter the workforce quickly.
- Military Service: Consider the structure, discipline, and unique experiences the military offers. You'll develop valuable skills and gain access to educational benefits.
- Paraprofessional Opportunities: Work in healthcare, education, or other fields as a paraprofessional, learning alongside experienced professionals and potentially pursuing further certifications later.

Do your research! Use the <u>Occupational Outlook Handbook</u> to explore careers by salary, education requirements, and growth potential.

But don't stop there! Explore ALL your options, including college.

Finally, consider your passions! This <u>video</u> explores how your interests can connect to careers (ignore the sales pitch at the end). Completing an interest profiler can also be helpful. It's time well spent to understand your strengths and find a path that excites YOU.

Certificate Programs

<u>Mass Bay Community College:</u> offers certificate programs as well as associate degree programs. Certificate programs include many in health sciences, automotive technology, paralegal options, computer technology and many more. Explore their options and attend an open house so you can really get to know all of the opportunities offered.

Minuteman <u>Technical Institute</u>: This is the adult learning arm of Minuteman High School and offers many options for continuing ed/certificate programs that can prepare you for a career. Options include plumbing, machine tool technology, metal fabrication, cosmetology, and much more. This helpful website offers information on career paths for each and salary information.

<u>Bioversity</u> - runs out of Boston and Lowell. Biotech programs. **FREE** 8 week program that partners with MCPHS to prepare you for a career in the growing biotech field. "Built initially by the Massachusetts College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences and adapted by UMass Lowell for the Lowell site after more than 12 months of employer input, focuses on developing learner's technical skills as well as soft skills necessary to succeed and advance in a life sciences career. Graduates of this course will be ready immediately for employment in areas such as lab operations, facilities management, supply chain, environment, health, and safety (EHS) – jobs that have starting salaries wages averaging \$26 hour with benefits.

Mass Transfer

The <u>Mass Transfer program</u> allows students to earn a 2 year Associates Degree at a Community College and a guaranteed transfer to a Massachusetts State University or UMASS Campus if you earn a B average. This is a great way to keep college debt to a minimum and a good option for students who aren't ready to commit to a four year college degree.
