EdPuzzle is a great video editing tool to engage your students while getting formative feedback during the video. Students are held accountable and have to watch the entire video and answer questions during the video - wherever you want them. You can embed the EdPuzzle videos into Canvas and just create the quiz questions there, too. (Thanks, Mr. Alcalá!)
