Basics & Maintenance, Hitting Net replacement & Hitting Bay refresh, Current On Course (#2, #7, #5 planting beds), Maintenance Drone, Maintenance Break Room Tables & Chairs, Maintenance Break Room update Kitchen area, Metfield Flag for Clubhouse.

With the current estimates, this will leave about \$1470 of which \$1000 is set aside for contingency for the above projects.

Becky Tipton moved that we accept the Project List, John Nuttall seconded the motion. The motion was approved.

Basics & Maintenace - Total Cost ~ \$750

- Divot Repair Day & Social
  - Mid April on Maintenance Day, FOD provides lunch, Cost ~\$200
- Holiday Celebration
  - Mid December, Pot Luck FOD provides misc items & meat dish, Cost ~\$150
- Misc Workdays refreshments after work, Cost ~\$200
- Gardening Supplies mulch, weed barrier, etc., Cost ~\$200

Hitting Net Refresh - Cost \$2000

- The nets are showing considerable wear. They have lasted 5 years. It is time to replace them.
- 3 cage nets with baffle + 1 side panel, repaint posts, new hangers for targets
- Replace dirt/mulch with gravel base/pea gravel for less maintenance and cleaner look
- Do work prior to golf season in 2024
- Cost
  - Nets, including tax and shipping ~\$1100
  - o Rock ~4 cubic yards. ~ \$900

On Course Projects for current areas - Total cost \$335

#### 1. #2 Green Area ~\$100

- a. Goal shift to no/minimal maintenance plants
- b. Shift all remaining azaleas into shady area on the north side near cart path, replace with Pampas grass that is currently place near drain (~8 plants). Move them in line with other grasses in the sun.
- c. Azaleas may need some watering in June August for one year.
- d. Seasonal bushwacking behind grasses (Maintenance)
- e. Do work in as soon as soil unfreezes in Spring
- f. Cost ~\$100 for fertilizer and mulch for new replanted items

#### 2. #5 Planting Bed ~ Cost \$35

- a. Annually trim and apply mulch
  - i. Trimming & weed whacking 3 times during the year
  - ii. 10 bags of much @3.50 = \$35
- 3. #7 Green Area ~0-\$200
  - a. Goal reduce size of plantings, change to low maintenance plants, reduce grass growing in planting area
  - b. Reduce size of planting area and use pampas grass as dividing barrier
    - i. Mark out area 6-8' wide at front of planting area, Kill the grass in this area
    - ii. Dig up daffodils and canna lilly bulbs that are currently further back and replant.Dig up 1 pampas grass and 1 other bush and relocate ~3' from wall
    - iii. Supplement with additional midsize pampas grass across the area

- iv. Place landscape fabric and mulch between the bulbs and the pampas grass. Maintenance will mow the area behind the grass
- Cost ~\$200 for bulbs and mulch, grass can be harvested from the course or donation

### **New Proposals**

New Staff Maintenance Request Proposals

- 1. Drone Cost \$800
  - a. Use to get a better view of areas, especially after floods, drainage or other issues
- 2. Break Area Tables and Chairs \$2940

The team has been trying to get funding for a number of years to get funding for an upgrade to the break area, to no avail. Most of the furniture is from when the course was first built (and probably hand me downs then).

- 14 chairs (\$130+tax) \$2090
- 2 72" round tables \$850
- 3. Break Area Kitchen Setup & Tankless Hot Water \$1470
  - Stainless steel kitchen setup tankless hot water \$1070
  - Another option is some cabinets and a long counter at about the same price
  - Misc. Items \$400

#8 /9 Tree Replacement \$800 - \$2400

- a. Donate funds for large trees to replace some that were taken down due to disease
- b. \$800 each for trees of significant size
- c. Select varieties that provide seasonal color
- 2. Club House purchase additional outdoor seating (TBD)
- 3. New Flag for Clubhouse \$200

Install a flag pole near the clubhouse

Assistance with #16 garden left of cart path
