By Air and Sea

1. From Manila to Romblon:

Option 1: Manila to Tablas Island

Fly: Take a direct flight from Manila (Ninoy Aquino International Airport) to Tablas Island (Tugdan Airport) with Philippine Airlines or Cebu Pacific. 2. From Cebu to Romblon:

Fly: There are no direct flights from Cebu to Romblon, but you can fly to Caticlan (Boracay) and then take a ferry from Caticlan to Romblon.

Ferry: Another option is to take a direct ferry from Cebu to Romblon, operated by companies like 2Go Travel. The ferry ride takes about 20 to 22 hours.

By Land and Sea

1. From Boracay to Romblon:

Ferry: Take a ferry from Caticlan Port (near Boracay) to Odiongan Port on Tablas Island, then transfer to a boat heading to Romblon Island.

2. From Iloilo to Romblon:

Ferry: Take a ferry from Iloilo City to Caticlan, and then follow the route from Caticlan to Romblon.

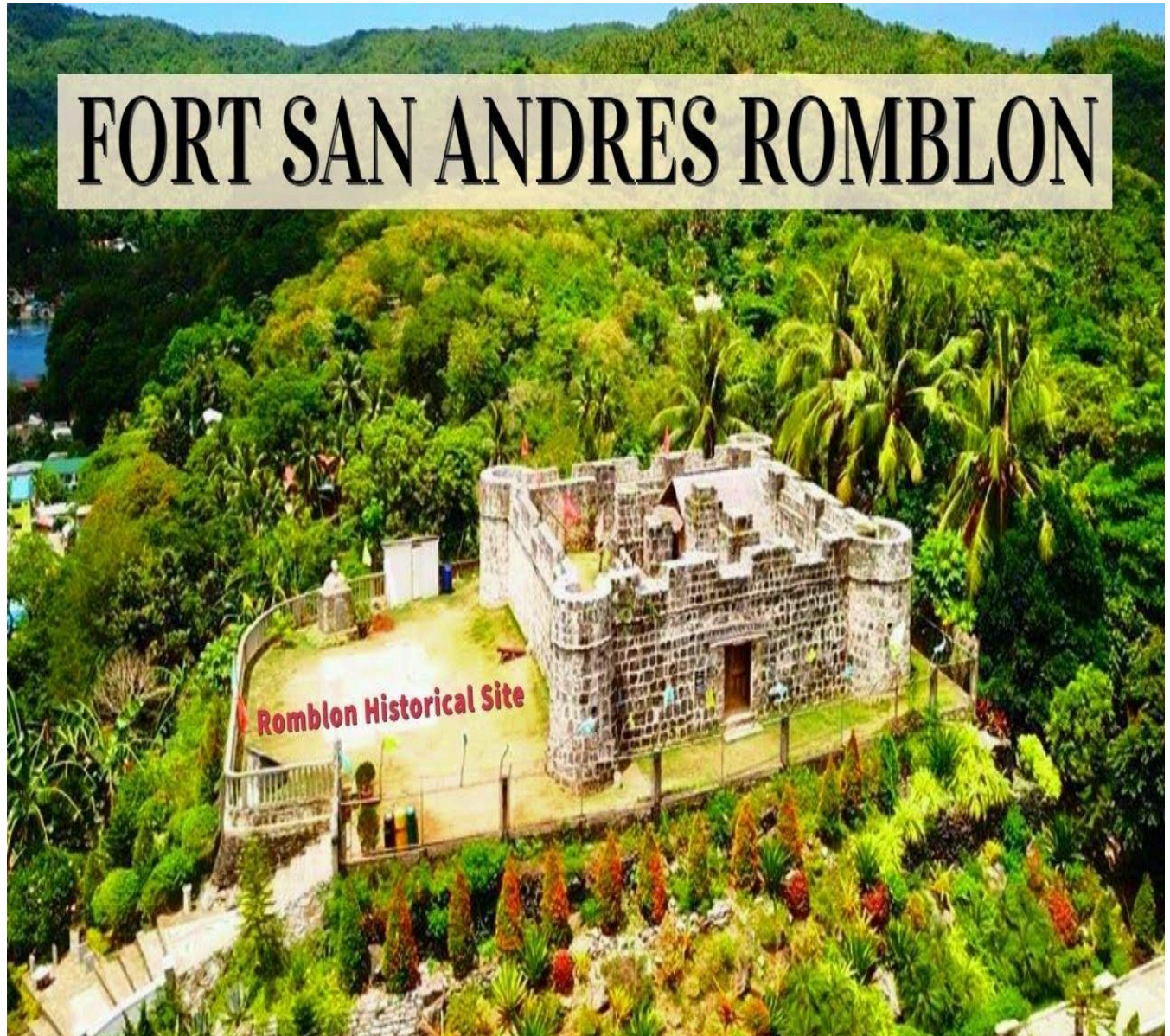
