CBWP-Related Updates

CREP - OWRD and USDA are finalizing the language of the Agreement between Oregon and USDA. A scoping meeting was held in Burns and by Zoom on August 10 to get input on the alternatives being considered and the issues needed to be considered in the development of a Programmatic Environmental Assessment (PEA). A draft is expected to be shared with OWRD and FSA in the near future and made public through a formal release by FSA for a 30-day comment period. A brochure on the PEA process and requirement was provided at the Collaborative meeting. Once a draft is available it will take some 4 months to develop a Final PEA and findings for FSA to consider.

USGS Groundwater Study Summary Document - A 6-page summary on the study’s approach, results, and implications available now.

OWRD Groundwater Study Summary Documents - OWRD is developing summary materials on what was learned from the groundwater study.

CBWP Groundwater Portion of the Integrated Water Plan - The Groundwater Plan has been submitted to the Interagency Plan Review Team. Project staff is in the midst of scheduling a presentation for the Plan Review Team and the County Court; the presentation will orient folks on the Groundwater Plan and provide an opportunity for project staff to discuss the process and next steps. The Coordinating Committee is developing a process for the public comment period, which will likely open sometime in October.


Surface Water Kick-Off | Pre-Planning Step


Holly Mondo (CBWP Project Manager) first gave an overview of place-based planning and the Harney CBWP Collaborative’s process to date to help get new Collaborative members up to

speed on the task(s) at hand. For those new members that would like a full rundown of place-based planning, please click here for OWRD’s guidelines.

Before diving deep into the surface water planning phase, the project team (project manager, facilitator, technical consultant) felt it necessary to ask a few questions to get folks grounded into the process. The first question posed was: *What are your worst fears about surface water planning?* In summary, Collaborative members fear more regulation in the basin, that we’ll undergo this process and our plan will “sit on the shelf,” that the situation in the basin will get worse instead of improve, more lawsuits will occur, we won’t be able to come together and come up with solutions, the plan we come up won’t consider economics, the plan won’t be flexible/adaptable, and lastly that surface water users will get polarized against other surface water users.

The Collaborative then transitioned to a [JamBoard](#) session where they brainstormed the other questions asked. Screenshots of the JamBoard session can be found below. Note: text size/box size doesn’t denote importance - all ideas are considered equally.





The project team will refer back to these ideas to 1) help create a robust surface water planning phase process, 2) help scope the process, and 3) keep the Collaborative on track.

Surface Water Kick-Off | Creating a Robust Process

Holly then went through a [process proposal](#), created with input from the Coordinating Committee, for the surface water planning phase.

Feedback from the Collaborative included the following:

- 18-month process is achievable
- Make sure to align with other work ongoing in the Basin
- Perhaps have OWRD give a presentation on surface water in the basin to help build a shared understanding - can plan for this in October
- Consider holding 2-hour meetings instead of 3-hour meetings
- Consider hosting 30-minute community meetings outside of Burns/Hines to inform the broader community of the surface water planning phase

Questions project staff will consider:

- What Working Groups do we need? Are we going to reconvene previous Working Groups? Who will be the “leader” of each Working Group?
- How are we going to continue moving the groundwater plan forward while working on surface water planning? Consider giving community presentations on the groundwater plan in areas outside of Burns/Hines.
- How can we improve the consensus process for the surface water planning phase? Is eligibility going to be the same (i.e. signatory of Working Agreement and attended 2 out of last 4 meetings)?

The process proposal is a living document and will be used as the baseline for the surface water planning phase. We'll do our best to stick to the timelines, but can be flexible.
