How do likes and hobbies work if love is frowned upon?	<i>Characters may have drive but lack passion. Drive = determination to achieve a goal/outcome and may be fueled by responsibility, recognition or other rewards. Passion = a strong emotional connection / enthusiasm towards an activity, goal, or interest. For example, people may have goals/ambitions, such as people who want to study law or medicine for the prestige rather than because they have a love for it or find it personally meaningful.</i>
