The **ASVAB** is an excellent Career Exploration test that will help students link their skills & aptitudes with related occupations. It is a multi-aptitude test battery that helps in identifying different skills and competencies which consists of eight short individual tests covering General Science, Arithmetic Reasoning, Word Knowledge, Paragraph Comprehension, Mathematics Knowledge, Electronics Information, Auto and Shop information, and Mechanical Comprehension. Not only do you receive scores on each of these individual tests, you also receive the results combined to yield three career exploration scores: Verbal Skills, Math Skills, and Science and Technical Skills. The **ASVAB** test results provide a snapshot of current knowledge and skills. These scores can be compared with the educational or job requirements for occupations of interest to students. Taking the **ASVAB** is in no way a commitment to join the military, and the scores will not be shared with any recruiters.

The **ASVAB** test is a requirement for entrance into the military, but anyone can take it for career identification purposes without obligation to the armed services. It will be administered to B-CC H.S. students **FREE** of charge.
