Teacher Expectations:

- FIRST DRAFT: Teachers should send the first draft to HOSs at least 10 days prior to the administration date. HOSs will respond with feedback within 48 hours.
- The teacher should send the FINAL VERSION along with the answer key back to HOS 6 days prior to the administration date. HOSs will respond with feedback within 48 hours.
- The cover sheet below must be completed and attached to all UNIT TEST.
- SEN STUDENTS WHO RECEIVE PULL OUT SESSIONS: The HOS, teacher, SENDCO, and LST should make the
 necessary modifications collaboratively. FIRST DRAFT: Teachers should send the first draft to HOSs, SENCO and
 LST at least 10 days prior to the administration date. HOSs/SENCO/LST will respond with feedback. The teacher then
 should send the final version along with the answer key back to the HOS, SENCO and LST 6 days prior to the
 administration date. HOSs will respond with feedback within 48 hours.

- Print is available and requires 5 days notice.
- Non Core Subjects in grades 1-12 including Art, Music, French, Digital Literacy, PE, STEM and Moral Education should use alternative approaches to assessment, not UNIT TEST, when appropriate. The same process outlined in this policy should be adhered to but the submitted material should be an alternative assessment with a clearly defined rubric aligned to curriculum standards with DOK leveled diversity. Non core subjects include grade 1-12 including social studies and high school electives should seek alternative means of assessment when appropriate.

Unit Test DOK Framework:

Depth of knowledge (DOK) refers to the level of understanding required to answer a question or perform an activity. The DOK model ensures that the complexity of assessments align with standards being assessed. When assessment follows the DOK framework, students are given a series of increasingly difficult tasks that gradually demonstrate that they are meeting expectations and allow assessors to evaluate their comprehensive depth of knowledge.

The assessment tasks are designed to capture the full scope of proficiency required to satisfy a standard, from the most basic to most complex and abstract units of knowledge and skill. That means that an assessment should include tasks from level 1 through 4—Webb identified four distinct depths of knowledge—and not too much of any one type of task. Assessment, just as the learning that precedes it, should be diversified and varied.
