If you're trick or treating – you could reuse large plastic containers for the children to collect their goodies (and get them to help decorate them), or make cloth reusable ones from old sheets or surplus fabric.

Are you planning a party?

Decorations – ask for themed items on Freegle and offer any you have left over.

Make your own – reuse jars and candle stubs (light them for the shortest time), cardboard tubes for articulated spider legs with jar lid for body, large cardboard box tombstone.... There are lots of ideas out there, and we'd love to see your creations!

Don't have enough crockery, cups or cutlery? We all hate plastic, so just ask for some on Freegle, embrace your new eclectic collection, and you can always re-offer anything that you don't need afterwards.

As with all family/friends get-togethers and parties, celebrate with mismatched crockery, cutlery and cups and avoid plastic! You can ask for some extras on Freegle if you need them, and re-freegle them afterwards if you no longer need them.

PLEASE, PLEASE, don't forget to check there are no hedgehogs or other living creatures in or beneath your bonfire before lighting it!

If possible don't build your bonfire until the day, that way it is unlikely any creatures will inhabit it before you light it.

Disposal: Put as little as possible in general waste bins and make sure everything is properly disposed of – we own the items, so it's our responsibility to ensure proper end of life arrangements for them!

Bank Holiday

Avoid the tip this bank holiday weekend

With an extra day off it's tempting to gather up loads of items, put them in the boot of your car and dump them at the tip. It's all rubbish isn't it? Maybe, but take a closer look and think about other uses for them - you're now looking at a valuable resource.

Here are a few ideas of what to look for.

Old towels and blankets - maybe a local animal rescue centre could use these.

Bulk small items together: 30 plastic plant pots, a couple of old planters, some wire and an offcut of fencing - all collected by a grateful gardener who was starting up an allotment.

Put similar items together: A lockable child proof box and toy boxes were collected by a freegler who was about to start fostering children.

It doesn't have to be big: A rotary washing line spike that didn't fit was collected and installed on the same day complete with drying clothes. Both freeglers were delighted.

Is it broken? Great, that's a good thing. There are plenty of freeglers who love to mend items or upcycle them into something completely different. So offer your broken washing machine, printer, jam jars, garden fencing, bricks and more!

We'll be freegling this weekend, why don't you too - have a great time!

Keep Safe

We feel this might be a good time for a reminder about your personal safety on this group. Freegle is a friendly place, but we all have to stay on the safe side, so:

- Avoid posting full postcodes, addresses or phone numbers on the public list. Save these for private messages.
- It's OK to communicate with other members by messaging only and not giving out your phone number. Please be understanding if someone requests this of you.
- If you're concerned about meeting people at your house, you can arrange to meet away from your home to pass on items (where practical), or make sure that people come round when you have a friend or relative with you.
- If you're delivering or collecting something from someone's house, please remember they are a stranger; take all of your usual reasonable precautions when meeting someone for the first time and don't assume a 'friendship' just because you have exchanged a few messages.
- People collecting from you need to be safe too, so make sure your property is physically safe, as we all have a duty of care towards others.

Remember if anything about a Freegle contact concerns you, even if it's just vague "bad vibes", then feel free to trust your instincts!

You can give items to whoever you choose, you are under no obligation to divulge phone numbers or social networking contacts, and you don't have to justify your decision to anyone. Please let our team know if you have any concerns.

Above all keep safe and keep freegling.

a/ describe an item being offered as accurately as possible and add a photo if you can; this gives anyone interested a better idea as to whether it is what they want or not

b/ mark an item as Taken (or Received if you have posted a request) as soon as possible; please do not leave it until next time you have another item to post

c/ if you enquire about an item, please let the other person know if it is not what you are looking for, rather than leave them to wonder if you will come back to confirm collection or not

d/ if you have arranged a date and time to collect an item and then need to change this, or have changed your mind, please let them know – we all hate No-Shows!

Can we remind everyone that we ask all members to deal with other members politely, as you would wish to be treated yourself and help build a friendly community.
