New Business

- 1. School Update: General Activities/School Development (John/Val)
 - Remembrance Assembly: Thursday, Nov 10 (third of the year) led by Mr. Miller and the grade 6 classes.
 - Term One Reports: Tuesday, Nov 29
 - PL Day: Monday, Nov 14 ½ day for teacher PL (self-directed around growth plans and ½ report card writing 5 PL days/year).
 - November is Fall Reading Challenge

- Janeway Jamarama raised \$456.
- Christmas Sharing Fundraising donations (gift cards or money) Ms. Greely to put a tree up in the lobby during parent teacher night (gift cards or gifts welcomed).

2. Update on Playground (John)

- Swings (22 week lead time expected delivery in October) delayed until March due to supply chain issues.
- Kindergarten area wire wheel spools were added but needed to be removed due to poor condition (consider a way to permanently attach to the playground in the future).
- Playground issue used by the community and people are not picking up after their dogs. A friendly reminder was sent out to parents. May consider signage to encourage clean up. The school does not want to lock the gates as other groups in the community use the area.
- Outdoor classroom discussions are ongoing following a visit to Colliers (wooded natural forest environment). Conversations with John Hannon from facilities confirmed a gated fence to outside our grounds is not an option. Consider adding something down by the Kindergarten planters, moving large rocks from the front (town has agreed to support).

3. Fundraising Discussion (John/all)

- Chrome books still awaiting delivery (supply chain issue).
- Discussions with IT confirmed that the only other option to Chrome books would be a standard PC desktop.
- Further fundraising discussions will be held until the New Year.
- Teachers Appreciation Day: Mind February (parent members to regroup separately).

4. Christmas Concert (Kris)

- Grade 2 and 3 matinee and evening concert: December 13th (alternate date: Dec 14th).
- Preliminary conversations about tickets for the evening program (3-4/tickets made available/per family at a cost of \$5/ticket).
- Matinee program will welcome families including those with younger children encouraged to attend.
- Money raised will be used for the music program (mechanically raised screen for assemblies, headset headphones, other).
- Mr. Barrington will communicate with families once details are confirmed
