3.TABLES AND FIGURE




Fig. 1. A figure caption is always placed below the illustration. Short captions are centered, while long ones are justified. The macro button chooses the correct format automatically.

Tables should only be used to improve conciseness or when the information cannot be given satisfactorily in graphs. Tables and figures should be numbered serially and referred to in the text by a number (Table 1, Fig. 1 etc.). Each table and graph should have a caption which should be concise and self-explanatory. The caption for tables should appear on top while the caption for figures should

appear at the bottom. Statistical significance if applicable, should be clearly stated in the captions of each table or figure.
