APPENDIX A: Community Outreach Report

Please see below for my report from the Nov 20 Ward Council meeting, which I attended on Dovercourt SAC's behalf.

In light of some of the discussion at Ward Council (relayed to Deb last week), perhaps co-Chairs could consider briefly highlighting the two key takeaways from the Ward meeting, as they'd likely inform the School Improvement Plan and Fundraising agenda items. I could then speak to the other elements of my report later in the meeting as planned?

For the rest of the group, the two key takeaways from Ward Council are:

- Trustee Alexis Dawson and Executive Superintendent Jack Nigro repeatedly emphasised the need for SACs to prioritize plans/activities with their school principal's School Improvement Plan.
 - o During a group Q&A portion of the meeting, I indicated DPS SAC is having a discussion with Caitland on this on Dec 4th (they really appreciated learning this).
- Executive Superintendent Nigro (not the Trustee) voiced some mild criticisms over how SACs approach fundraising, in that, writ-large, SAC's tend to focus too heavily on fundraising for "fundraising's sake," as fundraising objectives need to align with advancing student achievement and learning.
 - o Pretty sure our fundraising aims for these objectives anyhow (we ROCK in this area) but good to discuss.

- o A couple Ward reps present did not receive these comments well. I stayed silent as I wanted to take away and discuss with everyone first.
- o The Education Act (Regulation on School Councils
 - https://www.ontario.ca/laws/regulation/000612) states:

[FUNDRAISING]

- 22. (1) Subject to subsection (2), a school council may engage in fundraising activities. .
- (2) A school council shall not engage in fundraising activities unless,
- (a) the activities are conducted in accordance with any applicable policies established by the board; and
- (b) the activities are to raise funds for a purpose approved by the board or authorized by any applicable policies established by the board.
- (3) A school council shall ensure that the funds raised by it are used in accordance with any applicable policies established by the board.

- TDSB Mobile Device Policy still open for public comment until Dec 10

- There are TDSB efforts to ensure staff from junior schools and feeder high schools are coordinating curriculum (to help ensure smoother transition to high school)
- We are encouraged to invite a Superintendent to speak at a SAC meeting (our SI is John Currie)
- New approaches to "Mental Math" being implemented in TDSB schools number sense, new ways of solving problems
- Anyone can attend Trustee Committee meetings / anyone can register a delegation to speak at a Trustee Committee Meeting (if we have anything we'd like to raise).
- SACs can really make a difference in parent engagement through supporting kids' learning "at home"
