

# **Intercultural Integration: A Shared Journey towards Equality and Belonging**

**EU-BELONG Transnational Knowledge Sharing Event  
19-21 March, Letterkenny (Ireland)**

At its core, the intercultural approach, as developed by the Council of Europe's Intercultural Cities Programme, transcends traditional integration models. It is indeed a participatory democracy framework seeking genuine equality, celebrating diversity, fostering meaningful interactions within regions, and encouraging civic participation for all.

The intercultural approach recognises that every individual plays a role in building a cohesive and inclusive society. This means that integration is fundamentally a shared responsibility, applicable not only to newcomers but to every member of a society undergoing demographic shifts. In this paradigm, integration is an ongoing, collective effort to create a harmonious coexistence in a changing societal landscape.

In terms of implementation, the intercultural approach transforms integration from a one-sided event to an ongoing process of mutual adaptation and growth for all inhabitants. In this context regions, have a crucial role to play as enablers and facilitators of multistakeholder collaborations, as well as in the mainstreaming of the intercultural approach across policies.

This is how the EU-Belong project is pioneering the field of inclusion & integration: by using the intercultural approach to innovate regional policymaking. In this change-making space international peer learning between policymakers -both politicians and civil servants- as well as their local partners involved in different dimensions of intercultural integration, is crucial.

## **Knowledge Sharing event in Donegal**

**The EU-Belong knowledge sharing event will be hosted by Donegal (Ireland) on 19-21 March 2024**, on the occasion of the One Donegal Social Inclusion Week.

One Donegal Social Inclusion Week is coordinated by Donegal County Council and aims to highlight the very positive work being done, not only by the Council, but also by other statutory and community organisations in attempting to raise awareness of social inclusion related issues in Donegal.

The EU-Belong knowledge sharing event is co-organised by the AER and Donegal County. It will gather international experts, regional politicians and civil servants, professionals and volunteers engaged in creating intercultural societies, to:

- Learn in detail about the policies and practices employed in Donegal for intercultural integration.
- Meet peers working on similar challenges in different regions across Europe

- Engage in mutual learning, get inspired by each other's experiences and insights, create sounding boards, spaces for reflexivity and continuously improve policies and practices.
- Showcase regional initiatives: Feature speakers from Donegal and EU-Belong regions sharing approaches to building inclusive and intercultural communities.
- Highlight the principles of interculturalism and their translation in real life: Emphasise core principles such as equality, the diversity advantage, meaningful interaction, and active citizenship.
