Computer Science

NWAESC will host the All-State Coding regional competition on Feb. 12th for the district within our CO-OP. You will receive more detail regarding this event as soon as they are made public.

TALENTS (Novice Teachers)

- A survey was sent to all novice teachers and building administrators. We heard from 200 of the 300 novices in the region and 57 of the 106 buildings containing those novice teachers.
 - Results are provided in a separate document, but please consider encouraging your principals to send their novices to the half-day forums being provided by the TALENTS program. These are led by specialists in the field who are NOT associated with any district.
 - o One respondent who replied that s/he did not attend because her principal had said the sessions were not mandatory, went on to write in two different places about his/her need for more ELA trainings. TALENTS offered K-2, 3-5, 5-8, and 9-12 ELA sessions that specifically targeted classroom instruction and management topics as well as providing time for sharing, questions, etc. *These sessions are very beneficial to novices*.
- Jan. 19 TESS Law & Process was held for new hires who have not had this 3-hour introduction. If you
 have novices who still need this training, please email Marcia. If there is sufficient need, an additional
 session will be held.
- Jan. 31 8:30 3:00 Solution Tree's John Wink will show district and building administrators how to build
 a culture of support for their novices that will also enhance the professional growth of more experienced
 teachers and lead to improved student achievement as all staff work together to ensure the success of their
 colleagues/peers and students. No cost to districts ALL costs are being underwritten by the TALENTS
