We still need to figure out what the limitations of the tax credit account is. In addition, we will keep a running list of possible expenditures for the tax credit funds. Dr. Michael talked about the amphitheatre area and how students continue to leave a mess. Ms. Bollhoffer mentioned how we can make modifications to that area so it becomes an academic area where students can complete assignments and other tasks.

Dr. Michael discussed how tardies have been an issue on campus lately. Students arriving late to school and some students being tardy throughout the day. Ms. Hain discussed the possibility of using robocalls to consistently inform parents of their students' tardies. Additionally, providing more parent communication and opening more gates in the morning to increase student traffic flow onto campus.

- **DC Trip**

Ms. Bollhoffer introduced the possibilities of going on an 8th grade trip to Washington DC. She let the group know what the costs will be and different package options. A 4-day trip is \$1899 and a 5-day trip is \$2079. However, the group felt the 5-day trip was a better option, since it offers more locations for students to visit. If students take this trip during spring break, then tax credit funds can be used. If this trip is taken after the school year ends, unfortunately tax credit funds cannot be used, per district direction.

- **After Club Bus**

Ms. Bollhoffer brought up the question of using tax credit for an after school bus for students attending clubs. We discussed the challenges that might come up in using tax credit for this item. Someone suggested using one of the white buses, and Ms. Bollhoffer stated she would consider it.

Ms. Hain discussed some issues with the bike rack and how it has been closed after school several times. We discussed some solutions. Ms. Hain also filled us in on the McDowell Mountain Trip for 7th graders.

Ms. Fadeley brought up some of the dangers associated with drop offs in the mornings. Students as well as staff members being cautious when they cross, and preferably use the crosswalk to avoid speeding vehicles. It was added that cones separating lanes might be beneficial.

Ms. Fadeley also discussed the possibility of using grants to pay for the DC trip. Ms. Bollhoffer added some of the options families will have to help pay for the trip (if it is approved)
