- *Consideration will be given only for courses that have vacant seats and/or no waitlist and **will begin at the end of the second week of classes** to assess enrollment availability, per university policy.*
- *Please do not ask instructors to add you to their bcourses while you wait for approval; they are not permitted to do so until you have been officially enrolled. If you are awaiting approval for a course that has open seats, you may sit in on class with permission from the instructor.*
- *Though we cannot guarantee enrollment, we do our best to accommodate your requests provided that all requirements and approvals are met.*
