The purpose of this is to instill discipline, teamwork, sportsmanship, honesty and integrity in a highly specialized activity. CHSAA Speech and Debate coaches teach their participants to respect the activity's core values, work hard and compete honestly.

CHSAA Speech and Debate Inclusion Statement:

The CHSAA Speech and Debate community believes inclusion is vital to our community. We are committed to providing a safe and equitable learning and competitive environment that fosters a mindset of empathy, respect, and belonging for all involved in Speech and Debate, including, but not limited to, students, coaches, judges and community members. We honor differences including races and cultures, genders and sexual orientations, abilities and aspirations, identities and affiliations, socioeconomics and worldviews. Embracing our diversity prepares our community to thrive. Individuals found to have violated this policy will be subject to the full range of sanctions, up to and including removal from the tournament premises.

CHSAA Speech Organization:

Philosophy: CHSAA seeks to provide a positive competitive speech experience for Colorado high school students by

- Supporting a state-wide competitive speech program to provide students with the opportunity to develop and to perfect communication skills
- Supporting education and development of coaches
- Supporting the education and development of speech judges
- Creating a competitive environment governed by sportsmanship and fair play
- Developing rules and regulations to create a common ground for the running of tournaments
- Organizing state competitions
- Providing information and resources designed to make speech programs more effective

Table of Organization:

CHSAA operates three different classifications for Speech and Debate, each of which will hold a state championship competition (3A/4A/5A). Each fall, CHSAA will post online the Current Season Bulletin, which lists all schools by classification. Any school may petition CHSAA to enroll in a division different than the one that matches their school enrollment. To do so, the school's athletic/activities director must notify CHSAA in the spring of the year of their intention to do so the following year.

CHSAA Speech Chain of Command:

- CHSAA is governed by the **Legislative Council**, which must approve any changes in rules or procedures. Any proposed changes must be presented to the Legislative Council at their April meeting; and if approved, those changes become effective the following school year.
- The **CHSAA Assistant Commissioner** who administers speech is Rashaan Davis. He is the commissioner in charge of CHSAA speech activities in the state of Colorado. His Coordinator of Activities is Marisa Tenorio.
- The **Speech Activities Committee** is the representative body that proposes and passes rule changes to be presented to the Legislative Council. This committee is appointed by CHSAA. While every attempt is made to provide each region with a representative, that is not always possible. Members are appointed to a three-year term. In order to be considered, interested coaches must have their principals submit their names to CHSAA by April of the year prior to when they wish to replace an outgoing committee member. This committee meets in March

once all three state competitions have been concluded so that their new proposals can be taken to the Legislative Council for approval. When called upon, the committee also convenes at the fall speech conference and/or during the summer.

- **The State Tournament Chair** is selected by the CHSAA Assistant Commissioner with input in the form of nominations from the State Speech Committee/Coaches. The chair is selected for a two-year term. The first year he/she serves as co-chair and the second year he/she acts as State Tournament Chair. This assures that the chair will always have experience in running the State Tournament. Those who are nominated need not be members of the State Speech Committee. Coaches who are interested in serving should let a member of the State Speech Committee know that they would like to be nominated.

CHSAA believes that serving in any of these positions is a learning experience and therefore, believes that the opportunity to serve should be shared. To give as many people as possible a chance to serve, when possible, no committee member can continue for a second consecutive term.

To ensure an adequate judging pool for the State Tournaments, no invitational tournament may be held in the same geographic region on the same weekend as the 3A, 4A, or 5A State Tournaments. Invitational tournaments on the same weekend as these State Tournaments in a different geographic region than the one where the tournament is being held are subject to approval by the CHSAA.

CHSAA Bylaws:

ARTICLE 51: SPEECH & DEBATE

5100. GENERAL ELIGIBILITY APPLIES

5100.1 A student shall be eligible to represent their school in speech activities sanctioned by the CHSAA if such student meets the following requirements:

CHSAA Bylaws 1720 (Stricter Standards), 1720b (Conduct), 1790 (Co-op Programs), with the requirement that during the period of participation the student must be enrolled in courses that offer in aggregate a minimum of 2.5 Academic units per semester, shall apply to students participating in speech.

Q1: What are some of the CHSAA rules that do not apply to speech students?

A1: Transfer, semesters, amateur, seasons, age, scrimmages, physical exam, Sunday contact, practice and previous semester academic standards.

5100.2 NOT REQUIRED — Schools are not required to include the names of speech participants on semester eligibility lists submitted to CHSAA. Schools are required to enter speech participants onto rosters in the CHSAA electronic platform.

5110. SPEECH & DEBATE SEASON

The competitive season shall be from October 1 (Novice/3A Varsity) and November 1 (4A/5A Varsity) until the completion of the March state tournament, exclusive of the National Speech and Debate Association.

EXCEPTION: An individual student or team may represent a member school in a contest(s) outside the competitive speech season in recognized national events and with written permission from the school's principal and the CHSAA office. NSDA Qualifying events and National Tournament do not need approval from the CHSAA office.

5120. MAXIMUM MEETS STUDENT

A student may be represented at no more than 22 meets a year, during the competitive season, exclusive of regional, state and National Speech and Debate qualifying events and National Speech and Debate Association Tournament.

5130. AWARDS

No school or representative of a school shall be allowed to give or to receive a speech award for debate or individual events the value of which exceeds \$20.00 (excluding engraving). Existing traveling trophies are exempt from this rule until they are retired. This rule is exclusive of league, state qualifying, state festival, state tournaments and National Speech and Debate Association qualifying contests.

Major Changes for 2025-2026 School Year:

Dates for State Tournaments:

3A Tournament	Pueblo Central	February 6 - 7, 2026
4A Tournament	Pueblo Central	February 27 - 28, 2026
5A Tournament	Cherokee Trail	March 6 - 7, 2026

1. CONGRESSIONAL DEBATE CHANGES:

- Updated legislation submission to include that if more than one piece of legislation is submitted by a school, at least one submission must be available for elimination rounds. If a piece of legislation designated for prelims only is wanted for elimination rounds, the committee will reach out to the coach for permission.
- Replaced PO trial period with PO speech.
- Updated Congressional Debate breaks
- Clarified that the length of the session is 3-3½ hours and should be lengthened if necessary to ensure a minimum of 10 minutes per competitor.
- Created a Best Legislation Award. All student legislation that is selected for a preliminary or elimination round docket will be eligible for the award. Each State Tournament Committee will have the ability to choose if the award winner is determined by coaches or by student vote.
- Updated procedure for determining speaker precedence and questioning recency in preliminary rounds: Speaker Precedence will be randomly generated for Preliminary Session One and Preliminary Session Two will have the reverse speaker order from Session One. Questioning Recency will be randomly generated for each preliminary session independently of Speaker Precedence.

2. EVENTS CHANGES:

- Works cited page must be submitted with a copy of Original Oratory (previously only required for Informative Speaking).
- Ballots will include an RFD box with comments that will be visible to all competitors in the round.
- Clarified that electronic retrieval devices can be used during extemp prep but cannot be used for notes while speaking (rules specify that speaker may use one note card while speaking).
- Add a fourth preliminary round for events and drop the worst (highest) unadjusted rank from preliminary rounds. Tournament entry fees will be increased by \$5 per student to cover additional judge costs.
- 3A ONLY - Impromptu rules changed to align with NSDA Rules for Impromptu Speaking.

3. GENERAL CHANGES:

- Timing rules clarified to include an option for students to self-time with a judge timer as the official time.
- Updated grievance chart to include penalty options for violating published CHSAA rules (previously listed disqualification as the only penalty for violating a rule).
- Entries can be added to the State Tournament until the scheduling meeting. Each add will be subject to the entry fee plus a \$25 late fee.
- Clarification in handbook: Preliminary rounds will have one judge. Advancement rounds will have a three judge panel.
- Clarification in handbook: Schools will not be able to compete in a different classification due to inclement weather or other factors.

4. TEAM AWARDS CHANGES:

- Added points for quarterfinals in events
- Created a tie-breaking procedure for top two overall teams
- A fillable certificate will be available for coaches to download to recognize students who break beyond preliminary rounds but are not top 12 in events or Octafinalists and up in Debate. These students will be recognized at awards as time permits.

ADDITIONAL NOTES:

- Judge training materials will be added to the CHSAA website.
- Schools will compete in the same classification in 2025-26 that they did during 2024-25. Classification determinations for the next cycle (2026-2028) will begin in the Fall of 2025. Please talk to your Athletic Director if you would like to petition to compete in a different classification for the next cycle.

I. **MAJOR CHANGES FROM LAST YEAR'S REPORT:**

- a. The state tournament director will allow adds until the scheduling meeting. Each add will be subject to the entry fee plus a \$25 late fee.

II. **RATIONALE:**

- a. Since it is too late to allow adds on the day of the tournament, the tournament director can accommodate adds up to the scheduling meeting which happens the week of the state tournament.

III. **FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

- a. Increases in finances due to awards, judge pay and food costs for state tournaments.
- b. Raising entry fee by \$5 to offset the cost of additional judges.

V. **INFORMATIONAL ITEMS:**

- a. The CHSAA Speech Activities Committee Meeting was held Monday March 4, 2025 at 9:00 AM via Zoom.
- b. 2025 Tournament Reports
 - 3A:** 21 Teams, 324 Students
 - 4A:** 32 Teams, 351 Students
 - 5A:** 40 Teams, 701 Students
- c. The committee discussed all debate, congressional debate, general state tournament and event proposals.
- d. Committee will gather more feedback on power matching debate from coaches through the State of the State and other avenues.
- e. Voted to send the Congress proposals and other issues to a congress committee for proposals which will be sent to Speech Activities for approval for the 25-26 school year.

- f. There will be a Reason For Decision box added for all competitors (or the ability to make a comment that goes to all competitors in the round) on event ballots.
- g. Electronic retrieval devices are allowed in prep of extemp, but may not be used for notes while speaking.
- h. Add a fourth preliminary round to all events and drop the lowest preliminary rank to determine quarters, semis, finals and results and raise entry fees by \$5 to cover additional judge costs.
- i. Voted to allow students to use a cell phone/timer to self-time. Must clarify that the judge's time is the official time. Clarify that in OO, Info and Extemp, the phone/timer should be on a desk/table not in the student's hand.
- j. Update Grievance Chart for violating published rules: Committee voted to accept the proposal to update the Grievance Chart for violating published rules and refer to the handbook committee for specific wording update.
- k. Debate Judge Training
Judge Training proposal and other issues will be sent to a Judge Training committee for proposal which will be sent to Speech Activities for approval for the 25-26 school year.
- l. A certificate will be available for coaches to download to recognize students who break beyond preliminary rounds but are not Top 12 in events or Octa-finalists and up in Debate. These students will be recognized during the awards presentation at each tournament.
- m. Language will be changed in the Handbook to now say "Preliminary rounds will have one judge. Advancement rounds will have a three judge panel."
- n. Committee discussed inclement weather at state tournaments and voted to refer to the handbook committee to add a statement that schools will not be able to compete at a different classification state tournament due to weather or any other factors to be equitable to all participants.

PARTICIPATION

Each school may enter a maximum of four entries per event. The cost is \$25 per individual entry and \$50 per team entry. Tournament registration will take place at www.speechwire.com.

Judge Requirements:

For the state tournament, schools are required to provide one certified judge for every 5 event and/or Congressional Debate entries (or portion thereof) and one judge for every 2 debate entries (or portion thereof).

If you are interested in judging at any State Tournament, you must judge at one or more invitational meets during this school year and complete the annual certification test.

Judges will be paid by CHSAA at the current rate of judge pay (\$15/round, \$40 bonus for judging 3+ CX and/or waved debate rounds). Scorers and Parliamentarians will be paid for three rounds of judging for each session of Congressional Debate that they judge. In addition, the CHSAA structure for reimbursing for mileage and hotels shall be utilized.

- Mileage and hotel reimbursement will be paid to the party who incurred the expense.

EXCEPTIONS:

Coaches/Assistant Coaches:

The judge certification test is encouraged but not required for coaches and assistant coaches; however, all coaches and assistant coaches must complete the CHSAA Coach Certification Process

Former Competitors/Experienced judges:

The requirement to judge at one or more invitational meets during this school year can be waived for experienced judges and former competitors; however, the judge certification test must be completed. Please reach out to Marisa Tenorio (mtenorio@chsaa.org) to request a waiver.
