

Chapter 1: Living and Working Together

Civics- Students will explore how people live and work together in their community. They'll discuss the rights and responsibilities of school and local community members, the concepts of rules and laws, and how decisions are made through voting.

Chapter 2: Our Community

Geography- Students will explore different types of maps of Florida, identifying key map elements and particular locations in Florida. They will use both maps and globes to locate their own community and key areas, such as the Gulf of Mexico, the Atlantic Ocean, and the state of Florida. Children will describe their own location as well as how the weather and the environment affect the activities people choose to do.

Chapter 3: Our Country and Our State

American History/Civics- Students will investigate the history of the United States and Florida through their founding documents. They will also learn about the symbols, monuments, holidays, and people we routinely celebrate and honor as part of our American culture.

Chapter 4: Past and Present

American History- Students will discover how their own lives have been affected by all that has preceded them. They will compare how parts of their daily life, including school, technology, transportation, and entertainment have changed over time. Children will explore how customs, traditions, cultures, and storytelling help bring us together. They will consider how all these aspects of life have impacted and shaped our lives.

Chapter 5: People and Money

Economics- Students will investigate goods and services and the differences between them. They will learn about the use of trade, bartering, and money in exchange for goods and services. They will explore how people make choices based on limited funds or options. Finally, children will analyze the different kinds of jobs people do and how they've changed over time.
