

The last home game and the final game of the season, which will take place after the league has already decided on its second consecutive win, was a good opportunity to send veteran players by celebrating their second consecutive win. However, Park's answer was "no." "He didn't seem to want to leave while drawing attention," Hong said. "I accepted it willingly because it was the will of the player."

Ulsan won the league title for the first time in 17 years in 2022, and Lee Ho-Playing coach retirement ceremony was held in the final home game of this season. Park Chu-young, the same playing coach, rejected a similar offer.

Park failed to play for even one second this year. He played in 17 matches for FC Seoul in 2021, but failed to score a goal and moved to Ulsan after the end of that year. He played in six matches in 2022, and recorded two shots and two fouls in Ulsan. "Park Joo-young led a good atmosphere while training with his juniors," Hong said. "He played a really good role as a bridge between the team and the coaching staff, which contributed greatly to his second consecutive loss." [토토사이트 모음](#)

In 12 seasons in the K-League, Park has played in 285 matches with 76 goals and 23 assists. He has just one left in 100 attack points. While playing in Seoul, he spent seven years with AS Monaco, Arsenal, Celta Vigo, Watford FC and Al-Shabaab before making his comeback to Seoul in 2015. He was selected as the representative of the Asian Games by Coach Hong Myung-bo in 2010 after controversy over his avoidance of military service, and later won the bronze medal at the London Olympics again in 2012 at the invitation of Coach Hong. He selected Park as a wild card player in both the Asian Games and Olympics. Despite immense controversy, Hong supported Park.

It has yet to be decided which role Park will take next year. It will be either to coach Park as she is or to coach her professional career after quitting "quietly" as a player. "I have yet to announce what I want to do next year," Hong said. "The most important thing is what I want to do. I will respect my will and decide what I will do next year."

Park was a truly remarkable striker who shook the Korean soccer community in the early and mid-2000s. His accurate judgment and brilliant dribbling made the opposing players fall down like autumn leaves, and the goalkeeper couldn't move at all. His skills and skills were outstanding enough to be nicknamed a "football genius." He seemed to be somewhat passive but even evasive in front of the media.

"Will we be able to see Park Chu-young again next year? If we do, where will we meet often? On the ground or on the bench? I don't think many fans want huge superstars to be forgotten quietly without their retirement ceremony."
