Representative Eddie Speaks to Press at Press Conference in Response to Recent Events in Congress and Northern Atlantic Commonwealth

HONESDALE, AC - Numerous press outlets gathered for a scheduled conference at AC-3 Representative PhlebotinumEddie's new district headquarters office to address recent events. The

Representative arrived to address the room promptly on schedule; the Times transcribed his address to the press:

"Greetings all, and thank you for taking the time to come here today. I keep close tabs on events affecting not just my district, but the Atlantic Commonwealth as a whole. I believe, you see, in working to make sure that our fellow Atlanteans are supported by our government. The recent storms in Northern Maine is one such event that is affecting our fellow Atlanteans now. The current system of pleading with Congress for approval before anything can be done stymies our ability to act quickly and provide fast relief independent of the federal government and FEMA. I am not saying we should not rely on federal support at all, but we must act to create an additional layer of support that will allow states to react more quickly when providing disaster relief. That is why I will be working with my colleagues in congress to enact a separate disaster relief fund for every State and Commonwealth within the nation. Details will still need to be hashed out and negotiated, but I envision a fund for each state to have ready for the singular use of disaster relief, invested in annually as a part of our federal budget. I am grateful for our Governor's quick actions to provide relief as well and asking for federal support. I will be traveling there myself this weekend to assess the effects of this storm. It will be the first of many stops I will make around the Atlantic Commonwealth as I begin my campaign running for Atlantic Commonwealth's US Senate seat. I hope that, with our new leadership in Congress, we can work to set up this disaster relief fund as quickly as possible. Thank you for your time everyone. Good health to you all!"

Representative Eddie then quickly departed for areas affected by the disaster in northern Maine. Most notable was his very casual announcement of a second run to be Atlantic Commonwealth's Senator. Notably, he did not indicate which seat he would be running for: incumbent Senator Gunnz's seat in the upcoming midterms, or newly appointed Senator JaquesBoots' seat in the upcoming special election also occurring during midterms.
