### **School Improvement Goals**

### Goal #1: All students will improve reading comprehension skills across the curriculum.

This goal is based on a data analysis of all content areas that improving reading comprehension will benefit all aspects of the students' education.

Essence of the Goal: Comprehension: summarization, prediction, questioning, and clarification.

#### Interventions:

- Students will use and internalize decoding and comprehension strategies to improve their reading ability.(K-5)
- Phonemic Awareness/Alphabetic Principle(K-5)
- All Osceola students in grades 6-12 will improve reading comprehension by using the four core comprehension strategies: Summarization, Clarification, Prediction/Prior Knowledge, and Questioning.(6-12)

- ACT scores
- NSCAS
- Acadience
- MAPS (Measurement of Academic Progress)

### Goal #2: All students will graduate from high school

**Essence of the Goal:** Graduation from high school is the essential function of any PK-12 institution. We believe graduation from high school is needed to become an active citizen in the workplace as well as to prepare every student for their post-secondary goals.

#### Interventions

- All students will attend school every day and be an active participant in the educational process.
- All students will understand the value in being at school every day as a lesson to prepare them for attendance needs in the workplace.
- Perfect attendance awards for students who maintain 95% or greater daily attendance average.

### Assessments used to measure goal:

- Average daily attendance
- Student engagement as measured by teacher and administrative observation.

Graduation Rate for 2020 was 100% and average daily attendance was 96%

### Assessment Data

Nebraska State Accountability (NeSA) test was replaced with the Nebraska Student-Centered Assessment System (NSCAS), pronounced "en-skass," which is a new statewide assessment system that embodies Nebraska's holistic view of students and helps them prepare for success in postsecondary education, career, and civic life. It uses multiple measures throughout the year to provide educators and decision makers at all levels with the insights they need to support student learning and is the assessment system developed by the Nebraska Department of Education given annually each spring. Since this is a new system there is no longitudinal data to compare past years to, only state data.

## **NWEA TESTING**

Maps Testing Data is an Interim assessment piece that the District uses at the local level to analyze student performance and assists the teachers in making instructional decisions to better serve our students. This test is a NRT (Norm Referenced Test measuring student growth over time), versus the NSCAS which is a CRT (Criterion Referenced Test measuring student performance against a fixed set of predetermined criteria or learning standards). This assessment has stayed more stable than the state testing and in the Districts opinion, provides better information than the current NSCAS or NeSA test of the past.
