In today's world, we need to communicate with people who speak different languages in a variety of situations. Learning another language takes effort. As a result, a good way to start a conversation with someone who speaks a different language is to greet them in their native tongue according to the fact that we need [translation](#) in our lives. Let's see how **to say good morning in other** languages.

1- In Afrikaans, say "Good Morning."

"Goeie more" is Afrikaans for "good morning." This is a South African expression. South Africans use this phrase to greet one another. It is a combination of the Dutch words "goeie," meaning "good," and "more," which means "morning."

2- Good Morning in Aklan.

Aklan is also known as Aklanon. It is a language of the Austronesian group. This language is spoken by nearly 460,000 people in the province of Aklan, which is located on the island of Panay in the Philippines. They greet each other with "Mayad nga agahon."

3- Good Morning in Aleut.

Unangam Tunuu (Aleut) is another name for Aleut. It is an Eskimo-Aleut language family member. This language is spoken by Alaskans and residents of the Pribilof Islands. "Qilachxizax" means "good morning" in their language.

4- Good Morning in Albanian.

This is an Indo-European language. This language is spoken by residents of Kosovo, Albania, and other Balkan countries. They say, "Miremengies" when they want to say, "Good morning."

5- Good Morning in Altai

The Turkic language family includes Altai. This language is spoken by people living in Russia's Altai Republic. Morning greetings mean "Aklktu tala" in their language.

6- Good Morning in Alsatian

This language is spoken by nearly 900,000 people in the Alsace region of northeastern France. It is a language of West Germany. "Güete Morge" is used to greet someone in the morning.

7- Good Morning in Arabic

Arabic is spoken by nearly 420 million people worldwide. It is a language of the Semites. It is a vital language in the Muslim World. They greet each other in the morning by saying, "Sabah al Khair."

8- Good Morning in Azerbaijani

Azeri is another name for it. It has about 8.8 million speakers. Azerbaijani is the country's official language. In the morning, they greet each other with the phrase "Sabahnz xeyir."

9- Good Morning in Aramaic

The Aramaic language was created by the Arameans of Syria. This language has been around for 3000 years. "Safro bricho" and "Yasetel liesbukh" are two phrases used in good morning greetings.

10- Good Morning in Armenian

Armenian **is the language that spoken in Indo-European**. This language is spoken by nearly 6.7 million people who live in Armenian communities. They say, "Good morning" with two phrases: "Bari luys" and "Paree looys."

11- Good Morning in Assyrian

This language is also referred to as neo-Aramaic and Syrian. It is a Semitic language. It originated in the Middle East. It is also linked to Hebrew and Arabic. In the morning, they say, "Kedamtookh brikhta."

12- Good Morning in Australian

There is no official language in Australia. Australians speak English in a variety of accents. They say, "G'day, ..." adding the person's name to say "Good morning..."

13- Good Morning in Asturian

This language is spoken by nearly 400,000 people in Asturias and Spain. Asturian is a language spoken in Western Iberia. They greet each other in the morning by saying, "Bonos dies."

14- Good Morning in Assamese

The Assamese language is spoken by approximately 15 million native speakers in Northeast India's Assam. In the morning, they greet each other with "Xuprôbhat."

15- Good Morning in Bengali

Bengali is the world's sixth most commonly spoken language. It is Bangladesh's official language and one of India's main languages. People who speak Bengali greet each other with the phrases "Nomoskar" and "Shu-probhaat" in the morning.

16- Good Morning in Balinese

Balinese people greet each other with the phrase “Rahajeng semeng.” This language belongs to the Malayo-Polynesian family. This language is spoken by about 3.3 million people on the Indonesian islands of Bali, Sulawesi, Sumatra, Java, Lombok, and Nusa Penida.

17- Good Morning in Bashkir

Bashkir is a language that is no longer spoken. It is a Turkic language of the Kipchak branch. Bashkir shares mutual intelligibility with Tatar and Kazak. Bashkir speakers greet each other in the morning with “Xäyyerlye irtye.”

18- Good Morning in Basque

This language is spoken by residents of the Basque Country, French Basque Country, and Navarre in Spain. This language is incomprehensible to speakers of other European languages. Basque speakers greet one another with the phrase “Egun on.”

19- Good Morning in Bhojpuri

This language is spoken by 40 million people in Northern-Eastern India and in the Terai region of Nepal. In the morning, they greet each other with “Raam raam.”

20- Good Morning in Bislama

Bislama is an English-based creole language. This language is spoken on the island of Vanuatu. In the morning, they greet each other with “Gudmoning.”

21-Good Morning in Bavarian / Austrian German

Bavarian is **an accent** of German. This language is spoken by people in north-eastern Italy, western Austria, and the German state of Bavaria. “Guadn moing” **is also used** as a morning greeting.

22- Good Morning in Belarusian

It **is a language of the East Slavic region**. It is also **the official language** of Belarus. This language is spoken by people in Poland, Ukraine, and Russia. When they greet people in the morning, they use “Dobray ranici.”

23- Good Morning in Burmese

Burmese is derived from the Sino-Tibetan language family. This language is spoken **by people in Bamar and Myanmar**. In the morning, they greet each other with “Mingalarba.”

24- Good Morning in Bulgarian

Bulgarian belongs to the South Slavic language family. This language is spoken by the people of Bulgaria. They greet each other with “Dobro utro.”

25- Good Morning in Breton

This language is part of the Celtic language family. This language is spoken by the people of Brittany, which is located in northwest France. They use the phrase “Demat” for good morning greetings.

26- Good Morning in Bosnian

Bosnian is the country of Bosnia's official language. It can be understood by both Serbian and Croatian speakers. Bosnian is a language of Indo-European origin. They greet each other with “Dobro jutro,” which means “good morning wishes.”

27- Good Morning in Brazilian Portuguese

People who live in Brazil speak a variety of Portuguese **accents**. This language is spoken by around 200 million people in Brazil. In the morning, they say "Bom dia."

28- Good Morning in Bodo

Bodo is a language spoken by people in Northeast India, Bengal, and Nepal. It belongs to the Sino-Tibetan language family. "Mwjang Fung" is the greeting word in the morning.

29- Good Morning in Chinese Mandarin

This language is spoken by people in China, Singapore, and Taiwan. These people greet each other in the Chinese language with phrases such as "Zochén ho," "Zoshàng ho," and "Zo'n, n zo."

30- Good Morning in Chinese Cantonese

Cantonese is a dialect of the Chinese language spoken in the city of Guangzhou. It is a descendant of a group of Sino-Tibetan families. The greeting in this language is "Jóusàhn," which means "Good morning."

31- Good Morning in Cornish

Cornish is a Celtic language. This language was endangered, but it was revived at the turn of the twentieth century. They say "Myttin da" in the morning.

32- Good Morning in Chichewa

Chichewa is also known as Nyanja. This language is spoken in Southeast, Southern, and East Africa. In these areas, people greet each other with "M'mawa wabwino" and "Mwauka bwanji."

33- Good Morning in Cebuano

Cebuano is also known as Bisaya or Binisaya. It belongs to the Austronesian language family. This language is spoken by people in the Southern Philippines region, including Central Visayas, Mindanao, and Western and Eastern Visayas. They greet each other with “Maayong adlaw” and “Maayong buntag.”

34- Good Morning in Catalan

Catalan is a Western Romance language. It is based on Vulgar Latin. It is Andorra's official language. This language is also spoken by residents of the Balearic Islands and Valencia. “Bon dia” is how people in these regions greet each other in the morning.

35- Good Morning in Cambodian Khmer

Cambodia's official language is Camodian Khmer. This language is spoken by approximately 16 million people. In the morning, they greet each other with “ârn su sdei.”

36- Good Morning in the Czech

The Czech language is spoken by approximately 10.5 million people in the Czech Republic. It is mutually understandable with Slovak. They say “Dobré ráno” and “Dobr den” in the morning greetings.

37- Good Morning in Croatian

This language is spoken by people in Croatia, Herzegovina, and Bosnia and Herzegovina. “Dobro jutro” is the phrase these people greet each other with.

38- Good Morning in Corsican

This language is spoken by the people of Corsica, a Mediterranean tropical island. They say “Bonghjornu” when they meet.

39- Good Morning in Dutch

Suriname, Northern Belgium, and the Netherlands are all home to people who speak Dutch. “Goedemorgen” is how they greet each other.

40- Good Morning in Dhivehi

The Maldives' islands are home to the Dhivehi language. Maldivians greet each other in the morning by saying “Ba'ajjaveri hedhuneh.”

41- Good Morning in Dzongkha

Bhutan's official language is Dzongkha. This language is spoken by approximately 500,000 people in Bhutan. They greet each other in the morning with “Dobro delek” or “Chubo dele.”

42- Good Morning in Danish

The Scandinavian language is Danish. Denmark's official language is Danish. People who speak Danish wish each other a good morning by saying “Godmorgen.”

43- Good Morning in Estonian

Estonian is the official language of the country of Estonia. In order to greet others, people say “Tere hommikust.”

44- Good Morning in Elfdalian

This language is also known as Övdalian. This language is spoken by 3000 people in the Alvdalen region. They greet each other in the morning by saying “Gumron.”

45- Good Morning in Faroese

This language is spoken by people in the Faroe Islands and in Denmark. “Góan morgun” is how people in this North Germanic language greet each other in the morning.

46- Good Morning in Persian

The Persian language is an Indo-European language. The majority of people speak it in Afghanistan, Tajikistan, and Iran. “Sob Bekhair” is how these people greet each other in the morning.

47- Good Morning in Finnish

Finland's official language is Finnish. This language is also spoken in Scandinavian countries. They greet each other by saying “Hyyaa huomenta” and “Huomenta.”

48- Good Morning in Flemish

The Flemish language is a Franconian dialect of Dutch. This language is spoken by approximately 6 million people worldwide, with various dialects. In the morning, they say “Goeije morn.”

49- Good Morning in Polish

The Polish language is spoken by approximately 45 million people worldwide. It is Poland's official language. People who speak Polish greet each other with “Dzie dobry.”

50- Good Morning in India

Hindi is a language of Indo-European origin. Nepal and India are among the countries that speak it. India has a very large population. In the morning, they greet each other with “Shubh prabhaat,” “Namaste,” and “Shub din.”

51- Good Morning in the Philippines

Tagalog is the primary language spoken in the Philippines. Filipino is the official language. **Aside from English, it is the national language** of the Philippines. They greet each other with “Magandang umaga po” and “Magandang umaga.”

52- Good Morning in the Friulian

Northern Italy's romance language is Friulian. This language is spoken by approximately 600,000 people worldwide. People who speak this language are also fluent in Italian. “Bundi” is how they greet each other in the morning.

53- Good Morning in the Galician

Galician is one of Spain's official languages. This language is spoken by 2.4 million people in Galicia's autonomous region. They use “Bos días” in greeting.

54- Good Morning in the Georgian

Georgian is the language of the South Caucasus. It is Georgia's official language. This is a widely-spoken language. This language is spoken by approximately 4.1 million people. Georgians greet each other in the morning with “Dila mushwidobisa.”

55- Good Morning in German

German is the main language of Austria, Switzerland, and Germany. This language is spoken by nearly 100 million people worldwide. Furthermore, it is a widely spoken language throughout the European Union. “Guten Morgen” is how German speakers greet “Good morning.”

56- Good Morning in Greenlandic

The Greenlandic language is part of the Inuit language family. This language is spoken by nearly 57,000 Greenlandic Inuit people in Greenland. These people say good morning with two phrases: “Terluarit” and “Kumoorn.”

57- Good Morning in Hebrew

The state of Israel's official language is Hebrew. It is the world's oldest language. This language is spoken by over nine million people worldwide. These people say "Boker" when they greet each other in the morning.

58- Good Morning in Greek

Greek is an Indo-European language that belongs to the Hellenic branch. This language has a 3000-year documented written history. This language is spoken by nearly 13.1 million people worldwide. They greet each other in the morning with three phrases: “Kaliméra,” “Kaliméra sas,” and “Kaliméra su.”

59- Good Morning in Hungarian

Hungarian is a Uralic language. This language is spoken by people in Hungary and neighboring countries. It is the official language of Hungary and one of the official languages of the European Union. This language is spoken by nearly 13 million people worldwide. By saying “Jó reggelt,” they wish you a “Good morning.”

60- Good Morning in Indonesian Bahasa

Indonesia has a large population. As a result, Indonesian Bahasa is one of the world's most widely-spoken languages. Malay is the standardized dialect. This language is spoken by approximately 230 million people worldwide. “Selamat pagi” and “Selamat siang” are the greetings used by these people, in Indonesian Bahasa.

61- Good Morning in Inuktitut

North America's native language is Inuktitut. This language is widely spoken in Canadian territories and North America. Around the world, there are nearly 39,770 Inuktitut speakers. These people greet each other in the morning by saying “Ublaahatkut” or “Ullaasakkut.”

62- Good Morning in Irish

Gaelic and Erse are other names for the Irish language. It belongs to the Goidelic language family. This language is spoken by an estimated 1.2 million people worldwide. These people greet each other by saying: “Maidin mhaith,” “Dia dhuit ar maidin,” and “Dia dhaoibh ar maidin.”

63- Good Morning in Italian

Italian is classified as a Romance language. It is the official language of Italy, the Vatican City State, and the Republic of San Marino. This language is spoken by approximately 85 million people worldwide. “Buongiorno” is the Italian greeting for “Good morning.”

64- Good Morning in Japanese

Japan's national language is Japanese. It is a language spoken in East Asia. Japanese is spoken by nearly 128 million people worldwide. They greet each other in the morning by saying “Ohay gozaimasu.”

65- Good Morning in Javanese

Malayo-Polynesian languages include Javanese. This language is spoken by people on the Indonesian island of Java. Javanese is spoken by more than 80 million people worldwide. “Sugeng énjing” is a Javanese greeting for “Good morning.”

66- Good Morning in Jamaican Patois

Jamaican Creole is another name for Jamaican Patois. It is a creole language based on English. This language is spoken by nearly 3 million people in Jamaica. “Gud mawnin” is a greeting used by Jamaican Patois speakers to greet one another.

67- Good Morning in Kannada

Kannada is a Dravidian language. It is the official language of Karnataka, a state in southern India. Furthermore, people in the states of Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, and Telangana speak this language. They say “Shubhodaya” to say “Good morning.”

68- Good Morning in Karelian

The Karelian language is related to the Finno-Ugric branch of the Uralic language family. This language is spoken by people in Northwestern Russia and Finnish emigrants. These speakers greet one another with “Hyviä huondestu.”

69- Good Morning in Kashubian

Kashubian belongs to the West Slavic group of Slavic languages. Kashubian is spoken by approximately 200,000 people in Poland. Furthermore, this language is spoken by 53,000 people daily. “Dzen dobri” is the phrase that people use to greet each other in the morning.

70- Good Morning in Korean

South and North Korea both have the official language of Korean. Korean is spoken by roughly 75 million people worldwide. South Koreans account for 48 million of the total, while North Koreans account for 24 million. The Korean greeting for good morning is “Annyeong hashimnikka.”

71- Good Morning in Kazakh

Kazakh is a branch of the Turkic family of languages, which is part of the Altaic language group. It is also a part of the Kipchak tribe. Kazakhstan's official language is Kazakh. Kazakh is spoken by about 8 million people in Central Asia. These people greet each other with “Qayrl ta.”

72- Good Morning in Kurdish

Kurdish is a part of the Iranian language family. After Pashto and Persian, it is the third most-widely spoken language. This language is spoken by nearly 30 million people in Western Asia. These people greet each other in the morning with “Beyanî baş” and “Spéde bi xer” (sg).

73- Good Morning in Kyrgyz

Kyrgyz is a Turkic language of the Kipchak family. It is Kyrgyzstan's official language. Kyrgyz is spoken by approximately 4 million people in Kyrgyzstan, Afghanistan, Tajikistan, Turkey, and China. “Kutmanduu tanyngyz menen” is the phrase these speakers greet each other with in the morning.

74- Good Morning in Latin

Latin is a world language that dates back to antiquity. It is of Indo-European origin. This language is spoken by residents of Rome. According to rough estimates, just 200 people speak this language, but it is becoming more popular. In the morning, Latin speakers greet each other with “Bonum mane” and “Quid agis mane.”

75- Good Morning in Lithuanian

Lithuanian is one of the languages of the Eastern Baltic region. It is an official language in the European Union, as well as Lithuania's official language. It is the mother tongue of roughly 2.8 million people. “Labas rytas” is how Lithuanians greet each other in the morning.

76- Good Morning in Luganda

This language is spoken by people living in Africa's Great Lakes region. **Luganda's official language is Luganda's national language.** This language is spoken by over 10 million people worldwide, most of whom live in Kampala. “Wasuze otya nno” is the greeting used by Luganda speakers to say “Good morning.”

77- Good Morning in Malay

Malay belongs to the Austronesian language family. It is Indonesia's, Brunei's, and Singapore's official language. Malay is also spoken by people in East Timor and parts of Thailand. This language is spoken by around 3 million people worldwide. “Selamat Pagi” is a greeting used by Malay speakers to say “Good morning.”

78- Good Morning in Maltese

People on the island of Malta use the Maltese language. The Arabic language gave birth to this language. This language is widely spoken by roughly 420,000 people on the Mediterranean islands. Maltese people say “Bongu,” “Bonornu,” and “L-godwa t-tajba” to say “Good morning.”

79- Good Morning in Mongolian

Mongolian is also referred to as the Mongol language. It is derived from the Altaic language. Mongolian is the country's official language. This language is spoken by around 5 million people in China, Afghanistan, Russia, and Mongolia. Mongolian speakers say good morning with the phrase “Glouny mend.”

80- Good Morning in Nepali

Nepali is a Devanagari-based Indo-Aryan language. Nepalese is the country's official language. There is also a Nepali community in India's North East. As a result, it is also one of India's officially recognized languages. “Subha prabhat” is the Nepalese greeting for “Good morning.”

81- Good Morning in Norwegian

Norwegian is a Germanic language. It is mutually understandable with Danish and Swedish. Norwegian is spoken in Scandinavian countries such as Sweden, Denmark, and Norway. This language is spoken by approximately 5 million people worldwide. By “God morgen,” these people greet one another in the morning.

82- Good Morning in Punjabi

Punjabi is an Indo-Aryan language. It is Pakistan's and India's partial language. Punjabi speakers can be found all over the world, and it is the world's tenth most-spoken language. The number of Punjabi native speakers is 130 million. “Sat Shri Akal” is a greeting used by Punjabi speakers to say “Good morning.”

83- Good Morning in Romanian

Romanian is a Romance language of the Balkans. Romania and Moldova both have it as an official language. Vulgar Latin gave rise to Romanian. It is a 1700-year-old language with 26 million native speakers. “Bună dimineața” is the Romanian greeting for “Good morning.”

84- Good Morning in Russian

Russian is the Russian Federation's official language. It is a language of the East Slavic **region**. Russian is spoken by almost 300 million people worldwide. People in Belarus, Kazakhstan, and Kyrgyzstan are also fluent in Russian. “Dobroye utro” is how Russians greet each other in the morning.

85- Good Morning in Sanskrit

Sanskrit is a classical language that dates back thousands of years. It belongs to the Indo-Aryan subsidiary of Indo-European languages. Because many Indian languages are based on Sanskrit, it is referred to as the "mother of all languages." There are fewer than 15,000 native speakers in the country. “Suprabhatam” is how these people say “Good morning.”

86- Good Morning in Serbian

Serbian is an Indo-European language that is abstracted from South Slavic languages. It is Montenegro's and Serbia's official language. This language is spoken by around 9 million people. “Dobro utro” is how these people greet each other in the morning.

The Somali language is a part of the Cushitic group of Afro-Asian languages. It is Somalia's official language. This language is spoken by approximately 21.8 million Somalis. Furthermore, it is Ethiopia's working language and Djibouti's national language. “Subax wanaagsan” is the Somali greeting for “Good morning.”

88- Good Morning in Spanish

Spanish is a Romance language of the Iberian Peninsula. It is now a global language, with 500 million native speakers. Furthermore, the largest Spanish-speaking community, known as the Hispanic community, resides in the United States. Furthermore, Spanish is the official language of 21 countries around the world. “Buenos **das**” is how Spanish speakers greet one another in the morning.

89- Good Morning in Swedish

Swedish is a North Germanic language. It is one of the European Union's official languages as well as Sweden's national language. As a result, this language is spoken by 10 million people in Sweden. Thai is a part of the Kra-Dai language family. Thai is Thailand's official language. This language is spoken by nearly 50 million people in Thailand. Furthermore, most of the Chinese people in Thailand speak this language. It is important to note that male and female Thai people greet each other differently in the morning. 92- Good Morning in Tibetan

Tibetan belongs to the Tibeto-Burman language family. It is one of the traditional languages of Buddhist literature. This language is spoken by people in old Tibet and Eastern Central Asia, including the Tibetan Plateau and the Himalayas. Six million people speak Tibetan. The Bantu language is Tswana. This language is spoken by 8.2 million people in Southern Africa. In South Africa, it is an officially recognized language. Furthermore, people in Botswana, Zimbabwe, and Namibia speak this language. Tswana and Northern and Southern Sotho languages **are bilingual**. Tswana speakers greet each other with “Dumêla rra” and “Dumêla mma.”

94- Good Morning in Turkish

Turkey's official language is Turkish. It belongs to the Altaic language family. This language is spoken by roughly 70 to 80 million people worldwide. Small Turkish communities can also be found in Germany, Syria, Iraq, Austria, Greece, and other parts of Central Asia and Europe. Turkish people greet one another with “Günaydn.”

95- Good Morning in Ukrainian

Ukrainian is a Slavic language of the East. It is Ukraine's official language. Ukraine has a population of 51 million people who speak Ukrainian. Ukrainian, Russian, and Belarusian are all mutually intelligible languages. “Dobre rano” and “Dobroho ranku” are greetings used by Ukrainian speakers to say “Good morning.”

96- Good Morning in Urdu

Urdu belongs to the Indo-Aryan language family, which is related to the Indo-European language family. It is Pakistan's official language. Urdu is spoken by approximately 66 million people worldwide. It is the 20th most-spoken language in the world. Urdu and Hindi are mutually intelligible languages. “Subah Bakhair” is a greeting used by Urdu speakers to say “Good morning.”

97- Good Morning in Uzbek

Uzbek is a Turkic language. It is Uzbekistan's official language. This language is spoken by approximately 34 million people in Uzbekistan, 4 million people in Afghanistan, and 5 million people in Central Asia. Uzbek is the second official language in Turkey. Uzbek speakers say good morning with “Xayrli tong.”

98- Good Morning in Vietnamese

Vietnamese is an Austroasian language. It originated in the same region, Vietnam, and is the country's official language. This language is spoken by approximately 82 million people worldwide. Vietnamese people speak it as their first language, while other ethnicities speak it as their second. The Vietnamese greeting for good morning is “Chào buổi sáng.”

99- Good Morning in Yoruba

Yoruba is a tone color and pluri-centric language. This language is spoken by people in West Africa, particularly in Southwestern Nigeria. This is spoken as a first language by nearly 50 million people and as a second language by nearly 2 million people. “E kaaro” is a Yoruba greeting that means “Good morning.”

100- Good Morning in Zulu

Zulu belongs to the Bantu/Nguni language family. It is South Africa's official language. This language is spoken by 95 percent of South Africa's 10 million people. Zulu is also spoken in Lesotho, Botswana, Mozambique, Malawi, and Eswatini. The Zulus greet each other in the morning by saying “Sawubona” and “Sanibonani.”
