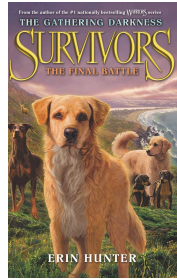

Survivors: The Final Battle by Erin Hunter.

In the US alone there are 4.5 million dog bites per year reported per year, this is only bites on people. What about other dogs? Storm, a fierce dog exiled from her pack, wants to lead a new life with her new pack. But when she discovers the bad dog's identity in her former pack she turns back to help. So when Storm returns she is accused of the murders and imprisoned. Then when pups are stolen from the pack she helps to hunt down the killer and save the pups. **Survivors: The Final Battle** by Erin Hunter highlights, making assumptions can lead to unwanted outcomes.

When Storm returns to the Wild Pack to warn them of Breeze, it shows how biased the pack is and how they make big assumptions. shows how Breeze is still free and among the pack. But Storm can easily see how the Wild Pack immediately assumes her to be the bad dog and takes no chances punishing her. "They had once been Storm's friendly pack mates and now they refused to talk to her'...The Wild Pack was not taking any chances when they were sure she was the bad dog'...She had no choice but to return, to warn them the killer was Breeze". Storm is accused immediately while just trying to protect the others while the Breeze stays unaccused and victimized.

When Storm stands accused of being a killer, Breeze watches the pups as they have already assumed the killer's identity, Storm Storm sees Breeze minding the pups though she is still suspect of the same thing Storm is. Mickey, a dog who helped raise her when she was young, threatens Storm. "The whole pack is here, and we're more than a match for one Fierce Dog'... Enough of the pack still trusted the dog who so eagerly accepted pup-minding duties".

Breeze takes pups from the camp and runs off with them making Storm innocent but as they work to find the pups, the dogs still blame Storm. Though proven innocent, she is still assumed to be the Bad dog, even though Breeze has stolen pups from the camp and left with them, putting them in grave danger. **Fury**

and fear are running through every dog! if they turn on me now, two packs at once, I don't have a chance. I'll be dead!...' We're wasting time, Breeze might be slow because she has four pups, but she is still getting further and farther from camp."

Breeze escaped with the pack's pups and has taken them somewhere. As the pack tries to organize search parties still turn on Storm though her innocence has been confirmed. I rate this book 7 ½ out of ten. It was a good finish to the series and I had a good twist at the end. I felt somewhat sad when something happened to a character but it could be a little better.
