ABCMouse	ABCMouse is an online curriculum for students ages 2- 8. ABCMouse’s parent company, Age of Learning , is offering free access to ABCMouse to schools closed due to COVID-19. Complete this form to request access.
Adventure Academy	Adventure Academy is a multiplayer educational game for students in elementary and middle school. Adventure Academy’s parent company, Age of Learning , is offering free access to ABCMouse to schools closed due to COVID-19. Complete this form to request access.
ALEKS	<i>ALEKS</i> is an adaptive, online math program for grades 3–12 that identifies what each child knows and doesn't know and delivers a personalized learning path.
AWW	AWW is an “always free” online whiteboard.
Big Universe	Big Universe is a digital reading platform for students in grades K–12 that takes reading to new heights. Students can access more than 17,000 leveled eBooks from more than 40 publishers covering a wide variety of topics from science and math to social studies, language arts, and more.

<u>Breakout EDU</u>	Breakout EDU is an “immersive learning games platform that brings the challenges of an escape room to the classroom”. The free version offers over 350 free games. To register, complete the <u>registration form</u> .
<u>Chrome Music Lab</u>	This is an “always free” website which allows students to make music.
<u>Didax Math Manipulatives</u>	This is an “always free” website which allows students to use virtual math manipulatives such as unifix cubes, number boards, pattern blocks, etc.
<u>Epic!</u>	An “always free” website for elementary teachers and librarians. Once you sign up, you get access to 35,000 ebooks, videos, etc.
<u>eSpark</u>	A K-5 math and reading online differentiation platform for students.” eSpark is offering free teacher accounts that can be used from now through the end of the school year! Sign up for free at <u>http://esparklearning.com</u> to start differentiating reading and math with activities kids love.”
<u>5 Steps to a 5</u>	This is free AP prep courses across multiple AP subjects. The platform includes fully customizable courses with interactive practice tests, powerful analytics, customized study plans, flashcards, games, and more.
<u>FlipGrid</u>	FlipGrid is an “always free” website that allows for interactive student discussion.
<u>Google Hangouts Meet Premium</u>	Google Hangouts is offering their premium features (larger meeting size, live streaming and record meeting capabilities) for G Suite customers until July 1, 2020. <i>Your school's G Suite Administrator will need to <u>enable access</u>.</i>
<u>Kahoot! Premium</u>	Kahoot is a formative assessment tool. Kahoot is

	offering free premium access for schools affected by COVID-19. Once you click their access link , your account will have the Kahoot! Premium features.
Lailo	Lailo is an “always free” phonics and comprehension app for students in grades K-2. Teachers can sign up for free here .
Loom	Loom recently made their Loom Pro free for all for teachers and students at K-12 schools, universities, or educational institutions forever.
Mangahigh	Mangahigh is a math and coding site that has quizzes and games for students. Complete this form to get full access.
Minecraft Education Edition	“Minecraft: Education Edition is now available through June 2020 for all educators and learners who have a valid Office 365 Education account”. If you would like access, complete this form to verify your account.
Mystery Science	Mystery Science (grades K-5) is offering their most popular science lesson for anyone to use for free. There is no account or login is needed.
New York Times Learning Network	The New York Times Learning Network offers free lessons and resources for middle and high school students using New York Times content including discussion questions, writing and picture prompts, quizzes, and videos to watch and discuss.
New York Times - Free School Year Curriculum	The New York Times created a free middle and high school age writing curriculum. This version can be used in remote and in-person teaching. The New York Times also updated this entire curriculum for remote learning .
Newsela	Newsela is offering instant free access to all of their content to teachers for the rest of the school year by completing this form . District administrators can also submit a form to get access for the entire district.

<u>Online Physical Education Network</u>	An “always free” site that provides physical education activities for students to do at home. These activities would also be good for “brain breaks” for students.
<u>Parlay</u>	Parlay is an online discussion platform. Teachers can choose a topic, students engage in an online discussion while the teacher can track engagement data. Parlay is free to everyone until April 20, 2020. Sign up or use the <i>Bye-Corona</i> code for existing accounts to get free access.
<u>Quizalize</u>	Quizalize is offering its premium version for schools closed due to COVID-19. Quizalize allows you to send out quizzes and create differentiated follow up activities for students to complete. It will also track student responses and if they completed the follow up activities.
<u>Reading IQ</u>	Reading IQ is a digital library and reading platform for students under the age of 12. Reading IQ’s parent company, <u>Age of Learning</u> , is offering free access to ABCMouse to schools closed due to COVID-19. Complete this <u>form</u> to request access.
<u>Screencastify</u>	Screencastify is allowing teachers affected by COVID-19 free access to their Education Unlimited plan with the coupon code CAST_COVID.
<u>Seesaw</u>	Seesaw is a Learning Management System for students in grades K-12 where students use the built in annotation tools to show learning. Students don’t need an email to access Seesaw. Seesaw allows users to have up to 3 classes for free.
<u>Storyline Online</u>	An “always free” website where students can watch actors read children’s books.
<u>Teaching Matters</u>	Teaching Matters has made K-8 weekly student facing lesson packs that they are updating weekly.

Zoom	Zoom is a video conferencing platform that is “temporarily lifting the 40-minute time limit on free Basic accounts for schools affected by the Coronavirus”.
