1st Quarter

- EL #1 Reading: Cite Textual Evidence
 - I can cite textual evidence that most strongly supports an analysis of what a text states explicitly as well as inferences.
- EL #2 Reading: Theme
 - I can analyze the development of two or more themes within a text and use appropriate evidence to support that claim.
- EL #3 Reading: Figurative and Connotative Meaning
 - I can analyze the meaning of words and phrases as they are used in a text, including figurative and connotative meanings, to identify and analyze the meaning and tone.
- EL #4 Argumentative Writing
 - I can create a claim and support it through evidence, while creating, acknowledging, and considering the counterclaim to my argument.
- EL #6 Narrative Writing
 - I can conduct short and sustained narrative assignments where I understand and utilize the elements of a narrative while conveying an experience or series of events.
- EL #9 Semicolons
 - I can use a semicolon to separate two independent clauses, to separate items in a series that contain commas, and to link two or more independent clauses with a conjunctive adverb.

2nd Quarter
