(Title in Indonesian or English. Concise, straightforward title that describes the content of the article. Typed in "Capitalize Each Word" format, maximum 14 words and without subtitles. Written in single spacing)

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Abstract:

The first abstract is written in English. Abstract length maximum 150 words with Bookman Old Style letters, 10pt, 1 space. The abstract is presented in both Bahasa Indonesia and English. If the article is in English, the abstract must be written in English only.

Abstract:

The second abstract is written in Indonesian. The abstract is a maximum of 150 words in Bookman Old Style, 10pt, single-spaced. The abstract is presented in both Indonesian and English. If the article is in English, then the abstract must be written in English only.

Introduction

The introduction covers the background of the problem, the significance of the topic, a literature review, a summary of the problem, and the purpose of the writing. The background of the problem is the basis for the emergence of the research idea. The significance of the topic refers to aspects that demonstrate the importance of researching the idea, supported by a reliable literature review of primary sources and scientific articles published within the last 10 years. Source articles must be from scientific journals.

The minimum number of words is 5000 words and does not exceed 7000 words, including images, graphs/tables (if any) and references. The introduction to the references section is written in Bookman Old Style font, 11 pt, 1 line spacing, justified/left-right alignment. Subsection titles are separated from the previous paragraph using *spacing after*. The first paragraph after heading 1 is typed flush with the title, while the second and subsequent paragraphs are typed with a tab spacing of 1.27 cm. All sections must be written according to these requirements.

The procedure for writing tables can be seen in Table 1. The table number is written in bold, *right alignment* at the top of the table, accompanied by the table name in non-bold format and without a period at the end of the table title. The table source must be included at the bottom of the table in italics and *right-aligned*. If the table is taken from a book, scientific article, proceedings, or database, write the author's name or institution name along with the year of publication and page number. If the table is taken from a website, include only the main address. For example, if the image is taken from a website, simply include the main address. The table format follows *the autofit window*.

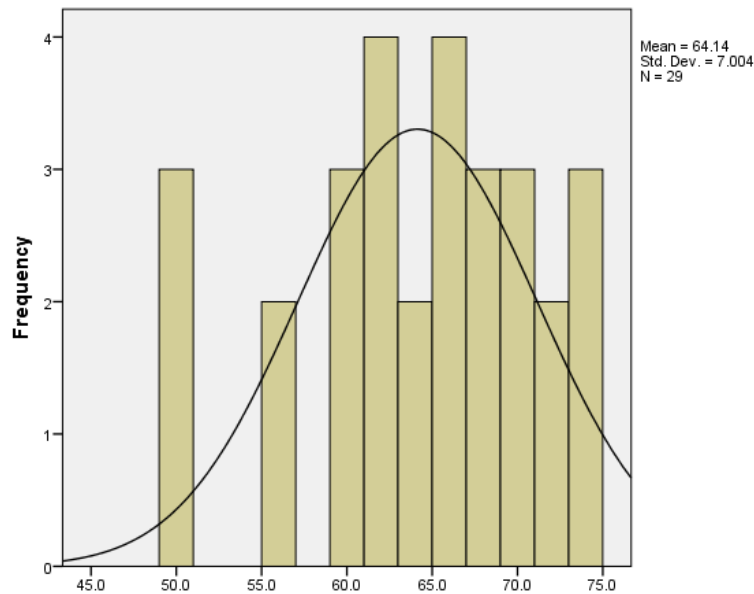

The procedure for writing images can be seen in Figure 1. Use *in line with text, center alignment* with the image width following the width of the text area. If the image is taken from a book, scientific article, proceedings or data bank, write the author's name or institution name along with the year of publication and page number. If the image is taken from a website, include only the main website address. The image source is written directly below in italics and *right-aligned*. Then, directly below the source, write the image number in bold, *centered*, followed by the table name in regular font and without a period at the end, as shown in the example.

Citation guidelines follow the APA7th model. The use of reference managers such as **Mendeley** (<https://www.mendeley.com/download-desktop/>) or **Zotero** (<https://www.zotero.org/download/>) is recommended.

Method

Describe the methods used, data sources and validity, data analysis process analysis, and data presentation. Write descriptively and in detail, describing the entire flow and stages of the research.

Results and Discussion

Results and Discussion contain the findings of the research and their discussion. Write down the findings obtained from the research results that have been carried out and must be supported by adequate data. The research results and findings must be able to answer the questions or research hypotheses in the introduction.

Also, discuss or analyze the findings by comparing existing opinions, views, or research findings, whether contradictory or consistent with the results of the research conducted. If the discussion and results sections require sub-sections, the subheadings must be written in capital letters at the beginning of each word, except for conjunctions.

Subheadings

The author must discuss the results and how they can be interpreted from the perspective of previous research and working hypotheses. The findings and their implications must be discussed in as broad a context as possible. The direction of future research can also be highlighted.

The following components must be included in the discussion: How do your

results relate to the initial questions or objectives outlined in the Introduction (what/how)? Do you provide a scientific interpretation for each result or finding presented (why)? Are your results consistent with what has been reported by other sympathizers (what else)? Or are there differences?

Conclusion

The conclusion describes the answers to the hypotheses and/or research objectives or findings obtained. The conclusion does not contain a repetition of the results and discussion, but rather a summary of the findings as expected in the objectives or hypotheses.

Present recommendations for further research in the final paragraph of the conclusion.

References

All references cited in the text of the article must be listed in the references and come from primary sources (60% from scientific journals) published in the last 10 (ten) years. References are arranged in alphabetical order. They are not separated based on the source of the citation. Single-spaced. For further guidance, refer to ***the Taylor & Francis Journals Standard Reference Style Guide: American Psychological Association, Seventh Edition (APA-7)*** (See: https://bit.ly/_APA7).
