1. Hello, my name is _____, and I'm calling on behalf of the water protectors at Standing Rock Reservation. I'd like to ask you to fight against Trump's recent easement of the Dakota Access Pipeline. I'd like to remind you that the federally mandated Tribal Consultation Process is broken when Tribal Nations are merely informed that projects

are already in process on our doorsteps, but have not been given the opportunity to propose alternatives. Free, Prior and Informed Consent was not conducted, and this is a violation of the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples. The history of the companies building these pipelines have show that there is a certainty of oil spill down the line which will contaminate water for generations. I'd also like to remind you that the Army Corp itself has been responsible for taking hundreds of thousands of acres of land from Native Americans when they built the Oahe Dam in the 1940's. In light of the numerous past land dispossessions of Native Americans, including the Standing Rock Sioux, it seems the only ethical path is to not permit the Dakota Access Pipeline to be completed across Lake Oahe, in the Missouri River. Can I count on you to stand up for the peaceful North Dakotan citizens protecting their water and sacred land?

Specific talking points: The DAPL was originally re-routed to avoid Bismark, ND, because it's citizens were afraid it would contaminate their drinking water.

Hello, my name is _____, and I'm calling on behalf of the water protectors at Standing Rock Reservation. In it's September 9 statement, you, the United States Department of Justice, said: "The Departments of Justice and the Interior will continue to deploy resources to North Dakota to help state, local, and tribal authorities, and the communities they serve, better communicate, defuse tensions, support peaceful protest, and maintain public safety." I'd like to ask you to take immediate action to protect the peaceful demonstrators at Standing Rock and their First Amendment rights. I urge the Department of Justice to investigate allegations of human rights abuses against people opposed to the Dakota Access Pipeline by the Morton County Sheriff's department and other law enforcement. Should your investigators uncover any civil rights violations by law enforcement, individual officers should be charged and prosecuted as warranted.

Additional Talking Points

General Script:

Hello, my name is _____, and I'm calling about the hundreds of water protectors injured by law enforcement at standing rock this past week. Attacking water protectors with hoses in sub-freezing temperatures, using rubber bullets, mace, tear gas and concussion grenades unprovoked is inhumane, cruel and unacceptable. I want (Official's Name) to (Choose all that apply):

- Allow water protectors to exercise their right to peaceful assembly and protest.
- Immediately stop attacking water protectors with violent means.
- Refrain from arresting and interfering with peaceful demonstrators.

Facts about #NoDAPL from nodaplsolidarity.org:

- The "Dakota Access" Pipeline (DAPL) is a \$3.8B, 1,100 mile fracked-oil pipeline currently under construction from the Bakken shale fields of North Dakota to Peoria, Illinois. DAPL is slated to cross Lakota Treaty Territory at the Standing Rock Sioux Reservation where it would be laid underneath the Missouri River, the longest river on the continent.
- Construction of the DAPL would engender a renewed fracking-frenzy in the Bakken shale region, as well as endanger a source of fresh water for the Standing Rock Sioux and 8 million people living downstream. DAPL would also impact many sites that are sacred to the Standing Rock Sioux and other indigenous nations.

General Talking Points:

- Federal Government needs to realize that consultation involves more than informing people of what they plan to do—it involves early conversations on potential issues and alternatives. At this point, they need to correct the mistake the Army Corps made through inadequate consultation.
- Tribal Groups decide what is a sacred site, not the government, industry, SHPO, or archaeologists.
- Water can be a cultural as well as natural resource. To infringe on the Standing Rock Sioux's religious freedoms goes against the first act of the American Indian Religious Freedom Act of 1978.
- Freedom of press has been infringed upon through arrests, prosecution, cellphone blocking and targeting of press by law enforcement personnel.

- Comparison of the treatment of the (Euro-american) occupiers of the Malheur National Wildlife refuge and native protestors at Standing Rock reveals a stark, racialized contrast in the treatment of indigenous peoples by law enforcement.
- I have watched footage from the frontlines of standing rock camp where Hundreds of water protectors are being injured. This past sunday, law enforcement blasted them with water cannons in freezing temperatures. The attacks came as water protectors used a semi-truck to remove burnt military vehicles that police had chained to concrete barriers weeks ago, blocking traffic on Highway 1806. Water protectors' efforts to clear the road and improve access to the camp for emergency services were met with tear gas, an LRAD (Long Range Acoustic Device), stinger grenades, rubber bullets, and indiscriminate use of a water cannon with an air temperature of 26 degrees Fahrenheit. Some flares shot by law enforcement started grass fires which were ignored by the water cannons and had to be extinguished by water protectors. Law enforcement also shot down three media drones and targeted journalists with less lethal rounds. Hundreds are receiving treatment for contamination by CS gas, hypothermia, and blunt traumas as a result of rubber bullets and other less lethal ammunition.

Calling to defend the Affordable Care Act:

4. Wait for an acknowledgement message, and then **hang up** or stay on the line to leave a voice mail message (which you may not be able to do if the inbox is full).
