- **II.** Entrepreneurship Course Description: Expect rigor and be ready to try your very best everyday, expect to be pushed and challenged; you will learn and hopefully have fun in the process! Entrepreneurship is an in-depth and detailed study focusing on business ownership and management with specific emphasis on small business ownership. This course builds on the theories learned in Marketing Principles by providing practical application scenarios which test these theories. I will encourage students to be creative thinkers and risk takers. You will focus on recognizing a business opportunity, starting a business based on the recognized opportunity, and operating and maintaining that business. - **IV.** <u>Materials Needed</u>: Students will use technology in the classroom as well as outside of class. Students also need paper, notebook, and a pen or pencil for use in class.

V. Communication:

Students must join the **Google Classroom** class that corresponds to their class period. I will notify students of the code in class and it will be posted on my website by the first day of class.

Students will find assignments and resources posted in Google Classroom that we use for in-class assignments, projects and in preparation for some assessments. Students are responsible for missed assignments due to absences and all information will be available to them in Google Classroom.

VI. Cell Phone / Electronic Device Usage Policy in Class

<u>NO</u> personal cell phone or electronic devices should be OUT, ON, or IN USE during class. This includes earbuds and listening to music in class. Additionally, students may **not** take an electronic device with them to the restroom during class. Electronic devices may still be used during class change and during lunch. We have computers in class that students will use for our assignments.

If we must use personal electronic devices for academic purposes such as creating a promotional video or utilizing a digital resource that is not readily available on our computers, I will make the use very well defined in class. Note: This is not just my rule, this is a district wide rule. Discipline: detention and/or Saturday School, and possible recommendation for long-term suspension.

VII. Grading Criteria:

Formatives (classwork, homework, mini-projects, quizzes and employability skills) - 40% Summatives (major projects, presentations, tests and other major assessment) - 60% *Late work may not receive full credit. Students are encouraged to communicate regularly with Mr. Foust.
