Husky Families:

We are off to a great start of the school year, and with Homecoming and Husky Fest this Friday, we'd like to share reminders of the expectations for all students as they join the festivities. While we encourage as many fans as possible to come out and support our Husky athletes, there have been some situations where negative altercations and actions have occurred with our 5th and 6th-grade students. [Linked here](#) is a full communication from our district regarding sporting events. To ensure a safe and positive experience, we want to remind our community of the expectations for fan behavior at Husky contests:

- **Jr.K.-6th-grade students must be accompanied by an adult at all times to gain entrance, and the adult must remain at the sporting event—the school cannot supervise unaccompanied elementary students. “The school will not be able to supervise unaccompanied students, nor will it be responsible for students who arrive without an adult chaperone.”** This is outlined in our FHPS elementary [handbooks](#) under “Student Attendance at School Events.”
- Students may not enter the gated grass field, North football field (Track field event area)

Prohibited Behaviors:

- Throwing any objects, including bottles, food items, or debris
- Engaging in horseplay, rough play, or disruptive behavior
- Verbal harassment of players, officials, coaches, or other spectators

Prohibited Items:

For the safety and enjoyment of all attendees, the following items are not permitted:

- Outside food or beverages
- Backpacks, bags, or large personal items
- Athletic equipment (footballs, basketballs, soccer balls, lacrosse sticks, etc.)
- Any items that could be thrown or cause disruption

Students who do not abide by these expectations will be asked to leave and escorted from the stadium. Let's all work together as Huskies to provide a safe environment for all Huskies and cheer our Husky teams on to victory.
