 - Birth/Death information
 - Major Accomplishments
 - Pictures
 - *May also include: fun facts, education, family*

- Dress up like your chosen person:
 - Small props (ex: tennis racket for tennis player, gavel for a judge, pen/clip board for scientists, etc.). Please be mindful to choose props that are school appropriate (ex: bring a baseball glove for a baseball player versus a baseball bat).
 - Costume if applicable; In most cases dressing “formal” and wearing a nametag will make this clear! Please do not spend money on a costume.

- There will be TWO OPPORTUNITIES for students to share their presentations:
 - **February 13th: 8:00-10:00 AM Cafeteria**
 - Every student will participate in the Living History Museum in the cafeteria while the rest of the school visits the museum. Students are welcome to bring a change of clothes if they do not want to wear costumes all day.

 - **February 13th: 6:00-7:00 PM Cafeteria PTO Meeting and Living History Museum**
 - Students who can make it will come in costume with any props they want to bring and share speeches with families. They will share their short speech as visitors walk around the museum. Attendance at this night time event is, of course, optional but encouraged! If you can make it, please try to arrive at 5:50 so students have time to get in place before the museum opens.
