

Rights of the Hive

- Citizens under the hive have the right to free speech. They may talk freely and share their opinions without government intervention.
- People of the hive will have the right to press. Neither creative arts nor published writings are judged legally by the government.
This does not include builds or physical structures
- Citizens have the right to grow, in any land they own they may plant and grow whatever seed they would like.
- Hivelings will have the right to tolerance and difference. Every citizen under the hive will not be allowed to be discriminated against for any minor difference.
- Citizens have the right to bear combative equipment, any weapons or armor will be allowed on your person in public at any given time.

The Monarch

- The monarch is the sole ruler and representative of the nation. This gives them full authority on building, Hosting votes and events, and taking judicial actions.
- What that monarch CANNOT do is infringe the rights of the hive. If there is such a recorded instance the council will hold a vote on whether or not it's a strike.
- The monarch will choose a successor in the case of disappearance or death. Only this successor may hail to the throne and no one else.

An overthrowing will overrule this

The royal advisor

- This is the second highest role and is a part of the council. They take part in everything the queen does, in every decision they will know. They're job is to provide a second opinion on the queen's actions and call the queen out if they infringe on rights.

The council

- The council is a group of hivelings that hold power beside the monarch, this group includes the royal advisor and any other minister the monarch selects. This group is made of ministers.
- Ministers take charge of a specific field of work, ex; building, internal affairs. They will also group together with the advisor and queen for meetings. These meetings usually involve big decisions with land or national changes.

Elections

- Elections are events where every citizen will vote for a new monarch, this can only happen if the current monarch is overthrown, not even death causes this as the monarch's successor will simply take control.
- As referred to before, the council can vote a strike on the monarch. Strikes are also in place as warnings for the monarch to do better. The monarch can have up to three strikes. After that they are overthrown and an election will be held with the temp monarch role to the royal advisor.

Building

- The monarch and the minister of building can assign building permits to people.
- Any buildings made by unauthorized builders have the right to be destroyed.
- Only citizens with the building permit can build structures on Haibu land.

War and Emergency State

- A state of emergency can either be started by war or declared from a vote of the council.
- The nation will become closed to any visitors and also closed from any trading.
This does not apply to allied nations
- All citizens are required to either fight in the war or help supply war supplies.
Including the council
- Autonomous territories will fall into a direct mandate under the council.
- Any active election/constitution process will be halted and/or postponed until the emergency subsides.
- A state of emergency may only be terminated only by a council vote.
